National Red Listing and its links to the post-2020 global biodiversity framework

Invitation to a webinar organized by the International Union for Conservation of Nature

Dear Madam/Sir,

I am pleased to inform Parties and observers that the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), in partnership with the Secretariat, will host a webinar on the theme of "National Red Listing and its links to the post-2020 global biodiversity framework", on 1 June 2022, at 9:00 a.m. EDT. This event is part of the series of "Reverse the Red" webinars being presented by IUCN's National Red List Working Group.

The webinar will provide an opportunity for an introductory discussion on the importance of the Red List as a tool within the monitoring framework for the post-2020 global biodiversity framework, which is expected to be adopted at the second part of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties. Discussion topics will include how National Red Lists can be used to produce species assessments to inform conservation policy, assist in developing national biodiversity strategies and action plans and monitor progress towards national biodiversity targets. These features will be of relevance to many aspects of the proposed post-2020 global biodiversity framework and, in particular, to those related to preventing extinctions and conserving species. This webinar will be followed up with technical sessions and training opportunities for Parties and observers.
