# COP 10



■ **Period: October 11 (Monday) to October 29 (Friday), 2010**

- Fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (MOP 5), October 11 to 15
- Tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (COP 10), October 18 to 29
- High-level Ministerial Segment, October 27 to 29

■ **Participation: 180 countries and regions, international organizations, NGOs, observers, etc.**

- Number of participants: Over 13,000 people (including the parties to the convention, the press, and management staff)
- Number of official side events: About 350

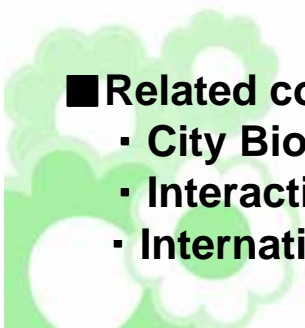

## ■ Contents and achievements

- Adoption of the Aichi/Nagoya Declaration on Local Authorities and Biodiversity (Aichi/Nagoya Declaration)
- At the High-level Ministerial Segment on October 28, the governor of Aichi Prefecture and the mayor of Nagoya made an appeal, as local government representatives, for the Aichi/Nagoya Declaration

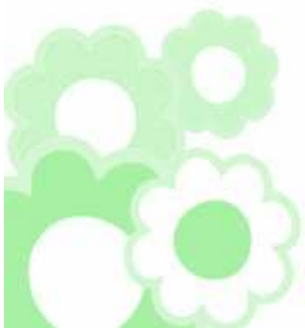


# URBIO 2010 (May 18 to 22, 2010)

- URBIO is an international network of scientists and other people related to urban biodiversity.
- The first conference took place in Erfurt, Germany, parallel to COP9 in May 2008 (URBIO 2008).
- As a result of the discussion, “The Nagoya Declaration – URBIO 2010” was adopted. It was reported at the City Biodiversity Summit.

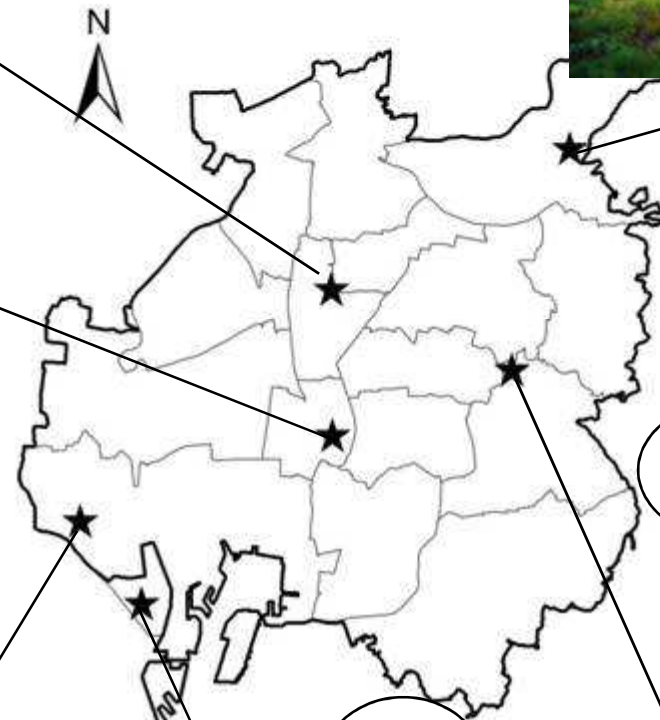

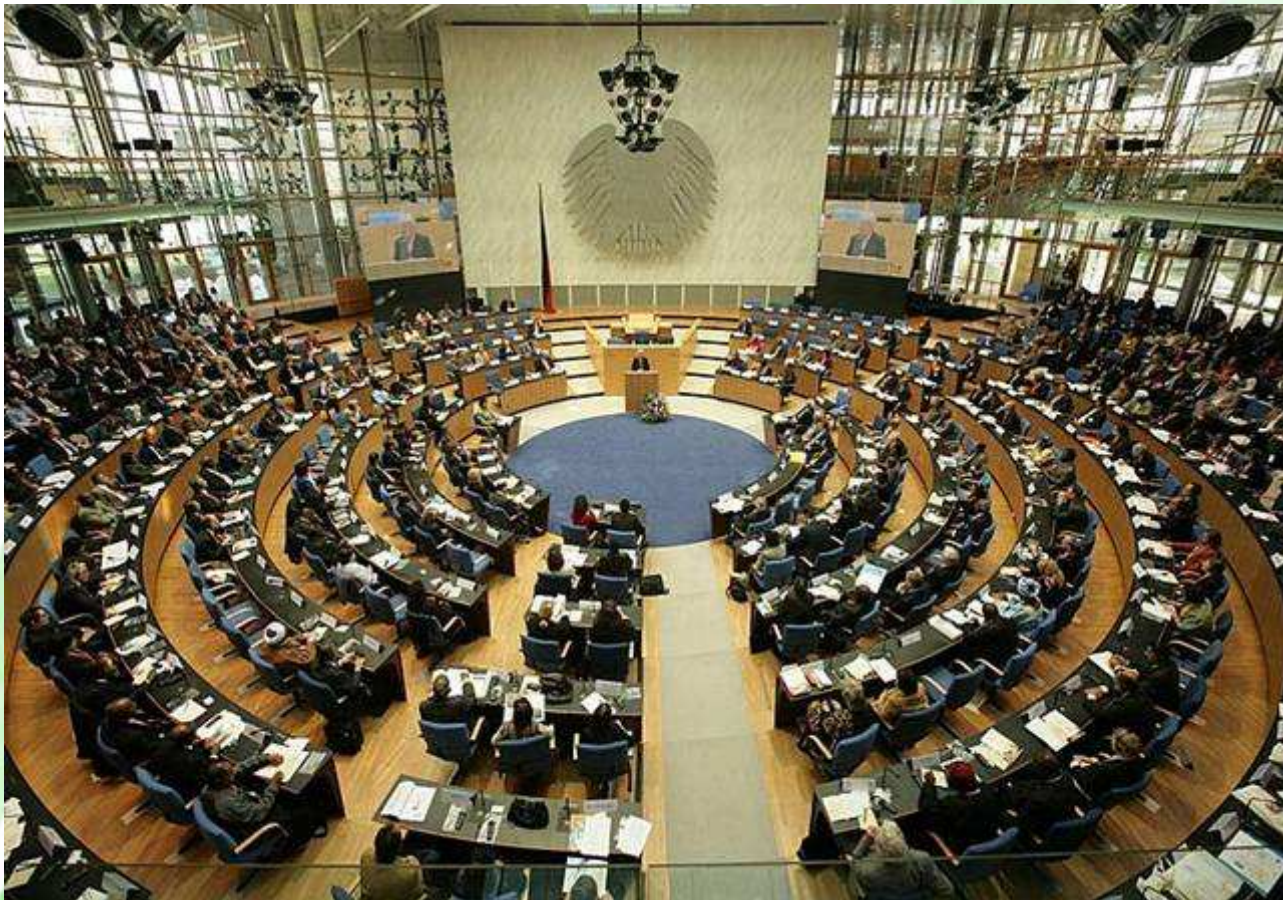
