5. General information on access to San José, Costa Rica



San José is serviced by the Juan Santamaría International Airport. Please note that the venue of the meeting (Hotel Punta Leona) is located approximately at 1:30 - 2:00 hours from the airport. Punta Leona is located at 88 kms from San Jose; the Costa Rican government is generously offering transportation from San Jose to the venue. Information about transportation available for participants will be shared by the shortly.

6. Visa information



Participants requiring a visa to enter Costa Rica are requested to contact the nearest Costa Rican diplomatic/consular representation in their countries of residence as soon as possible in order to secure, in a timely manner, the required visa, prior to departure. It should be noted that airline companies will not allow boarding in the absence of a valid visa.

Participants from countries that require an entry visa for Costa Rica are strongly advised to contact the nearest Costa Rican diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. Information on visas is provided by the Government of Costa Rica, General Direction of Immigration (in Spanish) attached as annexes to this document.

7. Health Requirements

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is required from travellers coming from countries with risk of yellow fever transmission. Participants are requested to make their own hotel reservations and are <u>urged to book at Hotel Punta Leona</u>. Please note that different accommodation options may result inconvenient in terms of distances and there will be no shuttle service from other hotels. In addition, Hotel Punta Leona has an entrance fee for participants who are not hotel guests.

9. Payment of the Daily Subsistence Allowances (DSA)

The DSA will be disbursed to funded participants on the first day of the meeting in the form of a prepaid credit card (Swiss Bankers card). These funded participants are kindly requested to bring their passports and boarding passes on the first day of the meeting. These will be copied and returned to participants during the meeting. It is advisable that participants have some cash at

hand to cover expenses that may occur between their arrival and the moment at which they are provided with the prepaid credit card from which they will access their DSA. Please note that the funds can take up to 24 hours to be loaded on the cards.

The official language in Costa Rica is Spanish, but English is widely spoken at most tourist destinations and in the business community.

11. Weather and time zone information



In June, temperatures in Punta Leona range between a maximum of +32°C in the daytime and a minimum of +23°C at night. Current weather conditions can be found at: http://worldweather.wmo.int/en/city.html?cityId=1113.

The standard time zone will be GMT/UTC - 6 hours.

12. Electricity

The electrical currents in Costa Rica are 120 volts, 60 Hertz as shown in the illustrations below.



13. Currency



The currency in Costa Rica is the Colón (colones plural) (CRC \$). The current exchange rate as at 17 May is US \$1 = CRC \$509.94 (source: https://www.bccr.fi.cr/SitePages/Inicio.aspx, rates are subject to change). The US dollar is frequently accepted in Costa Rica.

14. Field trip

The organizers are planning a field trip to Manuel Antonio National Park. This park is in the Central Pacific of Costa Rica and the approximate travel time from Punta Leona is one hour and thirty

minutes. Although the park is located on the beach, it has dry tropical forest trails that, depending on the time of year, can become humid with a high probability of rain. Therefore, we recommend bringing insect repellent, sunscreen, hat, cool but covering clothing, bathing suit, shoes for walking in mud, beach sandals, cape or umbrella, extra clothes in case you want to change on the way back. Lunch that day will be coordinated directly with the hotel by the organizers.
