

## **CURRENT SITUATION**

### • INSTITUTIONAL STRUCTURE

• The Environment Division in the Ministry of Agriculture, Lands, Forestry, Fisheries and Environment is responsible for CHM and biodiversity issues. The Environmental unit within the Ministry is headed by the Permanent Secretary with four technical officers and other administrative support staff

## **CURRENT SITUATION**

### CURRENT AVAILABLE CAPACITY

- The Ministry has engaged external support for the CHM technical functions
- Personnel from NTRC provided that technical support for the last 7 years
- Dr. Spencer Thomas, a member of Bureau of CBD is also a member of the Informal Advisory Committee for the CHM.
- Technical training and technical support received were from the Netherlands Government to Grenada's CHM development
- Grenada CHM is hosted by the European Commission based on recommendation of the Netherlands.

## **CURRENT SITUATION**

- CHALLENGES FACED
  - Lack of adequate Technical and Financial capacity
    - Netherlands was invited to assist.
    - NTRC personnel engaged
    - National ICT department personnel received training along with NTRC personnel
  - Lack of integration in national development
    - Creation of Ministry of Environment to provide focus and attention
    - Ministry is responsible for overall management
    - Ministry is responsible for content
    - NTRC provided technical support

## STRATEGIC VISION

### Main issue being faced:

- Hosting the site: European Commission agreed to host temporarily so Grenada needs to agree on time table for National Hosting.
  - National capacity to host has to be developed
  - Ministry, NTRC, ICT department to agree on repatriation process and timetable

### Support to the implementation of the NBSAP

The CHM can be developed to be a repository of information for NBSAP:

- Provide links to relevant materials
- Can be source of information on the revised NBSAP
- Can be useful for monitoring and evaluating of the NBSAP
- The CHM must be developed to be the primary source of information and evaluation on the nexus between NBSAP & the Aichi Targets

## COOPERATION AND SUPPORT

### International level:

- Continued support by Netherlands and European Commission
- Support from the CBD with respect to monitoring and evaluation of the Aichi targets
- Support from IABIN (Inter American Bio-diversity Information Network)

- best practice sharing, lessons learnt sharing
- Workshops on CHM development and NBSAP Implementation
- Regional Hosting of CHM sites

### On National Level:

- Budgetary Support
- Available Technical Personnel
- Integration of CHM into work program

#### Trees in Support of Forest Biodiversity


