



Essence of SES Communique to COP14

Local and subnational governments, our networks and our partners, convening at *6th Global Biodiversity Summit of Local and Subnational Governments* Call on Parties to:

- strengthen the catalytic role of all levels of government to contribute nature-based solutions,
- accelerate and enable our full participation in preparing National Biodiversity Strategies and associated action plans,
- unlock available resources, capacity building and knowledge transfer to support, mainstreaming biodiversity actions in our regions and our cities,
- enable and promote the implementation of the previous COP decisions related to local and subnational governments and to ensure the flow of decisions continues in future COPs,
- increase efforts to collaborate with the other global governance processes such as Rio, the New Urban Agenda, SDGs, and
- support the efforts of the UN Secretary General's 2019 UN Climate Summit's work stream on nature-based solutions.

Initial View Aichi submitted in December 2018

Contribution of Subnational Governments, Cities and other Local Authorities to the scope and content of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework

1. Subnational governments, cities and other Local Authorities have been playing important roles in the implementation of the 2011-2020 Strategic Plan on Biodiversity and the Aichi Biodiversity Targets, especially on mainstreaming of biodiversity across sectors. Also, they are major promoters of the Sustainable Development Goals. Therefore, we expect the new post-2020 strategic framework of the CBD to clearly consider the importance of vertical mainstreaming and cooperation with local and subnational governments as the partners of the Parties.

2. We also suggest that the spirit of the current target 17 of the Aichi Biodiversity Targets can be scaled up by mentioning something like "each Party shall have developed national biodiversity strategies and action plans (BSAPs) with the full involvement of subnational governments, cities and other local authorities, and committed to encouraging and supporting local and subnational governments to develop their own BSAPs, with a view to letting at least all the immediate subnational governments in each Party establish their BSAP, by 2030 or possibly 2025, making efforts to enhance the capacity of local and subnational governments to achieve the post-2020 framework elements".

3. Based on the fact that significant and growing numbers of subnational governments, cities and other local authorities have been actively involved in international cooperation among themselves and their partners, including under the Global Partnership of Local and Subnational Governments and the Advisory Committees of Cities and of Subnational Governments, we strongly suggest that the COP renew, expand and/or update the "Plan of Action on Subnational Governments, Cities and Other Local Authorities for Biodiversity (2011-2020)" and enhance the Parties' support to the Global Partnership of Local and Subnational Governments for Biodiversity.

Conclusions

- SNGs play critically important roles for Biodiversity, as stewards of the landscapes and catalyzers of collaboration on the ground among multistakeholders.
- SNGs think vertical coherence is very important and are willing to collaborate with the Parties within the territories.
- Some leading SNGs are willing to contribute to global process for CBD. Each reginal workshop should have some SNGs as the participants like this world's first workshop.
- Once the Parties could engage SNGs as partners, not as objects, they could expand the horizon of their efforts for biodiversity.
