

5. General information on access to Helsinki, Finland



Helsinki is serviced by the Vantaa International airport (19 km North of Helsinki City centre). Participants may use Finnair City Bus to the City Terminal to reach the city centre (railway station in the City Center), it departs from the airport every 20 minutes, or you may wish to take a taxi.

Taxi to and from the airport

The taxi journey from the airport to the centre of Helsinki takes nearly half an hour and costs about 35-40 €. There are taxi stations right outside the Arrivals Halls of the Domestic and International terminals. Service desks for the taxi operators can be found at Arrival halls 1 and 2.

Bus from the airport

At the airport, the bus stops are situated in front of the domestic flights terminal and the international flights terminal. For the location of bus stops and the route of AirPort Bus, go to http://www.helsinki-vantaa.fi/home.

Bus to the airport

Bus services from Helsinki City take you to the airport comfortably and rapidly, the journey from Helsinki City by bus No. 615 takes approximately 35 minutes.

There are a number of other bus connections from various parts of the Helsinki Metropolitan Area to the airport.

6. Visa information

Participants from countries listed in **annex A** below (page 5) require a Schengen entry visa for Finland and participants from countries appearing on the list are strongly advised to contact the nearest Finnish diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure.

The currency in Finland is the Euro (\in). The current exchange rate as at 12 February 2009 is US $\$1.00 = \notin 0.78$ and $\notin 1.00 = US \$1.28$.
