



Lessons learnt mainstreaming

- Mainstreaming to External Stakeholders should start internally
 - Packaging ALL environmental related products to ensure comprehensive uptake of issues: Development of a Biodiversity Business case
- Requires consultation, Dialogue and Integration
- Multi-sectoral approach works: NBDA
 - Various methods, at varying intervals
 - EIA process
 - Environmental Education


Lessons learnt mainstreaming

• NBSAP Review

- Consult out of the norm stakeholders i.e.
 beyond env. Ministries or natural resources dept.
 - Look into livelihood options as key users of biodiversity (arable agriculture, fishing etc)
 - Promote feasible, acceptable and sustainable alternatives to livelihoods (based on the users guide, supported by traditional or local knowledge)
 - Tap into abundant materials and resources (solar)
 - Facilitate for an enabling policy environment for implementation
