5. General information on access to Makati City, Philippines



Makati City serviced by the Manila - Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA). Taxi service is available to NAIA and from all points of Metro Manila. Also, jeepney and bus routes are available to the airport and connect to all terminals. Take only official, metered or pre-booked taxis. Taxis charge around PHP 500.00 - PHP 650.00 (US \$9 - US \$12) to Makati City. The trip takes about 24-40 minutes via NAIA expressway depending on traffic.

6. Visa information



Participants from countries listed at the link below <u>do not require an entry visa</u> for the Philippines. Those requiring a visa are strongly advised to contact the nearest Philippine diplomatic

or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. Please note that some airline companies will not allow boarding in the absence of a valid visa.

7. Payment of the Daily Subsistence Allowance (DSA)

The DSA will be disbursed to sponsored participants on the first day of the workshop in the form of a prepaid credit card. For identification purposes, these participants are kindly requested to bring **their passports and boarding passes**. These will be recorded and returned to participants during the workshop. August is a very rainy and humid month in Manila, please bring an umbrella and appropriate light clothing for wet weather. The standard time zone in Manila is Philippine Standard Time (PHST) and is equivalent to GMT/UTC +8 hours.

The electrical currents in the Philippines are 220 Volts, 60 Hertz as shown in the illustration below.



The currency in the Philippines is the Philippine Peso (PHP or \mathbb{P}). The current exchange rate as at 26 July 2023 is US \$ 1.00 = \mathbb{P} 54.60 and $\notin 1 = \mathbb{P}$ 60.54 (source: <u>www.xe.com</u>, rates are subject to change).
