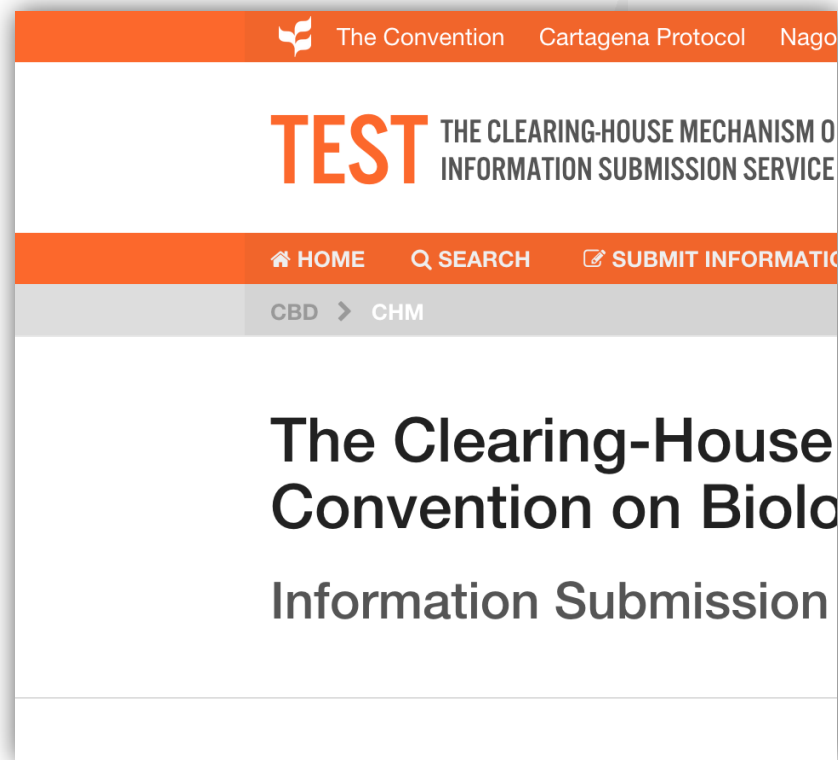
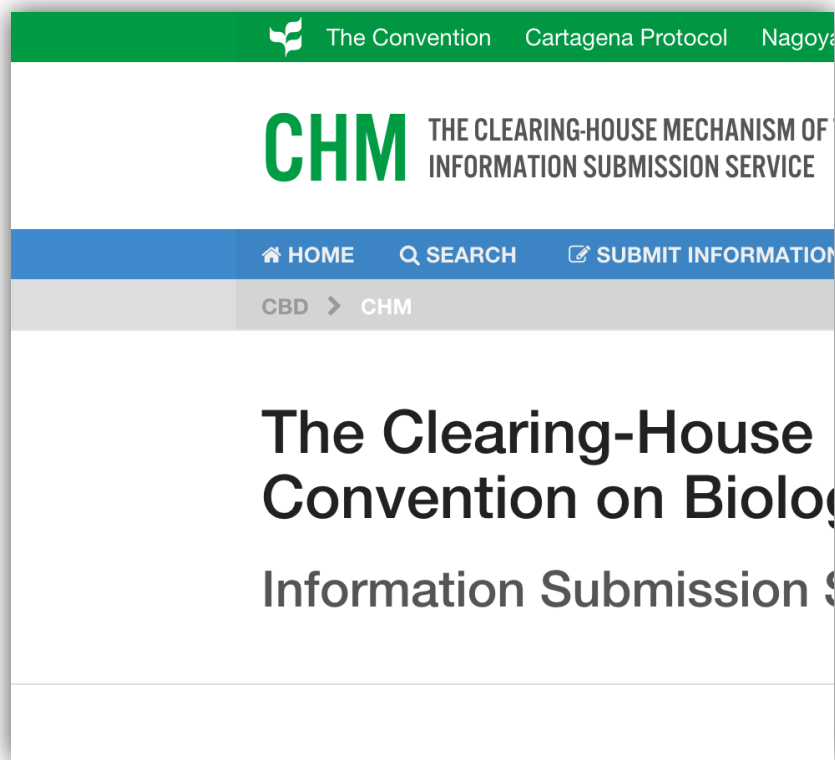

National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs) are the principal instruments for implementing the Convention at the national level (Article 6). The Convention requires countries to prepare a national biodiversity strategy (or equivalent instrument) and to ensure that this strategy is mainstreamed into the planning and activities of all those sectors whose activities can have an impact (positive and negative) on biodiversity.



National Reports

Parties are obliged under Article 26 of the Convention to submit their national reports to the Conference of the Parties on measures taken for the implementation of the Convention and their effectiveness in meeting the objectives of the Convention. National reports provide main sources of information for the Conference of the Parties and its subsidiary bodies to review the implementation of the Convention (Article 23).



Other National Reports

Parties are encouraged to submit other reports related to the implementation of the Convention and its Protocols.



Financial Reporting Framework

DEMONSTRATION OF THE ON-LINE REPORTING TOOL OF THE CONVENTION

This side event provides an opportunity to demonstrate the on-line reporting tool, developed as requested in COP decisions VIII/14 and XII/29. The tool will allow Parties to make information available concerning progress towards the Aichi Targets as well as national targets set in line with the Aichi Targets, using relevant national, global and other indicators. Information provided through this tool will assist with reviews of progress in the implementation of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 to be undertaken at each COP meeting and other meetings until 2020. This side event will also provide training on the use of the tool, with a view to getting more Parties to use the tool.

Feedback from testers



- Account Management: confusion with single login for all CHMs
- Implementation dates difficult to enter, dates are shown the US way
- “How is entered data then displayed to public?”
- Text boxes too short, no advanced editing possible, no blank lines possible
- Not possible to add sub targets (parented to a main target)
- No translation
- Confusion between live and test environments
- More *help balloons* needed throughout the reporting tool
- Several problems with IE 9
- Good draft guide, but could be improved errors
- No edition/deletion possible after assessment is published.
- Choice of colors to be reevaluated (especially on buttons)
- the need to have cross linkages from national strategy to the European strategy and other biodiversity relevant conventions such as CMS, CITES, Ramsar

Aichi Target 14

Ecosystems and essential services safeguarded

By 2020, ecosystems that provide essential services, including services related to water, and contribute to health, livelihoods and well-being, are restored and safeguarded, taking into account the needs of women, indigenous and local communities, and the poor and vulnerable.

Global Status

Implementation Activities

Canada - In July 2013, the province of Saskatchewan designated a new protected area in the provincial boreal forest, the Pink Lake Representative Area Ecological Reserve. At 3,660 km², it is Saskatchewan's largest protected area. With the Pink Lake designation, protected area coverage in the Churchill River Upland Ecoregion increases from 4.9% to 8.2%. As an ecological reserve, no new industrial development will be allowed in the area. Leases or permits in place at the time of the designation will be grandfathered to allow existing activities to continue. Traditional activities by First Nations and Métis people, as well as recreational hunting and angling, will continue.
