

**ADDENDUM TO THE ORGANIZATION OF WORK OF THE CONTACT GROUPS ON AGENDA
ITEM 4**

NOTE BY THE CO-LEADS OF CONTACT GROUP 2

1. The present document complements the document that guides the organization of work of the four contact groups on agenda item 4 and replaces the original addendum for contact group 2.
 2. Contact group 2 has two sessions (a total of six hours) to conduct its work to address draft targets 1 to 8. In its first session, the contact group reviewed targets 1 and 2 and produced a non-paper. To continue the work, the contact group will discuss targets 3 to 8 in its second session.
 3. At the opening of the second session, the co-leads will introduce the intended work. Each target will be taken up sequentially beginning with target 3. In introducing each target, the co-leads will present an oral overview of views expressed on this target through the statements provided in plenary.
 4. During the discussion, delegations are asked to provide a text proposal and a rationale to further develop the elements of the target under consideration. When called upon, delegations are encouraged to first paste their text proposal in the chat, just before they take the floor, and then to explain the rationale for their suggestion in their oral intervention. Delegations are asked to carefully confirm that the text they propose in the chat retains any tracking that they wish to include; to avoid errors it is suggested to capitalize new text and to put deleted text in square brackets. The Secretariat will display the proposed text on the screen. If a delegation has submitted its textual proposal for the contact group by email in advance of the session, the Secretariat will, as far as possible, utilize that version of the submitted text. Delegations should keep their interventions well within two minutes, as far as possible.
 5. Participants are invited to consider supporting a previously presented text proposal, if it addresses the general interest/concern of their own delegation, rather than proposing similar language that does not vary greatly in substantive content/direction. Parties may express their support for proposals, including those presented by observers, using the chat box.
 6. To assist the deliberations, the text of the target being discussed, together with proposals made on text will be projected on screen.
