5. Precautionary Sanitary Measures

While COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted in Canada, as per January 2023 guidelines - the WHO continues to recommend the use of masks by the public in specific situations, irrespective of the local epidemiological situation, given the current spread of the COVID-19 globally. Masks are recommended following a recent exposure to COVID-19, when someone has or suspects they have COVID-19, when someone is at high-risk of severe COVID-19, and for anyone in a crowded,

enclosed, or poorly ventilated space. Participants are requested to bring their own masks. Hand sanitizer will be made available at the entrance of the meeting room.

7. Visa information



Participants from countries listed in the **annex** below require a visa which requires biometrics (photo and fingerprints) for entry into Canada and are strongly advised to contact the nearest Canadian diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. **Please note that airline companies will not allow boarding in the absence of a valid visa.**

Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) from visa exempt countries

Travelers from visa-exempt countries must obtain an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to fly to or transit through Canada. If you have a valid eTA, you will not be required to provide biometrics. Travelers are required to have an eTA before they can board a flight to Canada. Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travelers with a valid Canadian visa. Canadian citizens, including dual citizens, and Canadian permanent residents cannot apply for an eTA.

Applying for the eTA is an online process which takes only a few minutes to complete. The eTA will be valid for 5 years or upon expiry of your passport. There is a fee of CAN \$7.00 for the electronic travel authorization (eTA).

Countries requiring Visa and Biometrics

On-line visa application:

Anyone can apply online for a visa to enter Canada. However, <u>you are required to provide biometrics</u> and still need to present yourself at a <u>Visa Application Centre</u> to provide this information. An application will not go forward without the biometric information. The CIC will send you a biometric instruction letter by email through your MyCIC account when they receive your application. Read and print this letter and bring it, along with your passport or other travel document, to a <u>visa application centre (VAC)</u> to give your biometrics. <u>Find your closest VAC</u>.

<u>Important:</u> Please continuously check your MyCIC visa application account for any incoming e-mails, queries, requests for more information, and responses from the visa office.

Please submit your visa application as early as possible to allow sufficient time to process your request. You can verify approximate visa processing times for your country at the following link: https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/application/check-processing-times.html

To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Secretariat will issue, upon request, invitation letters to be attached to the visa applications.

8. Health information

As of 5 January 2023, all air travelers, 2 years of age and older, arriving from the People's Republic of China must show a negative COVID-19 test result, taken no more than 2 days before their departure, to the airline in order to board their flight. For all other travelers, proof of COVID-19 vaccinations, pre-boarding testing, and using the ArriveCAN App are not required. However, using the ArriveCAN App may save time at the border/customs and carrying proof of vaccination is recommended in case of need.

The relevant portion of DSA will be disbursed to funded participants on the first day of the meeting in the form of a prepaid credit card (Swiss Bankers card). It is advisable that participants have some cash at hand to cover expenses that may occur between their arrival and the moment at which they are provided with the prepaid credit card from which they will access their DSA. Please note that the funds can take up to 24 hours to be loaded on the cards.

The standard time zone for Montreal is EDT (Eastern Daylight Time) which is GMT/UTC -4 hours.

The electrical currents are 120 Volts, 60 Hertz and plugs are as shown below.



14. Currency S

The currency in Canada is the Canadian Dollar (CAD \$). The current exchange rate as of 24 May 2023 is USD \$1 = CAD \$1.36 and €1 = CAD \$1.46 (source: www.xe.com, rates are subject to change).

Currency exchange facilities are readily available in banks and hotels.
