Invitation to Submit Experiences and Lessons from Relevant Initiatives and Views Regarding the Long-Term Strategic Framework for Capacity-Building Beyond 2020

The Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity requested the Executive Secretary to initiate a process for preparing a long-term strategic framework for capacity-building beyond 2020, aligned with the follow-up to the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 and the work of the Protocols, with a view to ensuring the timely identification of the priority capacity-building actions (decision XIII/23).
