NOTIFICATION¹

Accès accéléré au financement du FEM pour la révision des stratégies et plans d'action nationaux pour la biodiversité et la soumission des cinquièmes rapports nationaux

Madame/Monsieur,

Il me fait grand plaisir d'attirer votre attention sur la communication adressée aux Points focaux opérationnels du FEM de la part de Mme Monique Barbut, Directrice générale et Présidente du Fonds pour l'environnement mondial (FEM), relative à l'accès élargi et accéléré au financement du FEM pour les activités habilitantes, notamment les stratégies et plans d'action nationaux pour la biodiversité, en réponse aux orientations de la dixième réunion de la Conférence des Parties.

Mme Barbut a souligné que le FEM a réservé jusqu'à 500 000\$ pour des activités habilitantes, par pays et par zone cible, excluant les allocations STAR. Les Parties peuvent choisir l'une des trois modalités d'accès aux ressources requises : (i) Accès direct par le Secrétariat du FEM ; (ii) par l'entremise d'une Agence FEM ou (iii) par les projets-cadre du PNUE en développement, dirigés spécifiquement vers les PMA et les PÉID.

Le Secrétariat de la Convention travaille de près avec le Secrétariat du Fonds pour l'environnement mondial afin de participer aux efforts d'actualisation et de révision des stratégies et plans d'action pour la biodiversité ainsi que pour la préparation des rapports nationaux. L'intervention du FEM au niveau national sera complémentée par le soutien continu aux niveaux régional et infrarégional pour les révisions des SPANB financé par le Fonds japonais pour la biodiversité.

Dear Colleagues,

I am writing to inform you of the GEF Secretariat's plans to assist GEF-eligible Parties meet their reporting obligations under the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

The many enabling activities, such as national communications under the UNFCCC as well as National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plans and biosafety reports under the CBD, remain a top GEF priority. Therefore I want to emphasize that the GEF will continue to provide the resources for these activities, with the GEF-5 provision that has reserved up to \$500,000, per country and per focal area, outside of the STAR allocations.

Given our considerable experience with these activities, we now have put in place a number of ways for you to access resources for projects: this includes National Communications under the UNFCCC, and all of the biodiversity enabling activities under the CBD.

The first way is through direct access. As a result of the reforms which I have put in place countries can now access the GEF directly---without going through an agency--- for enabling activities. If you wish to use the direct access modality, please contact the GEF secretariat directly.

The second way is directly through a regular GEF agency. You can contact your preferred GEF agency directly, and they will work with you to develop the relevant project proposal and documentation for submission to the GEF Secretariat for approval. If, for any reason, you encounter difficulties in accessing a proper agency for these activities, I would like to hear from you immediately.

Third, there are currently two special UNEP Umbrella programs under development, one for climate change national communications, and the other for National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plans (biodiversity national reports), directed specifically for LDCs and SIDs. If you wish to participate in these programs, you will need to send an endorsement letter directly to UNEP.


In summary, you can choose either one of these three modalities to access the resources you require: (i) Direct Access with the GEF Secretariat, (ii) Through a GEF Agency or (iii) Through the UNEP Umbrella projects under development.

Given the urgency of the deadline for the Second National Report on biosafety (September 30, 2011), the GEF Secretariat has been working with UNEP and the CBD Secretariat to finalize three umbrella MSPs that will expedite disbursement of the small grants, so that you can prepare the reports and submit them to the CBD Secretariat. We expect to finalize the approval of these MSPs very shortly. An announcement will be made in the GEF website, and another letter will be sent to GEF operational focal points and CBD focal points announcing the project.

We continue to be committed to working closely with you to provide as many options as possible to ensure the timely and effective disbursement of resources to allow the completion of these relevant activities. For GEF-5, we would like to emphasize an agenda that is country-driven and this is another reason why we have offered these various options to you.
