Indigenous Peoples and local communities: Observations and recommendations

14 December 2006

Observations

- Indigenous Peoples and local communities have experiences and skills in ecosystem management. But so far they have not been included as active stakeholders in the international negotiations.
- They do not have the skills and resources to follow the international processes.
- propose replace AA Principles are based on secondary information.
 Communities and indigenous peoples have not been included in the processes so far).
- Communities and indigenous peoples have not been adequately informd of the AA principles. Furtehr development of guidance in their application should inclve all key stakeholder groups including IP and LC
- International negotiations and the resulting documents are difficult to understand because of technical phrases and jargon.

Recommendations

- There is need to strengthen the capacity of indigenous peoples and local communities as indispensible partners in all efforts to conserve agrobiodiversity / ecosystems. This requires capacity building and training.
- Provide mechanisms for indigenous peoples and local communities to participate at all levels of the CBD and FAO processes as partners to the convention.

Recommendations

- Avoid top-down decision-making approaches that excludes indigenous peoples and local communities.
- Organize regional workshops to include the participation of indigenous peoples and NGOs to raise awareness and enhance the outreach to IP and local communities.
- International negotiations and the outcoming documents should use simple and understandable language and avoid use of technical phrases and jargon.

Recommendations

- The organizers of this workshop should ensure that the inputs from this group (indigenous peoples and local communities) are included in the recommendations and follow-up to this workshop.
- Need for a monitoring and evaluation process to ensure that the CBD and AA Principles are implemented. This process should include communities and indigenous peoples as stakeholders.

Recommendations ctd

 Funds should be created to give the IP and local communities the opportunities to organize workshops at local level and create platforms where they can discuss the CBD-related issues.
