Introduction

1. Following the invitation of the Government of Colombia, the fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from Their Utilization will be held in Cali, Colombia, from 21 October to 1 November 2024, concurrently with the sixteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety. A high-level opening ceremony will be held on 20 October.
2. The meetings will be preceded by the fifth meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, to be held from 16 to 18 October.
3. Preparatory meetings of regional groups may also be held on 20 October.
4. The Secretariat will prepare a compilation of the draft decisions proposed by the subsidiary bodies or developed in the light of earlier decisions and recommendations.¹

Item 1

Opening of the meeting

5. The opening of the meeting will take place at 10 a.m. on 21 October, jointly with the opening of the sixteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol.
6. The meeting will be opened by the President of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties or his representative. At the opening session, participants will hear a welcoming address by representatives of the presidency and of the host country.

7. The Executive Secretary will address the participants and highlight the main issues before the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meetings of the Parties to the Protocols.
8. Representatives of regional groups, indigenous peoples and local communities, as well as a limited number of other groups, may also make statements.

Item 2

Organizational matters

Election of the President

9. At the opening session, the President of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties, the Minister of Ecology and Environment of China, Huang Runqiu, or his representative will call for the election of a representative of the host country as President of the sixteenth meeting. The term of office of the President of the sixteenth meeting will begin immediately following the election and end with the election of a successor at the seventeenth meeting.
10. As Colombia is not a Party to the Nagoya Protocol, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol will elect a chair to preside its meetings.

Election of substitute officers

11. The Bureau of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention also serves as the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol. In accordance with Article 26, paragraph 3, of the Protocol, any member of the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties representing a Party to the Convention that is not a Party to the Protocol is to be substituted by a member to be elected by and from among the Parties to the Protocol.
12. At its fifteenth meeting, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention elected 10 members of the Bureau for a term of office commencing upon the closure of the fifteenth meeting and ending at the closure of the sixteenth meeting. Subsequently, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol elected substitute Bureau members for those regions where the Bureau member was representing a Party to the Convention that was not a Party to the Protocol. Thus, the Bureau for the fifth meeting of the Parties to the Protocol comprises the following:

13. At its sixteenth meeting, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention will elect Bureau members whose terms of office will commence upon the closure of the meeting in accordance with rule 21 of the rules of procedure. In the event that one or more Bureau members are elected from Parties to the Convention that are not Parties to the Nagoya Protocol, substitute members will be elected by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol.

Adoption of the agenda and organization of work

14. Pursuant to rules 8 and 9 of the rules of procedure and in consultation with the Bureau, the Secretariat has prepared a provisional agenda for consideration by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol. The provisional agenda reflects issues arising from previous decisions of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol.

15. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to adopt the agenda of the present meeting on the basis of the provisional agenda.

16. In paragraph 1 of decision [NP-1/12](#), and as also reflected in paragraph 3 of decision XII/27 and paragraph 1 of decision BS-VII/9, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol decided to hold its ordinary meetings concurrently with the meetings of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the meetings of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol within a two-week period.

17. Accordingly, the proposed organization of work of the sixteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties, the eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol and the fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol is set out in a document common to all three meetings.³ The document also includes a division of responsibilities between the plenary and the two working groups. The organization of work has been prepared taking into account the experience gained since 2016 with the concurrent convening of the meetings of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meetings of the Parties to the Protocols. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider and adopt the proposed organization of work.

18. A list of documents for the meeting is provided in the annex.

Item 3**Report on the credentials of representatives to the fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol**

19. Rule 18 of the rules of procedure states that:

The credentials of representatives and the names of alternate representatives and advisers shall be submitted to the Executive Secretary of the Conference of the Parties or the representative of the Executive Secretary if possible not later than 24 hours after the opening of the meeting. Any later change in the composition of the delegation shall also be submitted to the Executive Secretary or the representative of the Executive Secretary. The credentials shall be issued by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization.

20. Rule 19 provides that the Bureau of any meeting is to examine the credentials and submit its report to the Conference of the Parties for decision. The rules of procedure apply *mutatis mutandis* to the meetings of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol.

21. In order to assist Parties in fulfilling the requirements under rule 18, the Acting Executive Secretary issued a notification⁴ that included information on requirements for credentials and a link to sample formats for appropriate credentials. Following previous practice, representatives of Parties to the Convention that are also Parties to the Cartagena Protocol and the Nagoya Protocol may submit a single set of credentials for the sixteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention, the eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the

Cartagena Protocol and the fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol.

22. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider and adopt the report on credentials submitted to it by the Bureau.

Item 4

Reports of subsidiary bodies

23. Paragraph 1 of Article 27 of the Nagoya Protocol provides that any subsidiary body established by or under the Convention may serve the Protocol, including upon a decision of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol. Any such decision shall specify the tasks to be undertaken.

24. The President will inform the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol of the results of the meetings of the subsidiary bodies held during the intersessional period and of the corresponding reports, on the understanding that the substantive issues arising therefrom will be considered under the appropriate agenda item. The reports include the following:

- (a) Reports of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation on its fourth and fifth meetings;⁵
- (b) Reports of the Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on Benefit-sharing from the Use of Digital Sequence Information on Genetic Resources on its first and second meetings.⁶

Item 5

Report of the Compliance Committee

25. The Compliance Committee under the Nagoya Protocol is required to report and submit its recommendations to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol.

26. The Compliance Committee held its fourth meeting in Montreal, Canada, from 25 to 27 March 2024. The report of its meeting has been made available as document CBD/NP/MOP/5/3.

27. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider the report and recommendations of the Committee and to take appropriate action. It is expected that the recommendations of the Committee will be considered under the agenda item to which they most closely pertain. The recommendations have also been included under the appropriate agenda items in the compilation of draft decisions.

28. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will also be invited to elect members to the Compliance Committee and observers from indigenous peoples and local communities. In addition, it will be encouraged to elect one alternate member per region, as well as an alternate observer from indigenous peoples and local communities further to section B, paragraph 3, of the cooperative procedures and institutional mechanisms to promote compliance with the provisions of the Protocol and to address cases of non-compliance.⁷ A notification providing further information on the matter will be issued before the present meeting.

Item 6

Administration of the Protocol and budget for the trust funds

29. The Conference of the Parties to the Convention, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol and the Conference of the Parties serving as the

meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol, at their fifteenth, tenth and fourth meetings, respectively, adopted an integrated budget for the 2023–2024 biennium and requested that the Executive Secretary prepare proposals for an integrated budget for the 2025–2026 biennium.

30. Accordingly, and further to decisions 15/34 and NP-4/12, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will have before it notes by the Secretariat on: (a) the administration of the Convention and its Protocols, including the respective trust funds;⁸ and (b) the proposed budget for the programme of work of the Convention and its Protocols for the biennium 2025–2026, including each of the trust funds.⁹ Further information on the requirements for the trust fund for additional voluntary contributions in support of approved activities, including a summary of the financial implications of draft decisions, and a report on the functional review of the Secretariat will also be available.¹⁰

31. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to adopt an integrated budget, including the budget for the trust fund for the Protocol, on the basis of the proposals from the Secretariat. Elements of a draft decision are included in the compilation of draft decisions.

Item 7

Financial mechanism and resources

32. In its decision [15/15](#), the Conference of the Parties to the Convention requested the Subsidiary Body on Implementation to prepare proposals for a draft four-year outcome-oriented framework of programme priorities for the implementation of the Convention and its Protocols aligned with the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, in anticipation of the ninth replenishment of the Global Environment Facility (GEF) Trust Fund (2026–2030) for consideration by the Conference of the Parties at its sixteenth meeting. In the same decision, the Conference of the Parties also adopted terms of reference for a full assessment of the funds needed for the implementation of the Convention and its Protocols for the ninth replenishment period and terms of reference for the sixth review of the effectiveness of the financial mechanism.

33. In its decision [NP-4/8 A](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol invited Parties to the Protocol to participate actively in the aforementioned review. In the same decision, the Executive Secretary was requested, subject to the availability of resources, in the context of the review, to collect views and information from eligible Parties on their experiences and lessons learned in accessing and utilizing funds from the financial mechanism for the implementation of the Protocol, including information on challenges and underlying reasons, to access and utilize GEF funds and on possible barriers to regional collaboration.

34. In its decision [15/7](#), the Conference of the Parties to the Convention adopted a strategy for resource mobilization for the Kunming-Montreal Biodiversity Framework. In the same decision, it requested GEF to establish a special trust fund to support the implementation of the Framework, decided to assess progress with regard to the Fund at its future meetings and established an advisory committee on resource mobilization and a technical expert group on financial reporting.

