Note by the Secretariat

1. In paragraph 3 of decisions [16/25](#), [CP-11/5](#) and [NP-5/10](#), the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and

Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization, respectively, requested the Executive Secretary of the Convention, together with the Bureaux, to continue to explore and make use of, as appropriate, relevant ways and means to facilitate early preparations for meetings, such as the early submission of statements.

2. At its joint meeting with the Bureau of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice held on 10 June 2026, the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties agreed that the early submission of statements would be applied to all substantive agenda items of the present meeting.

3. Parties and observers registered for the meeting have therefore been invited, through notification No. 2026-055, to submit written statements on any of the agenda items, on a voluntary and informal basis, through a designated online portal or by email, by 8 p.m. Nairobi time (UTC +3) on 3 August 2026.

4. In response, 180 written statements from Parties and 87 written statements from observers were received by the deadline.
