5. General information on access to Brasilia, Brazil



Brasilia is serviced by the Brasilia International Airport – Presidente Juscelino Kubitschek (15 km from centre). Taxis are available at the airport. Please note that in Brasilia, taxi fares can only be paid in cash, credit cards are not accepted. The rate for the trip to the city centre is approximately R \$50 (Approx. US \$18).

6. Visa information



Participants from countries listed below <u>do not</u> require an entry visa for Brazil and participants from all other countries are strongly advised to contact the nearest Brazilian diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a

timely manner, prior to departure. Some airline companies will not allow boarding without a valid visa.

Participants requiring an entry visa to Brazil should attach, as appropriate, to their visa application forms the following:

- An official invitation letter from the CBD Secretariat;
- An international Health Certificate in respect of yellow fever, where applicable;
- One passport size photograph except for Diplomatic visas;
- Valid passport (with expiry date no less than six months).

7. Health information

For entry into Brazil, a yellow fever vaccination certificate is required from travellers from the following countries, unless they are in possession of a waiver stating that immunization is contraindicated on medical grounds: *Latin America*: Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru. Participants intending to travel outside of Brasilia, the recommendations for the prevention of yellow fever and malaria may be found at the World Health Organization's International Travel and Health web site (http://www.who.int/ith/countrylist02.html#27).

The currency in Brazil is the Real/Reais (R\$). The current exchange rate as at 27 May is US\$ 1 = R\$ 1.87 and \in 1 = R\$ 2.30.
