

5. General information on access to Singapore City, Singapore



Singapore is serviced by Changi International Airport (about 20 km from the city centre) and the journey takes about 30 minutes. Taxis are available at the designated points on the arrivals level and cost from SG\$ 18-SG\$ 38 (US\$ 15 – US\$ 30) excluding surcharges (airport fee, late night arrival). Various shuttle services are also available at the arrivals ground transport desk from the airport to the city centre at varying costs. 6. Visa information



Participants from countries listed below require an entry visa for Singapore and are strongly advised to contact the nearest Singapore diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. It should be noted that airline companies would not allow boarding in the absence of a valid entry visa.

For entry into Singapore, a valid Yellow Fever Certificate is required from travellers over one year of age who, within the preceding six days, have been in or have passed through any country with risk of yellow fever transmission.

There are four official languages in Singapore: Malay, Mandarin, Tamil and English. English is the language of business and administration, and is widely spoken and understood. Most Singaporeans are bilingual, and speak their mother tongue as well as English.

Singapore is warm and humid all year round, with only slight variations between the average maximum of 32 degrees Celsius and minimum of 24 degrees Celsius. throughout the year, with more consistent rain coming during the monsoon season from December to March. 12. Electricity

The electrical currents in Singapore are 220-240 volts, 50 Hertz. The power plugs used in Singapore are of the three-pin, square-shaped type and are shown below.





13. Currency



The currency in Singapore is the Singapore Dollar (SGD \$). The current exchange rate as at 6 February 2013 is US 1.00 = SGD 1.24 and (Euro) 1 = SGD 1.67.
