WHAT THE INTERNATIONAL DIALOGUE FORUM WANTS TO ACHIEVE:

February 8th will be 100 days before the 9th UN Conference on the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), starting on May 19th in Bonn. Therefore the German NGO Forum on Environment & Development and German League for Nature Conservation convene a dialogue forum to inform the public about important COP 9 matters, major obstacles and progress that needs to be achieved at COP 9 in Bonn.



The dialogue forum will focus on three important strategic goals:

- How can a legally binding regime on Access and Benefit Sharing be achieved by 2010 and what are the key elements?
- 2. How must a global network of terrestrial protected areas by 2010 and marine protected areas by 2012 get into force and how can it be financed?
- 3. What are the impacts of the production of bioenergy/ biofuels on forests, agricultural biodiversity, indigenous people and local communities? What are the consequences in the framework of the CBD?

Representatives of international and German NGOs will meet officials of CBD and delegations to discuss these questions. This intends to be a contribution to pushing forward the negotiations.


