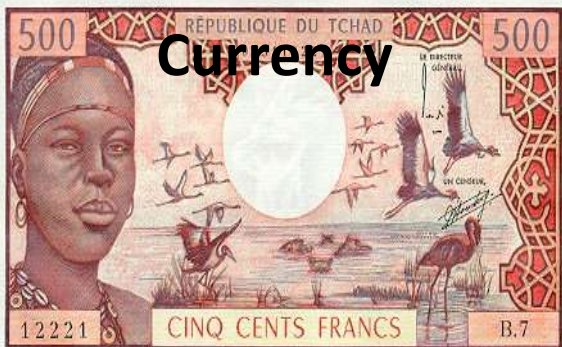

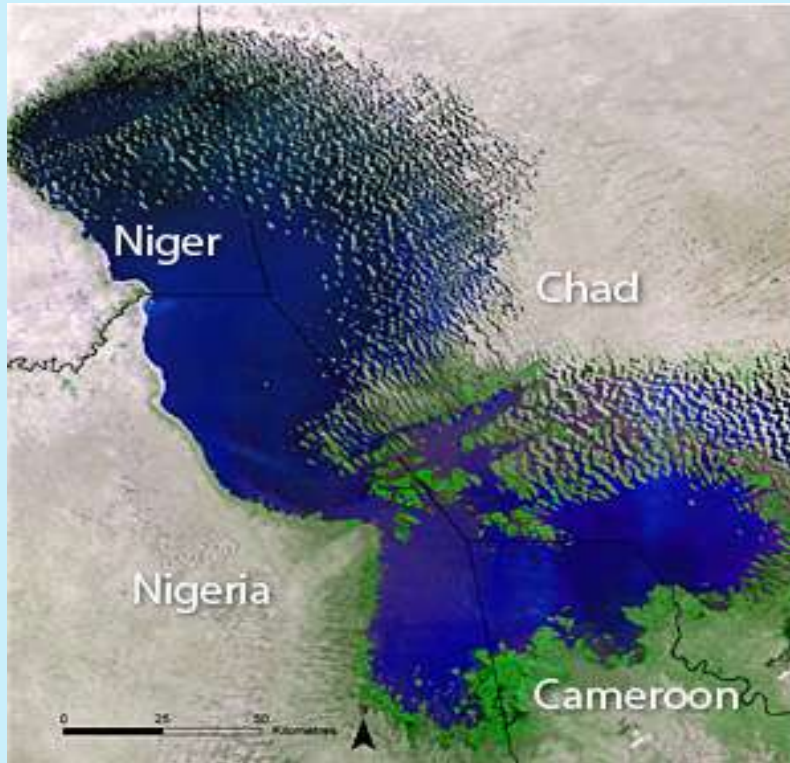
Extent of Protected Areas

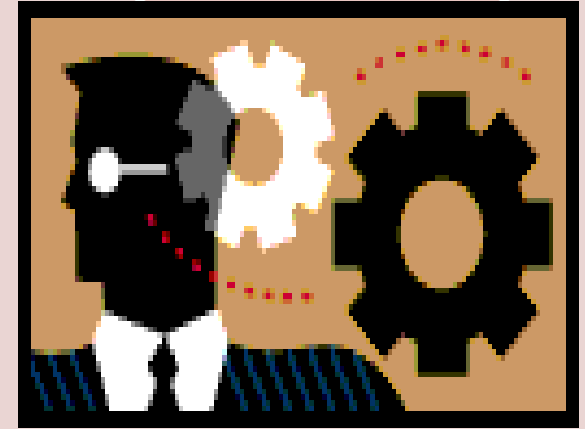
