Following in the footsteps of successful expeditions to Baffin Island and the Sahara Desert, four youth ambassadors will be joining an i2P expedition team as it treks through the Amazon Basin in October 2010. Using internet and satellite technology the i2P team will communicate live from the Amazon to thousands of participating students around the world. Students and teachers will once more have the opportunity to post questions to expedition members both through live videoconferences from the field and through e-mail. Complementing this live communication will be a rich i2P education resource complete with education modules, blogs, topical questions, class exercises and links.

Expedition Curriculum

2010 has been declared the International Year of Biodiversity. In order to highlight the year, i2P has designed an expedition to focus on the importance of the many millions of distinct life forms found on Earth today. Biodiversity considered a measure of the health of an ecosystem, and by extension, of life on Earth. In the form of education modules,

interactive website activities, communication from the expedition team and the new expedition research program i2P will focus on biodiversity as it passes through the rich world of the Amazon Basin.
