Composition of the Ad Hoc Technical Expert Group on Synthetic Biology

Dear Sir or Madam,

Further to notification [2025-143](#) issued on 14 November 2025, nominations were received with a view to constituting the membership in the ad hoc technical expert group on synthetic biology (AHTEG) established by the Conference of the Parties, in its decision [16/21](#).

The AHTEG is tasked with (i) reviewing and synthesizing the information presented during the intersessional period; (ii) identifying the current and potential benefits of synthetic biology; (iii) identifying the potential positive impacts of the most recent technological developments in synthetic biology; (iv) identifying the potential negative impacts of the most recent technological developments in synthetic biology; and (v) providing advice on how capacity-building and development, access to and transfer of technology and knowledge-sharing in synthetic biology can be taken into account with respect to the draft thematic action plan, in light of future developments of synthetic biology. The AHTEG shall also prepare a report for consideration by the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice at its twenty-eighth meeting.

The selection of members has now been concluded in consultation with the Bureau of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice, taking into account their specific scientific and technical expertise relevant to the mandate of the AHTEG, as well as gender balance and equitable geographical representation, and following the procedure for avoiding or managing conflicts of interest as set out in the annex to decision [14/33](#) and as amended by decision [16/26](#). To the extent possible and in line with decision [16/21](#) establishing a new AHTEG, experts were selected from Parties and observers that did not previously participate in the multidisciplinary Ad Hoc Technical Expert Group, taking into account the nominations received and the suitability of candidates.

I am, therefore, pleased to announce the composition of the new AHTEG attached herewith.

A meeting of the AHTEG will be convened from 19 to 22 May 2026 in Montreal, Canada. With the generous financial support of the European Union, select representatives from indigenous peoples and local communities, women organizations and youth organizations, and experts from eligible Parties, will receive financial assistance to cover the cost of travel and a daily subsistence allowance.

Further information and documents for the meeting will be made available in due course.
