Re: Meeting of Technical Experts on Handling, Transport, Packaging and Identification (Article 18 of the Biosafety Protocol) - 13 to 15 June 2001, Paris

I am pleased to convey herewith the composition of the experts for the meeting on handling, transport, packaging and identification (Article 18 of the Biosafety Protocol) to be convened pursuant to the recommendation of the first meeting of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Cartagena Protocol (ICCP). The meeting will take place in Paris, France, from 13 to 15 June 2001 following the generous offer made by France to host and Canada to co-host it.


The composition of the experts' meeting and the provisional agenda for the meeting are attached.