35. In its decision [NP-4/8 B](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol welcomed decision 15/7, requested the Technical Expert Group on Financial Reporting to consider financial reporting related to resource mobilization for the Protocol and encouraged Parties to consider resource mobilization for the Protocol in the implementation of the strategy for resource mobilization.

36. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will have before it a note by the Secretariat addressing the aforementioned matters.¹¹ A note by the Secretariat concerning the financial mechanism and the provision of guidance to GEF,¹² the report on the sixth review of the effectiveness of the financial mechanism¹³ and the report of the GEF Council for the sixteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties,¹⁴ as well as recommendation 4/4 of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, will also be relevant to the deliberations. On the basis of its consideration of those documents and a draft decision contained in the compilation of draft decisions, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol will be invited to adopt a decision concerning the financial mechanism and resource mobilization relevant to the implementation of the Protocol, including a recommendation to the Conference of the Parties on its guidance to GEF.

Item 8

Capacity-building and development and awareness-raising

37. In its decision [NP-4/7 A](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol endorsed the long-term strategic framework for capacity-building and development adopted by the Conference of the Parties to the Convention in its decision 15/8, and established a process for the revision and updating of the strategic framework for capacity-building and development that had been adopted in decision NP-1/8 to support the effective implementation of the Protocol.

38. In its decision [NP-4/7 B](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol requested the Executive Secretary to consider incorporating elements of the awareness-raising strategy when revising the strategic framework.

39. Accordingly, the Secretariat prepared a draft capacity-building and development action plan for the Nagoya Protocol¹⁵ with inputs from the Informal Advisory Committee on Capacity-building for the Implementation of the Nagoya Protocol. The Subsidiary Body on Implementation considered the draft action plan at its fourth meeting and adopted recommendation 4/7, which contains a draft decision for consideration by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol at its fifth meeting.

40. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to adopt a decision on the basis of the draft decision recommended by the Subsidiary Body, as reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions.

41. Information on capacity-building and development activities undertaken by the Secretariat to support the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol may also be found in documents prepared under agenda items 9 and 11.

Item 9

Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House and information-sharing

42. In its decision [NP-4/4](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol requested the Executive Secretary, taking into account the progress already made, to continue to develop and administer the Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House following the goals and priorities set out in the annex to decision [NP-3/3](#), in accordance with the

modalities of operation¹⁶ and feedback received, in particular from Parties and the Informal Advisory Committee to the Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House.

43. Against that background, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider a note by the Secretariat on progress in the operation of the Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House¹⁷ and to adopt a decision on the way forward. The draft decision is reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions.

44. The report of the Informal Advisory Committee to the Access and Benefit-sharing Clearing-House on its fifth meeting¹⁸ has been made available for information.

Item 10

Assessment and review of the effectiveness of the Protocol

45. In its decision [NP-3/1 B](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol decided to conduct the second assessment and review of the effectiveness of the Protocol at its sixth meeting. In the same decision, it requested that the Executive Secretary propose a methodology for conducting the second assessment and review and that the Subsidiary Body on Implementation consider the proposed methodology at its fourth meeting and make recommendations for consideration by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol at its fifth meeting.

46. Against that background, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, at its fourth meeting, considered a note by the Secretariat containing a proposed methodology for conducting the second assessment and review and adopted recommendation 4/11, which contains a draft decision for consideration by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol at its fifth meeting.

47. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to adopt a decision on those matters on the basis of the draft decision recommended by the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, as reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions. Agenda item 10 will be considered in conjunction with the corresponding item on the agenda of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention.

Item 11

Cooperation with international organizations, bodies established under other conventions, and initiatives

48. In carrying out activities related to the Nagoya Protocol, the Secretariat of the Convention cooperates with a number of other international organizations, bodies established under other conventions, and initiatives.

49. Pursuant to decision [NP-3/7](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will have before it a note by the Secretariat providing an update on cooperative activities with other international organizations, bodies established under other conventions, and initiatives relevant to access and benefit-sharing and the implementation of the Protocol.¹⁹ The note will also contain an overview of key developments under international agreements and instruments of relevance to the implementation of the Protocol.

50. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to take note of the report.

Item 12**Review of effectiveness of processes under the Convention and its Protocols**

51. At its fourth meeting, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol reviewed experiences in conducting concurrent and online meetings. It also considered other areas where possible improvements in the effectiveness of processes could be made.

52. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol adopted decision [NP-4/9](#), in which it requested that the Executive Secretary, among other things, prepare options for procedures in conducting hybrid meetings, and under extraordinary circumstances, online meetings, on the basis of experience gathered from Parties, relevant stakeholders and studies. The Executive Secretary was also requested to prepare an analysis of options to further improve the effectiveness of meetings under the Protocol, including negotiating processes, to better follow up on previous decisions and to explore modalities for the engagement of observers in processes under the Protocol. The options prepared regarding hybrid and online meetings and the analysis of options made in relation to the other areas of improvement were submitted to the Subsidiary Body on Implementation for consideration at its fourth meeting.

53. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider agenda item 12 on the basis of the draft decision contained in recommendation 4/12 of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, as reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions.

Item 13**Enhancing the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol in the context of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework**

54. By its decision 15/4, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention adopted the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, noted that the implementation of the Framework would be supported by other decisions adopted by the Conference of the Parties at its fifteenth meeting and affirmed that those decisions were of equal standing to the Framework.²⁰

55. Goal C and Target 13 of the Framework address access and benefit-sharing from the utilization of genetic resources, associated traditional knowledge and digital sequence information on genetic resources. They also refer to access and benefit-sharing in accordance with internationally agreed access and benefit-sharing instruments, which includes the Nagoya Protocol.

56. In its decision NP-4/5, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol welcomed decision 15/4, endorsed the Framework and took note of the related decisions adopted by the Conference of the Parties at its fifteenth meeting. It also invited Parties, and encouraged other Governments, to make use of the approach to planning, monitoring, reporting and review under the Convention to enhance the implementation of the Protocol and the integration of access and benefit-sharing in revised or updated national biodiversity strategies and action plans.

57. Furthermore, in its decision [NP-4/3](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol, noting the desirability of developing nationally and globally relevant indicators for access and benefit-sharing in the context of the Framework, took note of the monitoring framework adopted in decision 15/5 and welcomed the process set forth therein.

58. Against that background, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will have before it a note by the Secretariat²¹ containing a summary of

developments in relevant areas of work under the Framework, linkages to the Protocol that have been identified and a draft decision, which will also be reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions.

Item 14

Digital sequence information on genetic resources

59. In its decision 15/9 on digital sequence information on genetic resources, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention agreed that the benefits from the use of digital sequence information on genetic resources should be shared fairly and equitably, and it established, as part of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, a multilateral mechanism for benefit-sharing from the use of digital sequence information on genetic resources, including a global fund. It also established a process to further develop and operationalize the mechanism, to be finalized at its sixteenth meeting. The process included the establishment of the Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on Benefit-sharing from the Use of Digital Sequence Information on Genetic Resources to undertake further development of the multilateral mechanism and to make recommendations to the Conference of the Parties at its sixteenth meeting.

60. In its decision [NP-4/6](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol welcomed decision 15/9, endorsed the multilateral mechanism and the process established therein and requested the Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group to also report to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol at its fifth meeting.

61. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider agenda item 14 in conjunction with the corresponding item on the agenda of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention.²²

Item 15

Specialized international access and benefit-sharing instruments in the context of Article 4, paragraph 4, of the Nagoya Protocol

62. At its fourth meeting, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol adopted decision [NP-4/11](#) on specialized international access and benefit-sharing instruments in the context of Article 4, paragraph 4, of the Protocol, in which it noted the divergence of views among Parties on the issue, took note of recommendation 3/16 of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation and decided to further review the item at its fifth meeting on the basis of recommendation 3/16.

63. Accordingly, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider for adoption the draft decision contained in recommendation 3/16 of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, as reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions.

Item 16

Global multilateral benefit-sharing mechanism

64. In its decision [NP-4/10](#), the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol decided to revisit at its fifth meeting the issue of the need for and modalities of a global multilateral benefit-sharing mechanism.

65. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider a note by the Secretariat on that issue²³ and to adopt a decision.

67. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to consider and adopt the report on its fifth meeting on the basis of the draft report prepared by the Rapporteur.

68. In accordance with established practice, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be invited to authorize the Rapporteur to complete the final report after the present meeting with the guidance of the President (or the substitute thereto, as appropriate) and the assistance of the Secretariat.

69. It is expected that the fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol will be closed on 1 November, at approximately 6 p.m.
