## **NOTIFICATION**

Subject: Establishment of an ad hoc technical expert group on the review of the implementation of the programme of work on forest biological diversity

Dear Madam/Sir,

In paragraph 26 of decision VI/22, the Conference of the Parties agreed to establish an ad hoc technical expert group (AHTEG) to provide advice to the Executive Secretary and to the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) in the review of the implementation of the programme of work on forest biodiversity with the following tasks:

- (i) To provide advice on the way in which the review of the implementation of the programme of work would be undertaken;
- (ii) To provide technical input to the review of the implementation of the programme of work;
- (iii) To provide scientific and technical information on successes, challenges and obstacles to implementation of the programme of work;
- (iv) To provide information on the effects of the types of scientific and technical measures taken and tools used in implementing the programme of work.

To this end, the first meeting of the AHTEG will be held from 24 to 27 November 2003 in Montpellier, France, with the financial support of the Government of France.


