Composition of the Informal Advisory Committee to the Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House

Dear Sir or Madam.

As you may be aware, an informal advisory committee was established by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol (COP-MOP), in <u>decision NP-1/2</u>, paragraph 2, to assist the Executive Secretary with the implementation of the Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House (ABS Clearing-House) and to provide technical guidance with respect to the resolution of technical and practical issues arising from the ongoing development of the ABS Clearing-House. The decision provides that the informal advisory committee (IAC) shall be composed of 15 experts, primarily from Parties, on the basis of nominations provided by Parties.

In this regard, I am pleased to convey, in the annex to this notification, the composition of the ABS Clearing-House IAC, which was determined by the Secretariat taking into account the members' experience with the ABS Clearing-House while ensuring regional and gender balance.

The Informal Advisory Committee has plans to hold three online sessions over the 2025-2026 intersessional period. Invitations and details of the online sessions will be shared with selected members in due time.
