- ▶ Ensuring its alignment with the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework and the capacity-building work of the Cartagena and the Nagoya Protocols

Purpose:

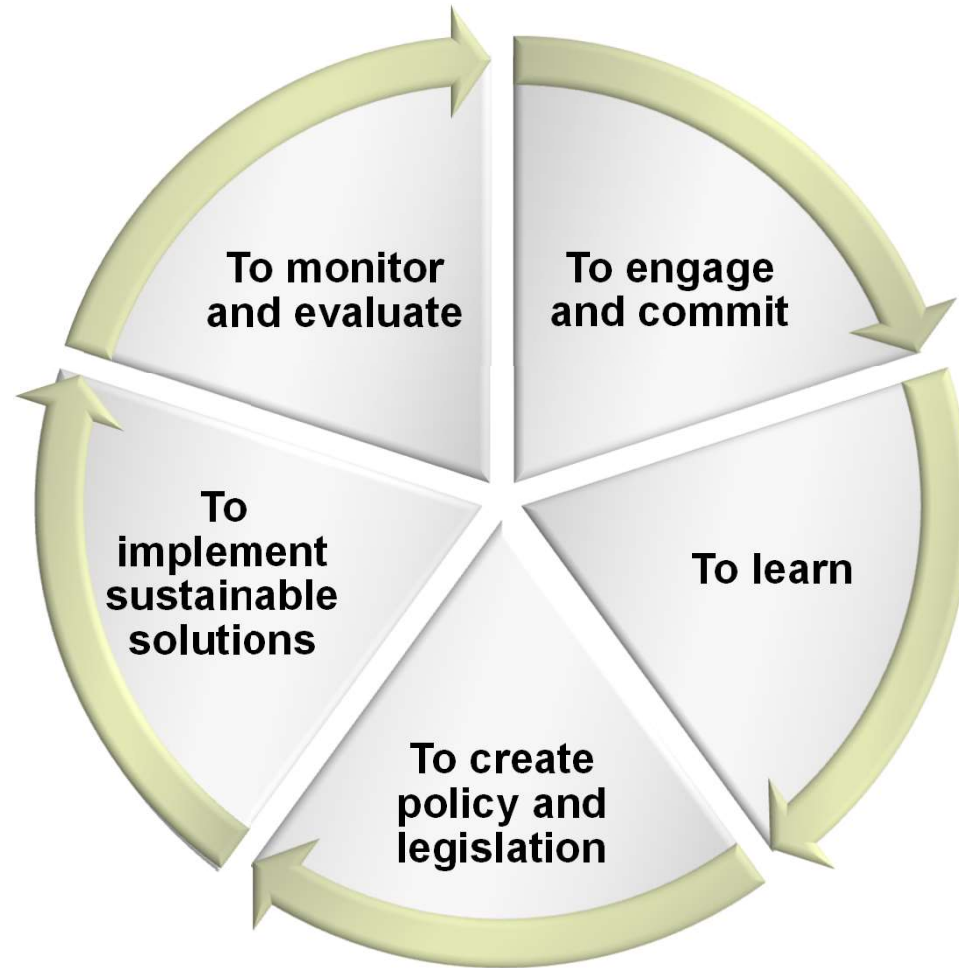
- ▶ Provide high-level strategic guidance on capacity building
- ▶ Establish a shared conceptual framework and theory of change
- ▶ Provide a menu of core guiding principles, strategies and approaches
- ▶ Better coordinate and streamline capacity building
- ▶ Galvanize transformative action

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Meaning and scope of capacity-building



