Co-leads' proposals on targets 9 – 13 of the global biodiversity framework: meeting people's needs through sustainable use and benefit-sharing

The present non-paper provides proposals by the co-leads (Gillian Guthrie – Jamaica and Gabriele Obermayr -Austria) of contact group 3 for targets 9 to 13 of the global biodiversity framework based on:

- (a) The first draft of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework (CBD/WG2020/3/3);
- (b) The Co-Chairs' reflections document (CBD/WG2020/3/6), where applicable;
- (c) The report of the Open-Ended Working Group (Part I) which includes composite text and proposals by Parties (CBD/WG2020/3/5);
- (d) The report by the Co-Leads on Contact Group 3 (CBD/WG2020/3/CG/3/Report);
- (e) Views expressed during the first session of contact group 3 held on March 16, 2022.

TARGET 9

Ensure the sustainable management and use of wild species to enhance benefits such as food and water security for people, especially those in vulnerable situations, while safeguarding customary sustainable use by indigenous peoples and local communities.

TARGET 10

Ensure that all areas under agriculture, aquaculture, fisheries, forestry and other productive uses are managed sustainably, in particular through the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, contributing to the efficiency and resilience of these production systems.

TARGET 11

Maintain and enhance ecosystem services such as regulation of air, water and soil quality and protection from natural hazards and extreme weather events, including through ecosystem-based approaches and/or nature-based solutions.

TARGET 12

Significantly increase the area of, and access to, green and blue spaces in urban and other densely populated areas, for human health and wellbeing, while enhancing ecological connectivity by mainstreaming the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity into urban planning and development.

TARGET 13

Implement measures at the global, regional and national level to facilitate access to genetic resources and to ensure the fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the utilization of genetic resources, and where relevant, of associated traditional knowledge, including through mutually agreed terms and prior and informed consent.

13bis. Facilitate the fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the utilization of genetic resources by increasing capacity development, technical and scientific cooperation, and technology transfer, to develop and implement access and benefit measures/mechanisms at the national level.
