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NOTIFICATION

Follow up to decisions of the second meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization: overview of requests for action and planned activities for the next biennium

Madam/Sir,

The purpose of this notification is to bring to your attention the decisions adopted at the second meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol (COP-MOP 2) and the thirteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP 13) that request action by Parties, other Governments, international organizations, indigenous peoples and local communities and relevant stakeholders in relation to the Nagoya Protocol, as well as to provide information on planned activities for the biennium 2017-2018 in light of the decisions adopted at COP-MOP 2.

Actions to be undertaken by Parties to the Nagoya Protocol and other Governments

A number of decisions adopted at COP-MOP 2, as well as related COP 13 decisions call for action by Parties and non-Parties to the Nagoya Protocol, as well as international organisations, indigenous peoples and local communities and relevant stakeholders. A list of these requests and decisions is included in the annex for your consideration.

The Secretariat will follow-up in due course to invite submissions, as appropriate, in preparation for intersessional activities.

Inter-sessional activities for the biennium 2017-2018

The following intersessional activities in support of the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol will take place in line with the decisions by COP-MOP 2 and COP 13.

- A meeting of the Informal Advisory Committee to the ABS Clearing-House (tentatively last quarter of 2017) as well as online discussions;
- A meeting of the Compliance Committee (tentatively second quarter of 2018);
- A meeting of the Informal Advisory Committee on Capacity-building for the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol (tentatively last quarter of 2017) as well as online consultations as needed;

To: ABS National Focal Points and CBD National Focal Points (where ABS focal points have not yet been designated), international organisations, indigenous peoples and local communities and relevant stakeholders









- A meeting of the Ad Hoc Technical Expert Group on Digital Sequence Information on Genetic Resources (tentatively first quarter of 2018);
- The Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice at its 22nd meeting (tentatively third quarter of 2018) will consider the outcomes of the Ad Hoc Technical Expert Group on Digital Sequence Information on Genetic Resources;
- The second meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation (tentatively third quarter of 2018) will consider the following issues related to the Nagoya Protocol:
 - The need for and modalities of a global multilateral benefit-sharing mechanism;
 - Criteria that could be used to identify what constitutes a specialized international access and benefit-sharing instrument, and what could be a possible process for recognizing such an instrument, in the context of Article 4, paragraph 4, of the Protocol; and
 - The analysis and synthesis of relevant information as the basis for the first assessment and review of the effectiveness of the Protocol, as well as the draft framework of indicators as a basis for measuring progress in achieving the objective of the Protocol.

Further details on these activities will be provided in due course.

COP XIII/32 as governmental, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations and others, including the private sector, to contribute to the Voluntary Trust Funds of the Convention and its Protocols;