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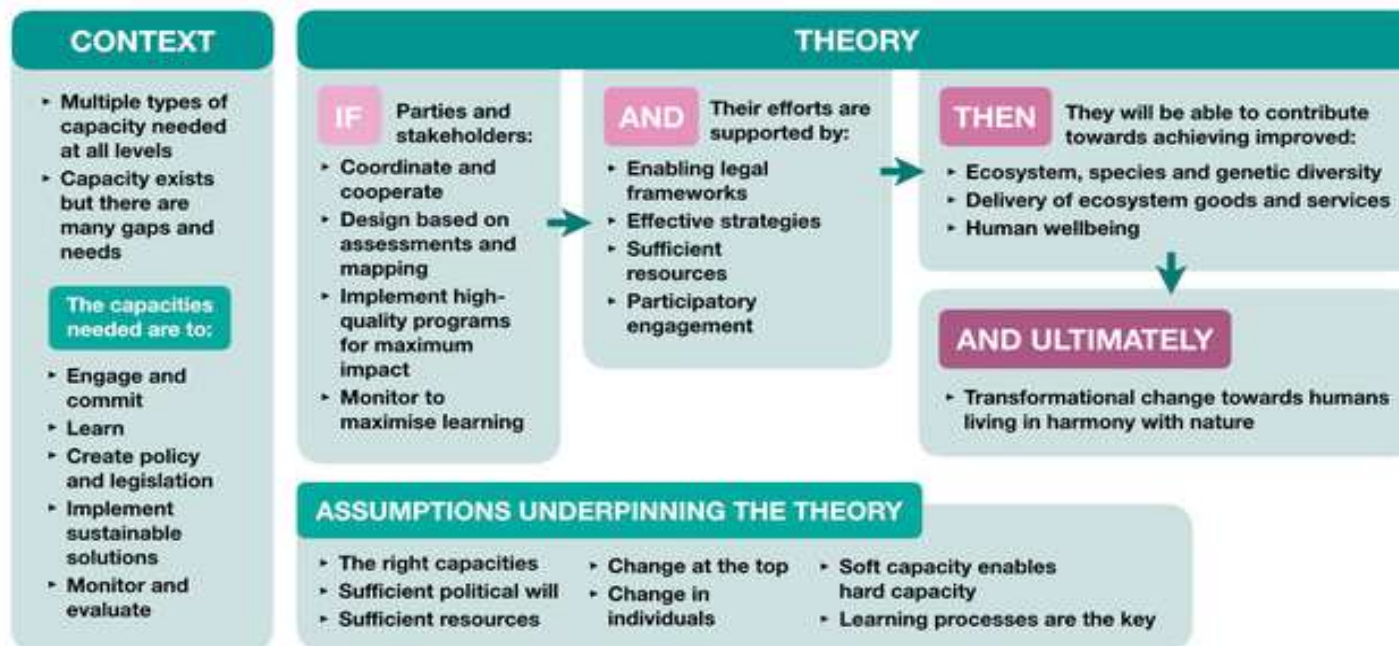
Draft Elements of the Long-Term Strategic Framework for Capacity-building beyond 2020

Key elements proposed for inclusion in the framework

1. Introduction
2. Strategic directions and approach: conceptual framework and theory of change
3. Strategies for improving and streamlining capacity building
4. Thematic results areas, actions plans and programmes
5. Implementation strategies and mechanisms
6. Monitoring, evaluation and reporting

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I. Strategic directions and approach



Vision: All Parties and relevant stakeholders have in place the enabling conditions, skills, institutions, organisations, systems and resources necessary to support transformational change towards living in harmony with nature.

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2. Strategies for improving and streamlining capacity-building

- ▶ Stocktaking, needs assessments and stakeholder mapping
- ▶ Promoting strategic planning and alignment of capacity-building
- ▶ Strengthening the governance of capacity-building
- ▶ Institutionalizing capacity-building
- ▶ Adopting a systems approach to capacity-building
- ▶ Promoting programmatic approaches
- ▶ Engaging the private sector and academic institutions and networks
- ▶ Diversifying capacity-building delivery methods and approaches
- ▶ Promoting systematic monitoring and evaluation of capacity-building efforts
- ▶ Enhancing knowledge management

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3. Thematic results areas: Capacity-building action plans and programmes

- ▶ In line with the priorities and targets of the Global Biodiversity Framework thematic capacity-building action plans could be prepared.
- ▶ These action plans could be implemented through the development of dedicated global, regional programmes, sub-regional or national programs

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4. Implementation strategies and mechanisms

- ▶ Strategic partnerships and networks for the implementation of the framework (global, regional and national)
- ▶ Mechanisms for enhancing coordination and collaboration
- ▶ North-South, South-South and Triangular cooperation
- ▶ Synergies with the capacity building work of other relevant Conventions and processes
- ▶ Resource mobilization for capacity-building

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5. Monitoring, Evaluation and Review

- ▶ Indicators for monitoring the implementation of elements of the strategic framework
- ▶ Development of tools (indicators, score card, etc) for measuring progress in capacity-building at the national level
- ▶ Review of capacity building to be built into national reporting
- ▶ Periodic review of long-term strategic framework
