SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS OF DRAFT DECISIONS

Note by the Executive Secretary

- 1. The present document provides information on the financial implications of activities proposed in the draft decisions submitted to the Conference of the Parties, including recommendations that appear in square brackets. The draft decisions cited in the various recommendations that have been submitted by the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) at its nineteenth and twentieth meetings, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation (SBI) at its first meeting, the Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on Article 8(j) and Related Provisions (WG8J) at its ninth meeting, and, where appropriate, additional elements developed by the Executive Secretary in the light of previous decisions of the Conference of the Parties or recommendations emanating from subsidiary bodies. Where required, the basis for these additional elements is provided in the documentation prepared for the thirteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties.
