New and emerging issues under the Convention on Biological Diversity - Submission from Norway

In Notification 2019-041, Parties, other Governments, relevant organizations and other stakeholders were invited to submit proposals for new and emerging issues for the future work programmes of the Convention.

Norway is of the opinion that synthetic biology should be classified as a new and emerging issue for the future work programmes under the Convention.

In Decision 14/19 in Sharm El-Sheikh, the Conference of the Parties recognized that synthetic biology is a rapidly developing field and a cross-cutting issue with potential benefits and potential adverse effects vis-a-vis the three objectives of the Convention. Hence, COP14 agreed that synthetic biology needs a broad and regular horizon scanning and monitoring and assessing of the most recent technological developments. Accordingly, a number of decisions and recommendations were made, among them to extend the AHTEG, the open-ended online forum, to convene moderated discussions and to update the Technical Series on Synthetic biology.

Clearly, synthetic biology already has a momentum within the CBD and it has been on the agenda for several consecutive COPs. At present the technological developments within synthetic biology advance at an accelerated rate and the potential impacts on the three objectives of the Convention cannot be underestimated. Synthetic biology must be addressed properly by the Convention and its Protocols. For the time being, given its cross-cutting nature, possible impacts and depth of intervention, Norway finds it appropriate that synthetic biology is classified as a new and emerging issue under the Convention.
