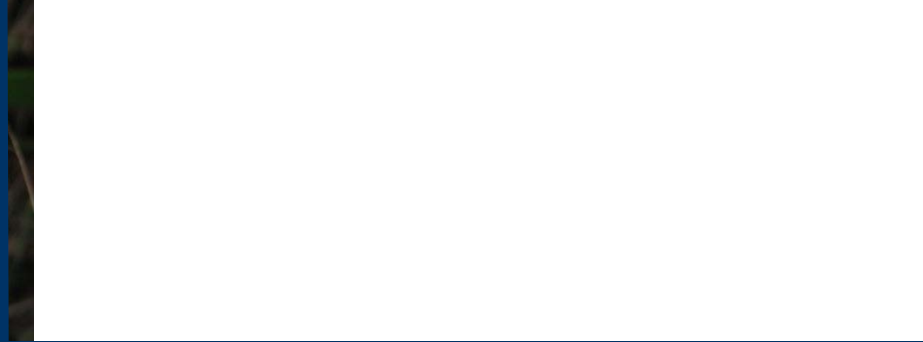
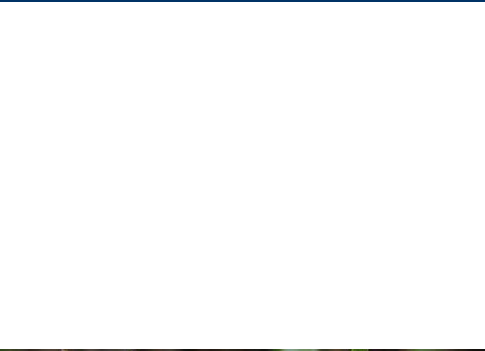

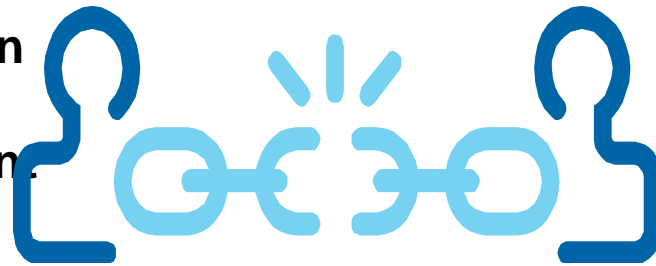

COP 10 Decision X/31

Para 1 (b) *Invites* Parties to develop a **long-term action plan** or reorient relevant existing plans... for the implementation of PoWPA , including appropriate implementation mechanisms,... **detailing a list of activities, timelines, budget and responsibilities**, based upon the results of key assessments of the programme of work on protected areas, **with a view to contributing to the implementation of the Strategic Plan of the Convention** and *requests* the Executive Secretary to submit **a report on the preparation of such plans to the Conference of the Parties at its eleventh meeting**

COP 10 Decision X/31

Para 10 *Invites* Parties to:

(a) Develop and implement **sustainable finance plans** in accordance with national legislation and systems, for protected area systems **by 2012** and support individual protected areas **,based on realistic needs assessments and a diversified portfolio of traditional and innovative financial mechanisms;**

(b) **Timely and appropriately** use the protected-area biodiversity allocations of the fifth replenishment period of the Global Environment Facility, as well as bilateral, multilateral and other financial support relevant for protected areas **using their action plan** for implementing the programme of work on protected areas **as the basis for accessing funds ;**

Para 13. The COP *Urges* the **Global Environment Facility and its Implementing Agencies** to streamline their delivery for expeditious and proportionate disbursement and **to align the projects to national action plans** for the programme of work on protected areas **for appropriate, focused, sufficient and harmonious interventions and continuity of projects**



