Item 1: Opening of Meeting

H. Zedan, Executive Secretary, welcomed the IAC members to the meeting. He stressed the importance of the need to use the CHM to promote technical and scientific cooperation, particularly in the implementation of measures and activities outlined in annexes I and II of decision V/14, the objectives of the CHM Strategic Plan and recommendations made by IAC during the 11 March 2001 meeting. He also emphasized the need for advice from the IAC concerning the need to integrate the objectives of the CHM Strategic Plan with the Strategic Plan of the Convention. In addition, he requested advice on the establishment of future international thematic focal points and on the work of the CHM in support of themes and cross-cutting issues. He concluded his opening remarks by wishing the IAC a fruitful meeting

Item 2: Organizational Matters

This agenda item was introduced by the co-Chair, G. Rochon.

Item 2.1. Adoption of Agenda

Item 2.2. Organization of Work

The meeting agreed with the organization of work described in the provisional agenda.

<u>Item 2.3 Welcome new members</u>

The co-Chair welcomed new members and requested members to introduce themselves.

Item 3. Progress report on implementation of the Activities identified in Annex II, Decision V/14, CHM Strategic Plan, SBSTTA recommendations and IAC recommendations.

The Secretariat offered a review of the accomplishments and ongoing work of the CHM including:

Accomplishments (see Annex)

- Publication of new CHM brochure
- Launch of new web site
- Launch of the Pilot Phase of the Biosafety Clearing-House web site

- Development of new communication mechanisms for thematic work of the Convention (listservs, news groups, etc.)
- Development of the Biosafety Clearing-House (BCH) Toolkit
- Development of controlled vocabulary for the CBD web site
- Completion of MoC with the Global Invasive Species Program (GISP) on the establishment of an international thematic focal point
- Establishment of the Global Taxonomy Initiative as an international thematic focal point
- Joined the GISP Information Management Working Group as a co-Chair
- Presention of a joint CHM/BCH Regional Workshop in Africa
- Presention of a CHM Regional Workshop in Latin America
- Participation in a BCH Regional Workshop in Latin America
- Participation in a GISP capacity building workshop in South America
- Initiation of work with the GISP on the development and implementation of a Global Invasive Species Network
- Establishment of the Dublin Core as the metadata standard for the CBD web site
- Decision on the use of eXtended Markup Language (XML) as the information exchange mechanism for the CBD web site
- Re-design of the CBD web site to accommodate all U.N. official languages
- Decision that mirror sites to the CBD web site were not needed

Recommendations from IAC pertaining to activities include:

- Reach audiences in addition to the scientific community
- Contribute to fostering public awareness and education about the Convention
- Continue to focus on technical and scientific cooperation
- Create matrix of regional workshop decisions
- Complete updating of all programmes and issues sections of the CBD web site
- Establish new international thematic focal points with relevant initiatives and organizations
- Complete the CHM/GISP "Building a Global Invasive Species Information Network" document
- Participate in new CHM/BCH regional workshops
- Participate in the GEF/UNEP Sustainable Alternatives Network
- Participate in the Global Development Gateway
- Continue to further development of controlled vocabularies and metadata standards
- Draft questionnaire on status of implementation of National CHMs
- When developing lists of best practices, include examples from developing countries and regions
- Non-web information tools should be developed parallel with the development of new webbased tools
- Whenever possible, include local expertise in capacity building workshops

<u>Item 4. Progress report on the Biosafety Clearing-House</u>

The Secretariat offered a review of the contribution and role of the CHM in the development and launching of the Pilot Phase of the Biosafety Clearing-House, including:

- Development of standards to make distributed databases interoperable
- Development of metadata standards
- Development of a BCH Toolkit to assist users in understanding and navigating the Biosafety Clearing-House and registering information from remote locations
- Development of information exchange mechanisms.

In response to the above, the IAC recommended the drafting of a paper summarizing the synergies and differences between the CHM and the BCH, as per the recommendation made at the Latin American and Caribbean Region held in Lima, Peru, on 7 September 2001.

Item 5. The role of the CHM in the implementation of the Convention on Biological Diversity

The representative from Germany reported on the recommendations arising from the Pan-European Workshop on Building the CHM Partnership: Facilitating Scientific and Technical Cooperation, held in Bonn, Germany on 28-29 September 2001.

A paper was tabled on behalf of the New Zealand representative on the "Role of the CHM in Implementation." The IAC welcomes this type of contribution to the work of the Committee and would urge delegates to provide future contributions two weeks prior to the convening of the Committee.

The IAC co-Chair requested members to reflect on the relevance of the CHM Strategic Plan to the Strategic Plan of the Convention and to make recommendations to the Executive Secretary on integrating CHM objectives identified in the CHM Strategic Plan with the Strategic Plan of the Convention.

The IAC noted that Decision V/14 supports the implementation of the CHM Strategic Plan, and recommends inter alia that the strategic plan for the CHM should become a component of the Strategic Plan of the Convention.

The IAC also recognized that the CHM is an essential mechanism supporting implementation of the Convention, and as such is certain to be a key mechanism for supporting implementation of the Strategic Plan of the Convention.

The IAC also noted that Decision V/20 identifies the need for the Strategic Plan of the Convention to draw on, as far as possible, the mechanisms needed to support Convention goals and activities, and to identify the financial, human resource and other capacity requirements.

Recommendations from the IAC pertaining to the above include:

- CHM should be used as a tool to facilitate implementation of the Convention
- A statement should be included in the Strategic Plan of the Convention to be used as a preamble to or to be inserted in an appropriate section recognizing the essential role of the CHM in the implementation of the Convention and the Strategic Plan.
- The role of the CHM in supporting technical and scientific cooperation, capacity building and information exchange should be reflected throughout the Strategic Plan of the Convention
- Articulate the fundamental role of the CHM in assisting programme areas and cross-cutting issues in meeting their goals.

Further to the above, the IAC recommended that the Executive Secretary review the draft Strategic Plan of the Convention together with the CHM Strategic Plan and to draft a matrix identifying how the elements of the CHM Strategic Plan support implementation of the CBD Strategic Plan.

The IAC co-Chair also requested members to advise the Executive Secretary on work to be accomplished prior to the sixth Conference of the Parties in response to activities identified in Annex II. Decision V/14.

Recommendations from the IAC pertaining to the above include:

- Organize a formats, protocols and standards meeting and provide advice to the COP on adoption of recommendations made at the meeting
- Continue to emphasize capacity building, in particular the development of partnerships
- Further develop work in support of programme areas and cross-cutting issues of the Convention
- Continue to establish thematic focal points with relevant organizations and initiatives
- Better communicate with Parties and the public the meaning of technical and scientific cooperation and encourage partners to call a meeting on this topic
- Draft a paper on the lessons learned from the work on the BCH and how it can be implemented in the CHM
- Reiterate the need for the financial mechanism to fund the development of national CHMs
- Emphasize the need to adhere to open information exchange protocols and standards
- Reiterate importance of full Internet access and capacity-building so countries wil be able to utilize Internet technologies

N. Nogueira stated that recommendations made during the meeting would serve in the drafting of the document "Progress report on the mechanisms for implementation" (UNEP/CBD/COP/6/13).

Item 6. Preparation for the next meeting

The next IAC meeting will be held on the margins of the sixth Conference of the Parties, 8-26 April 2002.
