NOTIFICATION

Implementation and Effectiveness of the Global Taxonomy Initiative

Dear Madam/Sir,

Following the process, guidelines and mechanisms approved in recommendation X/12 of the tenth meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA), held in Bangkok last February, the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) is carrying out activities for the in-depth review of the Programme of Work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative (GTI). These activities will be reported at the eleventh meeting of SBSTTA, which will take place before the end of this year.

In order to assist Parties in providing updated information on the level of implementation and effectiveness of the GTI, the Secretariat prepared a questionnaire for a thematic report, addressing the 18 activities identified in the programme of work. This format was sent on 23 April 2004 to GTI and, where GTI focal points had not yet been designated, to CBD National Focal Points with a deadline extended to 31 August 2004. To date, only a total of 34 focal points have sent in their reports on GTI.

As updated information provided by Parties is crucial for a meaningful assessment of the status and effectiveness in implementation of the GTI, I would kindly request you to fill up the attached questionnaire format and send it back to the Secretariat (secretariat@biodiv.org), at your earliest convenience but no later than 25 April 2005. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the contribution of the 34 Parties to the Convention which should disregard the information requested in the present Notification.

Thank you for your cooperation and continued support of the work of the Convention.



Format for a Report on Implementation of Programme of Work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative

As part of its multi-year programme of work, the Conference of the Parties, in the annex to decision VII/31, decided that the programme of work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative will be one of the items for in-depth review at its eighth meeting. The Conference of the Parties, in paragraph 5 of decision VII/31, also agreed that the review of the programme of work would focus on:

- (i) Assessing the implementation and effectiveness of the programme of work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative;
- (ii) Updating the programme of work if necessary, by retiring or replacing activities and by making adjustments to reflect changes in the international context; and
- (iii) Providing practical support for national and regional implementation.

To this end, the Conference of the Parties, in paragraph 6 of decision VII/9, requested Parties to report on the status of implementation of the programme of work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative. The COP further invited national and international taxonomic institutions to contribute information on their relevant activities to the review of the Global Taxonomy Initiative.

The following format contains a series of questions based on 18 activities identified in the programme of work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative annexed to decision VI/8. Responses to these questions will help Contracting Parties to assess the status of implementation and effectiveness of the programme of work of the Global Taxonomy Initiative and related provisions of the Convention. They will also assist the Conference of the Parties in providing further guidance on ways and means to implement this programme of work and, more broadly, the objectives of the Convention.

To assist with the review of the status of the implementation of the programme of work for the GTI, in responding to the following questions contained in this format, Parties are requested to focus on, but not limited to:

- (a) progress of actions taken at various levels for the implementation of the programme of work;
- (b) impacts of actions taken at various levels for the implementation of the programme of work;
- (c) constraints or impediments encountered in the implementation of the programme of work;
- (d) contributions of relevant actions taken at various levels to the implementation of national biodiversity strategies and action plans, the implementation of thematic programmes of work and cross-cutting issues under the Convention, the achievement of the goals of the Strategic Plan of the Convention and the 2010 target; and
- (e) Lessons learnt.

While providing further comments as requested, Parties are also encouraged to provide information about the web pages, publications and any other sources of information where more relevant information can be retrieved for review and assessment.

In order to assist with the review and synthesis of the information in the reports, respondents are requested to ensure that information provided is as succinct as possible. There is no set limit in length, but it is anticipated that Parties will be able to provide adequate and useful information in a few pages.

The information provided by Contracting Parties will not be used to rank performance or to otherwise compare implementation between individual Contracting Parties.

Contracting Parties are requested to submit their report on the implementation of the programme of work for the Global Taxonomy Initiative, in this format, to the Executive Secretary by 30 June 2004. Parties are also requested to submit an original signed copy by post and an electronic copy (preferably in Word) by electronic mail.
