NOTIFICATION

Madam/Sir,

Re: African regional meeting on the Biosafety Clearing-House and the clearing-house mechanism, 26-28 February 2001, Nairobi, Kenya

As you may be aware, Article 20 of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety to the Convention on Biological Diversity establishes a Biosafety Clearing-House (BCH) as part of the clearing-house mechanism under Article 18, paragraph 3, of the Convention, in order to facilitate the exchange of scientific, technical, environmental and legal information on, and experience with, living modified organisms; and to assist Parties to implement the Protocol.

At the first meeting of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (ICCP), the Executive Secretary was requested to analyse the identified capacity-building and financial requirements of the developing countries, in particular the least developed and small island developing states among them, and countries with economies in transition, as well as countries that are centres of origin and centres of genetic diversity, to enable their active participation in the pilot phase of the BCH. In support of this objective, a regional meeting will be convened for Africa from 26 to 28 February 2001, in Nairobi, Kenya, to provide countries of the region with an opportunity to express their needs and expectations with regard to the establishment of this pilot phase, keeping in mind the broader context of the clearing-house mechanism of the Convention.

The three-day regional meeting will be held at the United Nations Office in Nairobi, and will consider issues relevant to the operation of the Biosafety Clearing-House and the clearing-house mechanism in Africa. I would like to invite Parties and Governments to nominate one participant for this workshop, preferably qualified in one of the following fields: management of biosafety-related issues (such as notifications for decision-making); information-sharing systems and database-management; and/or experience with the clearing-house mechanism of the CBD. A provisional agenda is attached and the annotated agenda and background papers for the meeting will follow shortly by courier. Please note that the meeting will be held in English and French.

The Secretariat will support the participation of one representative of each African country Party to the Convention. This includes a round-trip air ticket on the most economical and direct route and a Daily Subsistence Allowance (DSA) for the duration of the meeting. Countries that wish to solicit such assistance are requested to provide the required information on the enclosed nomination form and forward it to the Secretariat before **Friday**, **2 February 2001**.
