REVIEW OF PROGRESS IN PROVIDING SUPPORT TO PARTIES IN THE CONTEXT OF THE STRATEGIC PLAN FOR BIODIVERSITY 2011-2020 AND THE AICHI BIODIVERSITY TARGETS:

CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE JAPAN BIODIVERSITY FUND

Note by the Executive Secretary

INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 adopted by Parties at the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties in Nagoya, Japan in October 2010, is an ambitious plan developed with the purpose of inspiring broad-based action in support of biodiversity over the next decade by all countries and stakeholders. In recognition of the scale of the challenge facing Parties to fully implement the Strategic Plan, Japan as the incoming Presidency of the Conference of the Parties, announced the establishment of a Japan Biodiversity Fund specifically to support implementation of the Strategic Plan by developing countries.
- 2. This note provides an update on the progress made by the Executive Secretary through activities supported under the Japan Biodiversity Fund.
- 3. The Japan Biodiversity Fund (JBF) was established by the Government of Japan, the Presidency of the tenth Conference of the Parties (COP 10), to build capacity to support implementation of the Nagoya Biodiversity Outcomes in developing countries at a level of 1 billion Yen a year for up to five years. The Japan Biodiversity Fund is now fully operational, with a support staff of 6 project staff based at the Secretariat. These funds are intended to be catalytic and complementary to those by other donors, allowing the Secretariat to enhance its support to Parties for implementation of the Convention, to improve coherence among the various initiatives under the Convention, and to strengthen cooperation with partner organizations.

- 4. The objective of the JBF is to build capacity to support developing countries in implementing the Nagoya Compact, providing support to the Secretariat to assist Parties to:
- (a) Implement the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011 2020 and the associated Aichi Biodiversity Targets;
- (b) Revise their National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plans (NBSAPs) to include national targets, in accordance with the Strategic Plan; and
 - (c) Strengthen their overall capacity to implement the Convention.
- 5. The Japan Biodiversity Fund comprises two main categories of activities. One major element of the Fund is the support to countries to update and revise their NBSAPs through regional capacity-building workshops. This has enabled the Executive Secretary, in line with the request in paragraph 17 (a) of decision X/2, to organize regional and/or subregional workshops on updating and revising national biodiversity strategies and action plans, the mainstreaming of biodiversity, the enhancement of the clearing-house mechanism and the mobilization of resources in order to strengthen capacity for the implementation of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020.
- 6. In addition to the NBSAP workshops, the Japan Biodiversity Fund supports the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity to carry out activities for the implementation of the outcomes of the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties within existing programmes of work (PoWs) and other initiatives. II. REGIONAL AND SUBREGIONAL WORKSHOPS

- 9. The Secretariat delivered a total of 15 regional and subregional capacity-building workshops for updating and revising NBSAPs during the period 2011–2012. To date, the following workshops have been completed: Southern Africa (Kasane, Botswana, 14–20 March); Europe (Vilm, Germany, 15–19 April); North Africa and the Middle East (Beirut, Lebanon, 2-7 May); East, South & Southeast Asia (Xi'an, China, 9-16 May); West Africa (Dakar, Senegal, 22-26 May); Central Africa (Brazzaville, Congo, 19-23 June); East Africa (Kigali, Rwanda, 27-30 June 2011); Europe (PEBLDS) (Geneva, Switzerland, 30 June-1 July); South America (Quito, Ecuador, 13–16 July); Pacific (Nadi, Fiji, 3-7 October); Central Asia (Istanbul, Turkey 17-20 October); Caribbean (St George's, Grenada, 17-21 October); Meso-America (San Jose, Costa Rica, 28 Nov-2 Dec); Central and Eastern Europe (Minsk, Belarus, 5-8 Dec); Mediterranean (Montpellier, France 16-18 Jan 2012) (see Annex 1).
- 10. In total, almost 650 individuals and over 160 Parties have been represented at one or more workshops. Workshop presentations, materials and outputs, as well as summary reports, including summaries of participant evaluations are available at: http://www.cbd.int/nbsap/workshops2.shtml. Information provided during these workshops and subsequent follow-ups correspondence forms the basis of the update on status of NBSAPs revision provided in Para 6 of UNEP/CBD/WG-RI/4/2. A series of follow-up workshops and thematic workshops will also be convened during 2012. The first follow-up workshop for Asia was held in Dehradun, India from 6-9 December 2011, and the second, for all sub-Saharan African countries, was held in Addis Ababa, from 27 Feb-1 Mar 2012.

