Proposed objectives (1)



Review the implementation of the Plan of Action, taking stock of the main programmes that have emerged as a result of, or in support of, the Plan of Action including ICLEI's Local Action for Biodiversity and Cities in Biodiversity Hotspots Programmes, and the Singapore Index on Cities' Biodiversity



 Review the implementation of strategies, by local government, sub-national government and others, in response to the Plan of Action



 Express intent and consensus on positions among political leaders at the local and sub-national levels in a declaration characterizing the Summit and advancing the Aichi/Nagoya Declaration on Local Authorities and Biodiversity

Proposed objectives (2)



 Contribute to COP 11 through a show of local and sub-national level support for Parties' implementation of the CBD including a possible speaking opportunity for local and regional government at its high level segment



 Contribute to COP 11 through support for any COP decisions that may complement and build on existing COP decisions on cities and sub-national governments for biodiversity



- Launch important initiatives such as the Cities and Biodiversity
 Outlook publication and Cities in Biodiversity Hotspots Programme
- Provide a platform for the exchange of global local government expertise and experiences

Potential Roles of Key Partners (1)



Government of India (including host State & City):

- Provide an appropriate venue for the event
- Enable the participation of high-level speakers and national experts at the event
- XI Conference of Parties CONVENTION ON BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY HYDERABAD INDIA 2012
- Facilitate a speaking opportunity for local and sub-national government representatives at the high-level segment
- Appoint a nodal person at the local level to facilitate coordination with the government as soon as possible (and explore the benefits of a Summit Committee)



- Provide local logistical support to delegates (venue, local travel)
- Overall support and facilitation of the Summit
- Approach potential donors to raise funds for the event

Potential Roles of Key Partners (3)



Secretariat of the CBD:

- Staff will advise and support he development of the program
- Staff will actively pursue funding for the event in partnership with the hosts
- Staff will work with the hosts to secure a suitable venue
- Some funding will be provided to cover developing world delegates' flights and accommodation
- Support a speaking opportunity for local and sub-national government representatives at the high-level segment
- Facilitate the participation of high-level speakers including the Executive Secretary of the CBD and leading figures of other UN agencies
- Share the responsibility with the hosts for financing the event





Potential Roles of Key Partners (2)



- ICLEI Local Governments for Sustainability (on provision that necessary resources secured for below):
 - ICLEI's international Cities Biodiversity Center and regional South Asia Secretariat (ICLEI) will partner to offer the human resources required to organize the summit



 ICLEI, with inputs from global biodiversity experts will compile the conference program and coordinate input by various partners (approved by GoI)



- ICLEI will handle logistics including the invitation, travel, accommodation, registration and attendance of delegates
- ICLEI will choreograph the Summit proceedings and outputs
- ICLEI will endeavour to support fund-raising efforts of CBD and Gol for the Summit

Potential Roles of Key Partners (4)



• Endorsing Partners:

 Host preparatory meetings towards the build up to the Summit at COP11 (Montpellier, Bonn, Nagoya)



- Provide suggestions and inputs towards the program, contents and declaration of the Summit
- Facilitate the attendance of their organization/agency/ city
 etc. through the most appropriate representative



Raise awareness of the Summit among their members/stakeholders
