Objectives and expected outputs

Objectives and Expected Output



- Elicit views on elements related to area based conservation measures ABCMs for inclusion in the post-2020 global biodiversity framework
- Produce concrete proposals to be considered in the further development of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework
 - Will **not aim to achieve consensus**, but rather focus on developing elements for (and possible text formulations) *2030* targets with respect to ABCMs

EXPECTED OUTPUT

- **Workshop report containing concrete proposals for goals, targets, indicators, baselines** for consideration for inclusion in the post-2020 global biodiversity framework



Co-Leads' aspirations from this workshop

- Strong, concise, concrete outcomes that best serve the co-chairs and OEWG.
- “Deep dives” from experts on ABCM elements.
- Take advantage of expertise present to consider indicators and supporting framework in addition to targets.
- Think and explore options objectively and based on the science presented to you here and in documentation.
- Remember to think globally - this is a global framework.
- Keep the implementation gap in mind.
- A positive and productive atmosphere!

Key considerations

- **NOT** intended to be a **negotiation** session
 - Should aim to arrive at text proposals that synthesize common/similar perspectives
 - But do not have to arrive consensus; Report will capture different proposals
- Workshop is **not the final word** on these issues
 - Development of post-2020 framework is a Party-led process proceeding under the OEWG
 - Workshop is intended to **inform and support** these discussions
 - Formal deliberations on post-2020 framework is not limited to what is contained in the workshop output

Approach to the Structure and Content of the Post-2020 Framework*

- Framework should be easy to communicate, and inspiring and motivating
- **Should reflect all three objectives of the Convention** and the core elements of Aichi Targets
- Express the **2050 Vision** of “living in harmony with nature” in concrete terms, with links to 2030 milestone
- **Synergies with other conventions** should be used for integration
- Targets and indicators should be specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and time-bound (**SMART**)
- Time-bound targets should be relevant to the issues, which might differ according to situation
- Framework should **account for the direct and indirect drivers of biodiversity loss**, including climate change

- ✓ IPBES report highlights unprecedented loss of biodiversity and importance of ABCMs
- ✓ core to achieving 1st CBD Objective contributes to other 2
- ✓ progress in achieving target 11
- ✓ coverage increased
- ✓ issues with representativity, connectivity, management effectiveness, equity, land use planning
- ✓ high political attention (high ambition coalitions, campaigns, ...)

“By 2050, biodiversity is valued, conserved, restored and wisely used, maintaining ecosystem services, sustaining a healthy planet and delivering benefits essential for all people”.

2020 Deadline

Aichi target 11: what's good, what's missing, why haven't we necessarily achieved it?

By 2020, at least **17 %** of terrestrial and inland water areas and **10 %** of coastal and marine areas, especially **areas of particular importance** for biodiversity and ecosystem services, are **conserved** through **effectively and equitably managed, ecologically representative and well-connected** systems of **protected areas** and **other effective area-based conservation measures**, and **integrated into the wider landscape and seascape.**
