National experience with REDD-plus

Limited experience- planning and preparation

New development- was not priority given Hurricane Ivan

Status of the forests

20% cover - 90 % damaged, recovering, protected

Afforestation, reforestation – key policy objectives

Livelihood /ecosystem benefits

Local community involvement- small economy

No Experience from carbon market

National experience with biodiversity safeguards

No Specific focus on REDD safeguards

NBSAP/NEMS /NEP/NCSA/NAP/CC /reports

Policy, governance, TK, participation, conservation, risk, leakage

Public education and awareness – key

Resources – key - leverage

National experience with assessing/ monitoring impacts of REDD-plus

Forestry policy not specific on REDD-plus
conservation/management-no carbon

Ecological gap assessment completed

No specific references to REDD

Caribbean Challenge

Ecosystem valuation- carbon price/carbon measurement

Resistance to commoditize biodiversity

REDD-plus: Seeking synergies between the CBD and the UNFCCC

Synergies : CCD? Other? Understanding linkages
