ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

INTRODUCTION

1. At its tenth meeting, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity requested the Executive Secretary to work with Parties and other Governments as well as competent organizations and regional initiatives, such as the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), regional seas conventions and action plans, and, where appropriate, regional fisheries management organizations (RFMOs) to organize, including the setting of terms of reference, a series of regional workshops, with a primary objective to facilitate the description of ecologically or biologically significant marine areas through the application of scientific criteria in annex I of decision IX/20 as well as other relevant compatible and complementary nationally and intergovernmentally agreed scientific criteria, as well as the scientific guidance on the identification of marine areas beyond national jurisdiction, which meet the scientific criteria in annex I to decision IX/20 (paragraph 36 of decision X/29).
2. In the same decision, the Conference of the Parties requested that the Executive Secretary make available the scientific and technical data and information and results collated through the workshops referred to above to participating Parties, other Governments, intergovernmental agencies and the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) for their use according to their competencies.
3. Subsequently, the Conference of the Parties, at its eleventh meeting, requested the Executive Secretary to further collaborate with Parties, other Governments, competent organizations, and global and regional initiatives, such as the United Nations General Assembly Ad Hoc Working Group of the Whole on the Regular Process for Global Reporting and Assessment of the State of the Marine Environment, including Socio-Economic Aspects, the International Maritime Organization, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, regional seas conventions and action plans, and, where appropriate, regional fisheries management organizations, with regard to fisheries management, and also including the participation of indigenous and local communities, to facilitate the description of areas that meet the criteria for EBSAs through the organization of additional regional or subregional workshops for the remaining regions or subregions where Parties wish workshops to be held, and for the further description of the areas already described where new information becomes available (paragraph 12 of decision XI/17).

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4. Pursuant to the above requests and with financial support from the Governments of Japan, Norway and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Executive Secretary is convening the South-Eastern Atlantic Regional Workshop to Facilitate the Description of Ecologically or Biologically Significant Marine Areas (EBSAs), in collaboration with the Abidjan Convention and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). This workshop will be hosted by the Government of Namibia and will take place in Swakopmund, from 8 to 12 April 2013.
5. A list of documents for the workshop is attached as annex I.
6. The Secretariat will be issuing an information note for participants containing details of logistical arrangements, including information on travel, visa requirements, accommodation and other matters for the meeting. The languages of the workshop will be English and French.
7. Registration of participants will commence at 9 a.m. on Monday, 8 April 2013.

ITEM 1. OPENING OF THE WORKSHOP

8. Representatives of the Government of Namibia, the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Abidjan Convention Secretariat and FAO will open the workshop at 9.30 a.m. on Monday, 8 April 2013.

ITEM 2. ELECTION OF THE WORKSHOP CO-CHAIRS, ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK

9. After a brief self-introduction, the participants will be invited to elect the workshop co-chairs, based on proposals from the floor.
10. Participants will then be invited to consider the provisional agenda (UNEP/CBD/RW/EBSA/SEA/1/1) and the proposed organization of work, as contained in annex II below, and adopt them following any amendments, if needed.
11. The workshop will be organized in plenary and breakout-group sessions. The workshop co-chairs will nominate facilitators and rapporteurs for breakout groups, based on the expertise and experience of the workshop participants and in consultation with the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity.

ITEM 3. WORKSHOP BACKGROUND, SCOPE AND OUTPUT

12. The representative of the Secretariat will brief on the results of the Sustainable Ocean Initiative Capacity-Building Workshop for West Africa (Dakar, 4 to 8 February 2013), which included a training on EBSAs in support of this workshop. The Secretariat will also provide a brief overview on the EBSA process under the Convention on Biological Diversity, workshop objectives and expected outputs/outcomes of the workshop. Selected experts will also be invited to provide presentations on:
 - (a) Scientific guidance on the application of EBSA criteria;
 - (b) Relevant global processes, including FAO's work on vulnerable marine ecosystems;
 - (c) Overview of relevant scientific programmes at regional scale; and
 - (d) Regional overview of biogeographic information on open-ocean water and deep-sea habitats and a proposed geographic scope of the workshop.
13. Workshop participants will be invited, building upon the presentation, to exchange views on the geographic scope of the workshop and the workshop outputs/outcomes.

ITEM 4. REVIEW OF RELEVANT SCIENTIFIC DATA/INFORMATION/MAPS COMPILED AND SUBMITTED FOR THE WORKSHOP

14. Under this item, participants will have before them a note by the Executive Secretary (UNEP/CBD/RW/EBSA/SEA/1/2) transmitting a compilation of the submissions by Parties, other Governments and relevant organizations of scientific information to describe areas meeting the scientific criteria for ecologically or biologically significant marine areas in the South-Eastern Atlantic region, made in response to the Secretariat's notification 2012-153 (Ref. no. SCBD/STTM/JM/JL/JG/81106), dated 18 December 2012. Participants will also have before them a note by the Executive Secretary (UNEP/CBD/RW/EBSA/SEA/1/3) transmitting a compilation and synthesis of scientific data in support of the workshop objectives. The documents/references submitted prior to the workshop are being made available for the information of workshop participants on the meeting website (<http://www.cbd.int/doc/?meeting=EBSA-SEA-01>).

15. Workshop participants will be invited to review, through individual presentations and open plenary discussion, relevant scientific data/information/maps in relation to their potential contribution to describing areas meeting EBSA criteria.

ITEM 5. DESCRIPTION OF AREAS MEETING THE SCIENTIFIC CRITERIA FOR EBSAs AND OTHER RELEVANT COMPATIBLE AND COMPLEMENTARY NATIONALLY AND INTERGOVERNMENTALLY AGREED SCIENTIFIC CRITERIA

16. Under this item, based on the compilation mentioned above and building on the above presentations and deliberations of the workshop in plenary session, participants will be invited to split into two or three subregional breakout groups (details to be determined by the workshop plenary) to consider the description of areas meeting the scientific criteria for EBSAs and other relevant compatible and complementary nationally and intergovernmentally agreed scientific criteria. Depending on the number of participants, further subgroupings can be made as advised by the workshop co-chairs, in consultation with the Secretariat.

17. The results of the breakout groups will be reported at the plenary for consideration. The workshop participants in the plenary session will review the potential areas that meet the scientific criteria for EBSAs proposed by the breakout group sessions and consider them for inclusion in the final list of describing areas meeting EBSAs criteria.

ITEM 6. IDENTIFICATION OF GAPS AND NEEDS FOR FURTHER ELABORATION IN DESCRIBING AREAS MEETING EBSAs CRITERIA, INCLUDING THE NEED FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SCIENTIFIC CAPACITY AS WELL AS FUTURE SCIENTIFIC COLLABORATION

18. Building on the workshop deliberation on describing areas meeting the scientific criteria for EBSAs, workshop participants will be invited to identify, through the theme presentations and open plenary discussion, gaps and needs for further elaboration in describing areas meeting EBSAs criteria, including the need for the development of scientific capacity and future scientific collaboration.

ITEM 7. OTHER MATTERS

19. Under this item, consideration may be given to any other matters of relevance raised by workshop participants.

ITEM 8. ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

20. Participants will be invited to consider and adopt the report of the workshop on the basis of a draft report to be prepared and presented by the workshop co-chairs.

ITEM 9. CLOSURE OF THE WORKSHOP

21. The workshop is expected to be closed at 5 p.m. on Friday, 12 April 2013.
