Representatives of indigenous peoples and local communities selected to receive funding for their participation in the Fifth meeting of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework, Part Two of the Fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties and concurrent meetings of the Parties to the Cartagena and Nagoya Protocols

Dear Madam/Sir,

In connection with the Fifth meeting of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework (WG2020-5), as well as Part Two of the Fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP 15.2) to the Convention on Biological Diversity and concurrent meetings of the Tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (CP-MOP 10), and the Fourth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization (NP-MOP 4), to take place on 3-5 December and 7-19 December 2022, respectively, in Montreal, Canada, I am pleased to inform Parties and observers that, after due consideration of all nominations received by the Advisory Selection Committee, and in consultation with the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention, the selection of representatives of indigenous peoples and local communities (IPLCs) who will receive financial support for their participation in the above-mentioned meetings, has been completed.

The selection was carried out in accordance with the criteria for the operation of the Voluntary Funding Mechanism to facilitate the participation of IPLCs in the work of the Convention as set out in COP decision VIII/5 section D, and in accordance with the selection criteria established in section B of the annex to the same decision.

Please refer to the annex for the list of beneficiaries of financial support. The selected beneficiaries will be contacted directly by the Secretariat with regard to their funding arrangements. Knowing the significance of these meetings for IPLCs, and that their adequate participation is critical to the success of the meetings, the Secretariat continues to liaise with potential donors in order to secure additional resources. In the event of additional resources being made available, the Secretariat will add more participants to the list.
