The Icelandic Development Agency ICEIDA has for a number of years cooperated with Malawi, Namibia, Mozambique, and Uganda in a bilateral Cupertino with those countries for developing the fisheries sector in those countries. The focus has been on the development of fisheries research for management of sustainable fishery and collecting of biological data on fish species and information on allowable catch.

13.b og 13.c Iceland is an active member of the CAFF-agreement, Conservation of Arctic Flora and Fauna, and its various programmes conserning the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity, e.g. the murre conservation plan, the eider conservation plan, the biological diversity monitoring programme and the Circumpolar Protected ares network.

Further comments on implementation of this Article

Recent provisions of the Nature Conservation Act and the establishment of a Specialist Committee on Alien Species establish the necessary legal tools and framework to regulate import, cultivation and distribution of alien species. A new regulation is in place for addressing the issue of introduction, cultivation and distribution of Alien Plants in addition to older regulations to address the issue sanitary of plant and animal.

The Ministry for the Environment and the Ministry of Agriculture are responsible for import permissions.

Sustainable use has been given high priority in Iceland, especially use of marine resources as the economy is highly dependent on marine living resources.

Sustainable use of other living resources, such as birds and plants, has recently been given more attention. New provisions in the Nature Conservation Act allows for restrictions on harvesting of wild plants if the use is unsustainable or poses a threat to species. Resources are limiting especially for monitoring and actions to control use.

The Wildlife Act requires all hunters to register their annual catch and renew their hunting licens. Since 1995 all hunting has been registered species by species for management reasons to keep the hunting sustainable. There are also comprehensive measures to ensure the conservation and sustainable use of freshwater fishes such as the Salmon and the Arctic char.