- 11. The workshops are based to some extent on the CBD training modules for developing, updating and implementing NBSAPs, which are in the process of being revised. CITES has provided input to the training modules during revision. Each module comprises a PowerPoint presentation, based on the presentations being made at the workshops, as well as a written module, of around 20 pages, that provides more information and links to further resources. Additional presentations and written material are also provided. These build on the existing set of training modules developed in 2007 and incorporate lessons taken from the fourth national reports and examples of good practice, tools and guidance identified during the first round of workshops in 2008 and 2009. - 12. Where possible, the workshops have been held concurrently, consecutively, or otherwise clustered with specialised capacity building workshops focused on specific aspects of the Strategic Plan and programmes of work as part of an effort to ensure that revised NBSAPs include all areas of the Convention's work and are effectively mainstreamed into other sectors. For example, the workshops for southern Africa and Pacific incorporated economics and valuation (Aichi Biodiversity Targets 2 and 3), whilst the workshops for West Africa and Pacific were organised in parallel and jointly with workshops on the programme of work for protected areas (PoWPA), thus addressing Aichi Biodiversity Target 11. Where this parallel process is not possible, specialized capacity building topics related to specific programmes of work under the Convention have been integrated into the NBSAP workshop programme itself, or have been supported under the Japan Biodiversity Fund (see below).
- 13. The regional capacity-building workshops were organized in partnership with relevant regional bodies, such as the regional offices of UNEP, UNDP, United Nations Regional Economic Commissions and the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and its regional commissions. In some cases, the workshops have been organized in collaboration with the other global biodiversity-related conventions, UNFCCC and UNCCD, and where such opportunities arise, will be held in conjunction with planned workshops on UNFCCC National Adaptation Programmes of Action (NAPAs) and UNCCD National Action Programmes (NAPs). The Secretariats of the Biodiversity Liaison Group (BLG) Conventions were represented at the following workshops Southern Africa (CITES); Europe (CMS); North Africa & Middle East (CITES); East, South & Southeast Asia (CMS, represented by UNEP ROAP). In addition, a good proportion of the nominated national participants were focal points for one or more of the biodiversity-related conventions. The GEF Secretariat, UNEP and UNDP, representing the "GEF Family" have been present at the majority of the workshops and have been able to provide updates and advice on access to Biodiversity Enabling Activity funds for revision of NBSAPs.

II. OTHER ACTIVITIES SUPORTED BY THE JAPAN BIODIEVRSITY FUND

14. The Japan Biodiversity Fund has also enabled the Secretariat to carry out additional activities in support of the implementation of the Nagoya Compact. The Japan Biodiversity Fund is being used as a catalyst to build the capacity of developing countries to implement several decisions adopted at the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties in conjunction with funding from other Parties and donors. Annex II contains a summary table of the 29 activities that have been supported in 2011. From the summary table it can be seen that Japan Biodiversity Fund activities have, in collaboration with other partners, facilitated the ability of the Secretariat to support Parties to contribute to not only the Aichi Biodiversity Target 17 (NBSAP) but also to develop their capacity to address all of other Targets, providing useful "proof of principle" first steps in implementation that other donors and Parties will be able to more easily follow.

- 15. A second tranche of 27 activities to be undertaken in 2012 was approved in the February 2012, after review and clearance by Government of Japan, and is just beginning implementation. A list of these projects is also provided in annex III.
- 15. The United Nations General Assembly at its 65th session declared the period 2011-2020 to be "the United Nations Decade on Biodiversity, with a view to contributing to the implementation of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity for the period 2011-2020" (Resolution 65/161). Thus the Strategic Plan has become the overarching framework for action to reduce the rate of loss of biodiversity by 2020. Successful implementation of the Strategic Plan thus requires that awareness of the Plan and the measures necessary to implement it must stretch far beyond the mainstream biodiversity community associated with the Convention.
- During 2011, the Japan Biodiversity Fund has supported a number of awareness-raising and promotional activities for both the Nagoya Compact and the UNDB. The Secretariat organized briefing sessions on the Nagoya Compact, including the Strategic Plan, the Protocols and other major decisions. These briefing sessions took advantage of the activities of other United Nations organizations, partner organizations, as well as other commemorative dates and events. The briefings targeted CBD focal points, permanent representatives to United Nations bodies, parliamentarians and other decision-makers in order to build political support for the actions needed to implement the Nagoya Compact. The Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity provided briefings to the Permanent Missions of the United Nations and its related institutions in New York, Bonn, Geneva and Nairobi. Annex IV contains a list of the main briefings conducted in 2011 by Secretariat staff.
- 17. In addition, the Secretariat of the Convention has organized global and regional launching events of UNDB. A global launch of the UNDB was planned for 22 May 2011 in Kanazawa, Japan, but due to the tragic events in that country, it was postponed until December 17. The Regional Launch for Asia took place in India on May 23; a regional launch for Africa was held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia on 22 July 2011, jointly with a regional observance of United Nations Decade for Deserts and the Fight against Desertification (UNDDD); and a regional launch for Latin America was held in Quito, Ecuador on 15th July 2011, to mark the beginning of the Decades for Desertification and for Biodiversity in Latin America.
- 18. The Secretariat has published three editions of the Aichi Targets Newsletter to promote exchange of experiences and promoting best practices on the revised NBSAPs processes, as well as providing information on activities financed by the Japan Biodiversity Fund. The first issue of the Aichi Targets Newsletter was released in June 2011 at the First Meeting of the Open-ended Ad Hoc Intergovernmental Committee for the Nagoya Protocol on ABS (ICNP-1) and the second issue was released in November 2011 at the Fifteenth meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA 15). The third issue will be released in May 2012 at the Ad-hoc open-ended Working Group on Review of Implementation of the Convention.