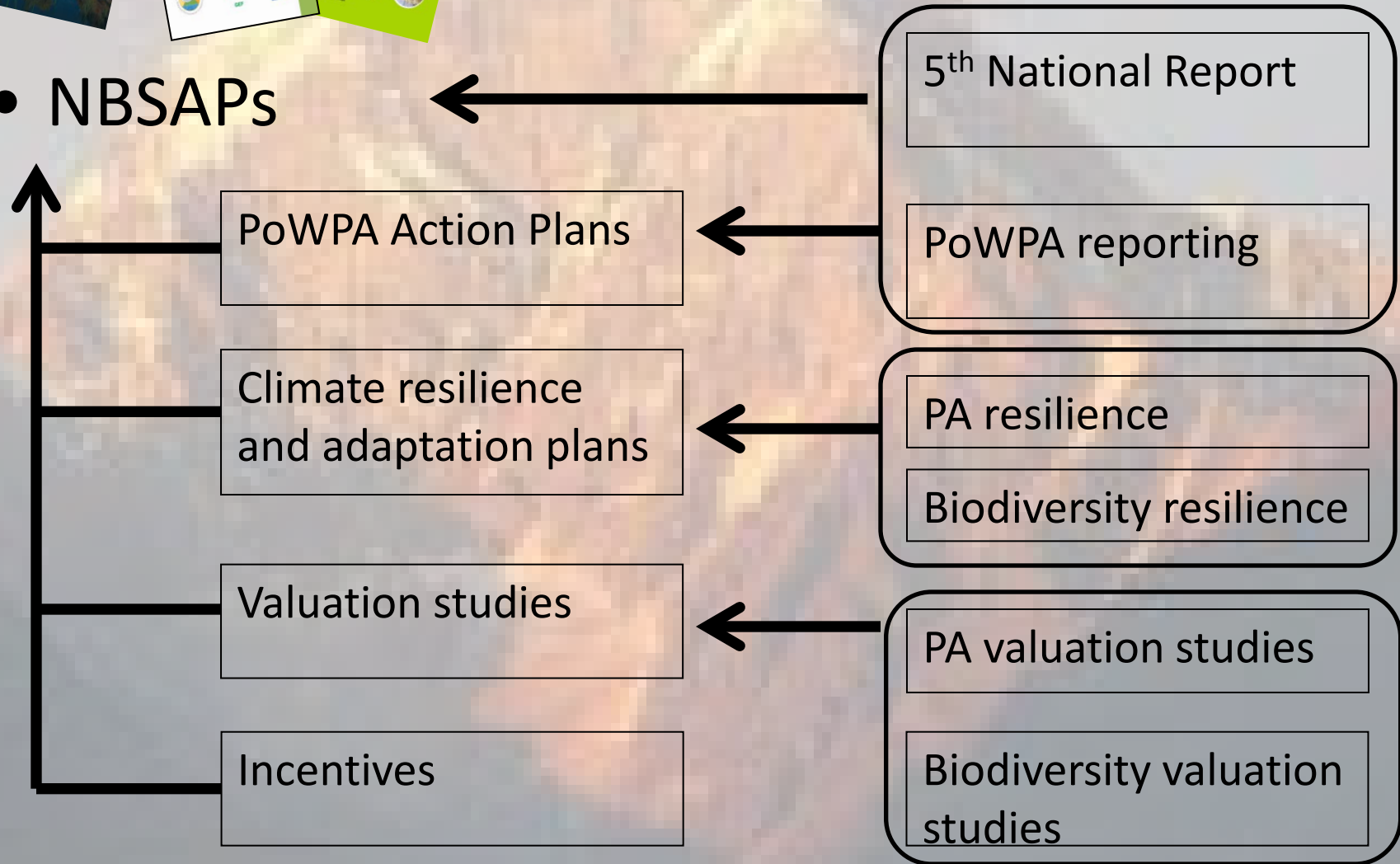

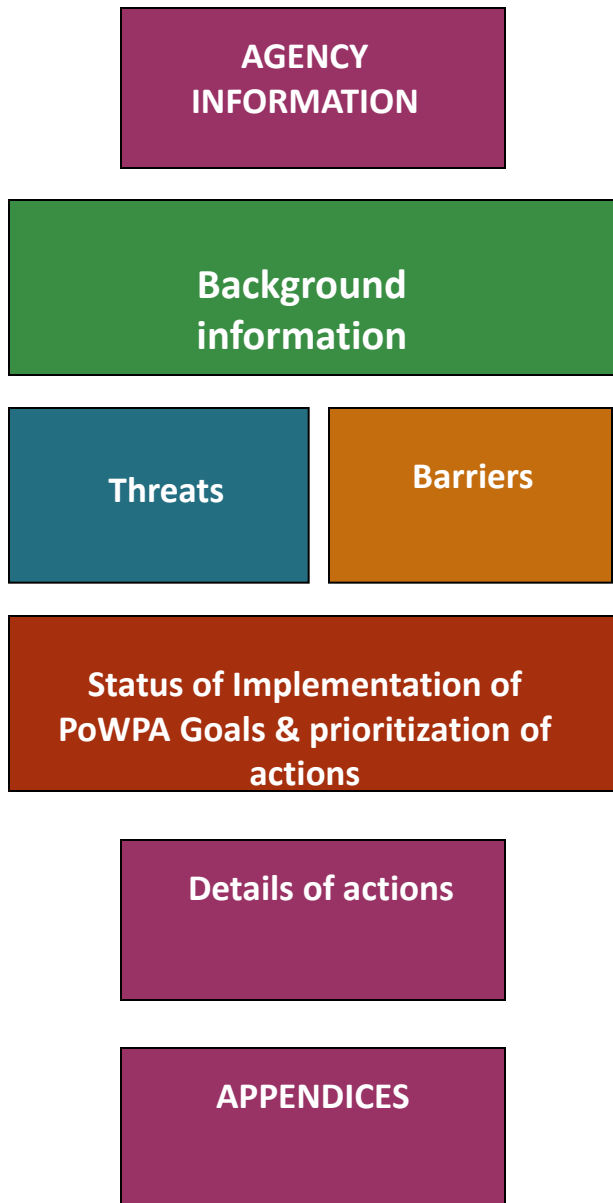

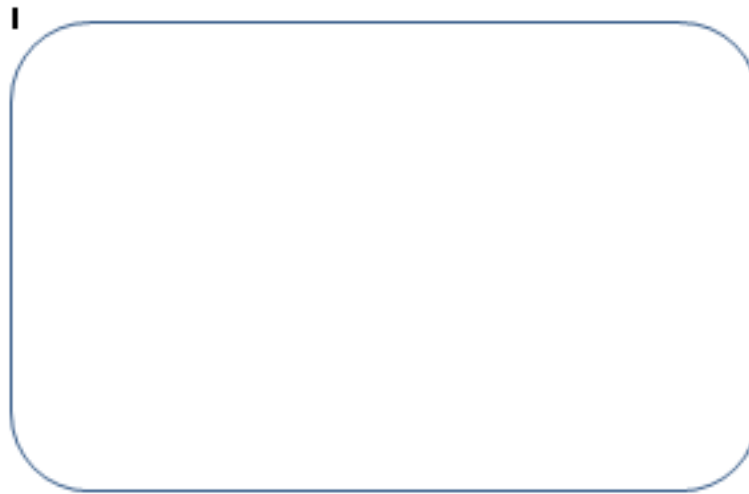
