Carbon emissions and urban heat islands (UHI) represent one of the main challenges for cities.


To reduce these, solution were seen in the support of urban ecosystems services as achieved by green areas and urban trees





Programme for Senior Citizens: workshop for leaders able to "cascade" the Programme further in the local communities




Programme for Seniors is based around the handbook: Biological diversity —that's us as well


These handbook is devided into two parts::

- Part adressed to grantparents


FOR GRANDPARENTS:

- It can assist with the collection of valuable data
- Participation by the general public in scientific research can help raise awareness and foster local engagement in decision making

For Senior Citizen:

The programe offer numerous workshops promoting a healthy lifestyle and sustainable consumption



The programme for Senior Citizens has several tens of lectures given at UTWs around the country along with workshops promoting sustainability



Seniors are acting as guardians of traditional knowledge of rural biodiversity, agriculture methods and ethnobotany

The active involvement of civil society will be encouraged at all levels of implementation. Citizen science initiatives for instance are valuable means of gathering high-quality data.

Flash Eurobarometer survey "Attitudes towards biodiversity"

- A minority of EU citizens felt inform on biodiversity
- 70% of EU citizens said that they personally made same efforts to protect biodiversity and they would be willing to do even more.
- 28% answered that they were not making any attempts to protect biodiversity because they did not know what to do to stop biodiversity loss
- 25% of respondents indicated that EU should focus on providing citizens with better information about the importance of biodiversity
