INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS

1. Opening and registration

The Latin American and Caribbean regional preparatory meeting for the seventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity will be held in Buenos Aires, Argentina from 22 to 23 January 2004.

The meeting will start at 10.00 a.m. on Thursday, 22 January 2004 and registration will take place at the venue of the meeting from 8 a.m. to 9:45 am on the same day.

2. Venue

The meeting will be held in the "Libertador" room of Palacio San Martin, in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs located at:

3. Working languages of the meeting

The meeting will be held in Spanish and English.

4. Documents

Delegates are kindly reminded to bring their copies of the meeting documents, as they will only be available in Buenos Aires in very limited quantities.

5. Visas

Attached, as an Annex I, is a list of countries whose citizens do not require visas to enter Argentina. In addition, Annex II lists countries whose citizens **require** an entry visa for Argentina.

For participants requiring a visa, an early contact with the consular authorities of the Government of Argentina is advised to allow sufficient time for a visa to be issued as appropriate prior to departure.

6. Services to Participants

Participants will be able to access their emails, <u>free of charge</u>, in workstations situated on the premises of the meeting venue.

Lunch meals and coffee breaks will be provided within the meeting venue, and a reception dinner will be hosted on Thursday, 22 January 2004 by the Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores, Comercio Internacional y Culto.

7. Access to Buenos Aires

Buenos Aires is serviced by the Ezeiza International Airport, which is about 35 km from downtown Buenos Aires.

8. Ground Transport from and to Ezeiza International Airport:

a) Buses

The most economic way to travel between the airport and downtown Buenos Aires is by bus. The companies Manuel Tienda León (19 pesos/6,3 US dollars) (tel 4480-9464 airport/4314-3636 city), Ecuador (tel 4314-1999), and San Martín Bus (tel 4314-4747 city) offer a half-hourly service between its offices in Buenos Aires and Ezeiza airport from 05.00 to 21.00 hours. The trip takes 45 minutes, depending on traffic.

b) Chauffeured Cars (Remises)

Passengers may choose to hire chauffeured cars, or remises, for traveling to their destinations in Buenos Aires. These are essentially unmetered taxis, where a flat travel price is negotiated at the time of hire. Generally, a trip from Ezeiza to downtown Buenos Aires will be roughly the same as the ride in a taxi. Listed below are the locations and telephone numbers of the private car companies that serve Ezeiza. c) Taxi

Black and yellow colored metered taxis are readily available in and around Ezeiza Airport, as well as throughout Buenos Aires. If you opt to avoid the throngs of drivers in the arrivals bay soliciting clients, go to the taxi booth in order to make arrangements for a taxi to take you to the center of the city. A typical ride to the downtown area will take about 45 minutes. No more than four passengers will be admitted per taxi.

9. Hotel accommodation

31 single rooms have been reserved in the **Apart Hotel "Suipacha Suites**" for delegates receiving financial support, with excellent facilities including swimming pool and air conditioning, etc. in the heart of downtown Buenos Aires. The regional preparatory meeting will be taking place in the premises of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, just one block from the hotel.

Buenos Aires in winter will be 3 hours behind Greenwich Mean Time (-3 GMT). Daylight Saving Time is not observed

11. Weather

Buenos Aires is on the south side of the Rio de la Plata, in the southern hemisphere and the climate is generally mild and humid. Temperatures range between 95 degrees Fahrenheit (35 degrees Celsius) in January to 50 degrees Fahrenheit (10 degrees Celsius) in July. From December to the end of February, the

Guyana (for ordinary passports; no need for diplomatic/official passports)

St. Kitts and Nevis (both ordinary and diplomatic passports)

St. Vincent and Grenadines (both ordinary and diplomatic passports)

Surinam(for both ordinary and diplomatic passports)
