Overall Suggestions

- Report on all actions taken to implement the Convention, not just NBSAPs.
- Report on all actions taken by all relevant sectors /stakeholders, not just those by Governments.
- Report on implementation of old NBSAP if not much done to implement new NBSAP.
- Focus on outcomes.
- Do more analysis than description.
- Use cases/successful stories to support analysis.
- Use indicators.
- Analyze how national actions contribute to implementation of CBD thematic programme areas and cross-cutting issues.





Suggested Structure of Part II

- Overview of updated NBSAP (goals, targets, key actions, relevance of national targets with Aichi Targets, differences between new and old NBSAPs)
- Implementation of NBSAP (actions taken, outcomes achieved, assessment of level of implementation, challenges encountered)
- Mainstreaming of biodiversity (mechanisms established, actions taken by sectors, outcomes achieved, tools used, synergies in implementation of related MEAs).

Suggested Information to be Included in Section 1 (Questions 5 &6)

Question 5. What are the biodiversity targets by your country?

Question 6. How has your NBSAP been updated to incorporate these targets and to serve as an effective instrument to mainstream biodiversity?

In this section, countries could

- •Describe key goals, targets and actions identified in updated NBSAP in line with the Aichi Targets, as well as differences between old and new NBSAPs;
- •Elaborate how actions identified in updated NBSAP could achieve national targets in line with Aichi Targets, address threats described in Part I, and implement the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020;
- •Elaborate how updated NBSAP could help integrate biodiversity considerations into relevant national and sectoral strategies and plans.





Suggested Information to be Included in Section 2 (Questions 7 &9)

Question 7. What actions has your country taken to implement the Convention since 4NR and what have been the outcomes of these actions?

Question 9. How fully has your NBSAP been implemented?

In this section, countries could

- •Cover all related actions for implementing the Convention, including legislations, policies, cooperative mechanisms and funding,
- •Elaborate outcomes of actions by linking them with changes in status and trends of biodiversity,
- Use cases/success stories to support analysis of outcomes;
- •Analyze how national actions contribute to implementation of CBD thematic work programmes and cross-cutting issues,
- Analyze obstacles encountered in implementation,
- •Analyze the extent to which NBSAP has been implemented (which action has been taken and to what extent, and which has not, and why?).





Suggested Information to be Included in Section 3 (Question 8)

Question 8 How effectively has biodiversity been mainstreamed into relevant sectoral and cross-sectoral strategies, plans and programmes?

In this section, countries could describe

- •How biodiversity is considered in poverty reduction strategies, sustainable development strategies and other cross-cutting policy instruments, as well as various sectoral strategies, plans and programmes, and planning mechanisms;
- •Actions taken by each sector to implement biodiversity-related actions in their respective strategies and plans;
- •Tools (e.g. SEA, ecosystem approach) used for mainstreaming;
- •How CBD implementation is synergized with implementation of other related Conventions;
- •How biodiversity is considered in international cooperation.


