NOTIFICATION

Proposed voluntary budget for the period 2017-2020 for the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and the Nagoya Protocol on Access and Benefit-sharing of Genetic Resources

Dear Madam/Sir,

At its first meeting held in Montreal, Canada on 2-6 May 2016, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation (SBI), in its Recommendation 1/13, paragraph 5(b):

"Calls upon Parties in a position to do so and on a voluntary basis:

To prepare for the thirteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties and the concurrent meetings of the Parties to the Cartagena and Nagoya Protocols on the basis of information to be provided in advance by the Secretariat, with a view to making, during those meetings, pledges of financial support for voluntary activities envisaged in the draft decisions of the meetings, in order to assist the Secretariat in planning more effectively and utilizing the resources more efficiently."

The Secretariat, taking into account the integrated approach to its work programmes as a result of the Functional Review, advance planning as a major output of the process and in keeping with the above SBI recommendation, has prepared the attached proposed voluntary budget for activities covering the period 2017-2020, as formulated from the mandates provided by the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and the Nagoya Protocol on Access and Benefit-sharing of Genetic Resources. It is hoped that the attached information will facilitate the in-flow of predictable funding for more efficient use of resources.

The cost estimates provided in the attached note covers ongoing activities derived from previous COP and COP-MOP decisions, as well as the recommendations from the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation and the Ad hoc Open-ended Working Group on Article 8(j) and related provisions.

Finally, given the current capacity of the Secretariat, the activities are expected to be spread over the two biennia leading to the year 2020 which coincides with that of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020.
