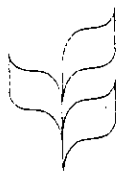




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**GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE CONVENTION ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN
ENDANGERED SPECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA (CITES)**

COP10 CITES OUTCOMES

Prepared for the participants of the third meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice. Montreal, Canada 1-5 September 1997

This summarized record of decisions made on the 75 proposals to the 10th Conference of the Parties to CITES is organized into seven sections- ❶ mammals, ❷ birds, ❸ reptiles, ❹ amphibians ❺ fish ❻ molluscs and ❼ plants. The entries within each section are listed in alphabetical order by common name of the species with proposal numbers in brackets, the scientific name for the species and a summary of the original proposal to the COP, the originator of the proposal and the decision made. Please note that the majority of decisions are made by consensus. In cases where decisions were made through voting, ballot figures are indicated in the "Outcome" column in the following order- for/against/abstain. A two thirds majority is required for proposals to be accepted by ballot. Only votes for or against are taken into consideration. Please note, these are only the decisions made on the 75 Proposals to COP10, covering 113-116 species. An update on the working document decisions will be available shortly.

* Modified proposal accepted by secret ballot with no commercial international trade in raw ivory permitted until 18 March 1999 then only provided that conditions are met within the set limits. Trade prior to 18 March 1999 may include specimens from these populations which: involve export of live animals to acceptable and appropriate destinations, export of hunting trophies for non-commercial purposes, export of hides (Zimbabwe only) export of leather goods and ivory carvings for non-commercial purposes.

** All other specimens shall be deemed to be specimens of species included in Appendix I and the trade in them shall be regulated accordingly.

*** the annotation is amended to indicate that the seeds of the Mexican cacti originating in Mexico are also subject to the provisions of the Convention.
