ANNOTATIONS TO THE AGENDA (PART II)

INTRODUCTION

1. Following the invitation of the Government of China and as decided by the Conference of the Parties in its decision [XIII/33](#), the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety was scheduled to be held in Kunming, China, in October 2020 concurrently with the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the fourth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from Their Utilization. However, due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the meetings were postponed.
2. Further to the agreement to hold these meetings in two parts and taking into account the necessity of holding the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties before the end of 2022, the first part was held in hybrid setting, online and in Kunming, from 11 to 15 October 2021. The second part of the meeting is to be held in person in Montreal, Canada, from 7 to 19 December 2022.
3. The agenda of the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (CBD/COP/MOP/10/Rev.1) was adopted at the first part of its meeting. The Bureau reviewed the preliminary draft annotations for the second part of the tenth meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety at its meetings held in May, July and August 2022. The annotations for the agenda items to be addressed at the second part of the meeting were subsequently finalized by the Executive Secretary, taking into account the comments of the Bureau at those meetings, and are presented in the present document.
4. High-level ministerial segments will be organized by the Presidency during the two parts of the meeting in consultation with the Secretariat and the Bureau. The high-level segment planned for the second part of the meeting will be held from 15 to 17 December 2022.
5. Consultations among delegations and preparatory meetings of regional groups may be held prior to the start of the meetings.
6. The Executive Secretary has prepared a compilation of draft decisions proposed by subsidiary bodies at intersessional meetings or developed by the Executive Secretary (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).
7. For further information, see the annotations to the agenda for the second part of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention, CBD/COP/15/1/Add.3.

ITEM 1. OPENING OF THE MEETING

8. The meeting will resume in person and jointly with the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties and the fourth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties of the Nagoya Protocol on Access and Benefit-Sharing.

9. The opening of the meeting will take place at 10 a.m. (local time, Montreal) on Wednesday, 7 December 2022.

10. The meeting will be opened by the President of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties. At the opening session, the Conference will hear a welcoming address by representatives of the Presidency as well as of the host country.

11. The Executive Secretary will address the meeting and highlight the main issues before the Conference of the Parties and the meetings of the Parties to the Protocols.

12. Representatives of regional groups, indigenous peoples and local communities and a limited number of other groups may also make statements.

ITEM 2. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

Officers

13. The President of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties, Mr. Runqiu Huang, Minister of Ecology and Environment of China, was elected, at the opening of the first part of the meeting, by acclamation. In accordance with rule 21 of the rules of procedure (as adopted by decision I/1 and amended by decision V/20), the Conference of the Parties, at its fourteenth meeting, elected 10 vice-presidents from among the representatives of the Parties for a term of office commencing upon the closure of its fourteenth meeting and ending at the closure of its fifteenth meeting. For two regions, the bureau member was subsequently replaced.

14. The Bureau of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention also serves as the Bureau of the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol and Mr. Runqiu Huang also serves as the President of the tenth meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol. All countries represented being Parties to the Protocol, the Bureau comprises the following members, in addition to its President:

15. At the second part of its fifteenth meeting, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention will elect Bureau members whose terms of office will commence upon the closure of the meeting (rule 21 of

the rules of procedure). In the event that one or more Bureau members are elected from Parties to the Convention that are not Parties to the Cartagena Protocol, substitute members will be elected by the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol (further to Article 29, paragraph 3 of the Cartagena Protocol).

Adoption of the agenda

16. The provisional agenda (CBD/COP/MOP/10/1/Rev.1) was adopted by the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol at the first part of its tenth meeting held on 11 October 2021.

Organization of work

17. In decision [BS-VII/9](#), para. 1 (and as also reflected in decisions [XII/27](#), para. 3, and NP-1/12, para. 1), the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol decided to hold their future ordinary meetings concurrently with the meetings of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the meetings of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol within a two-week period.

18. Accordingly, the meeting of the Parties will be invited to consider and adopt the proposal for the organization of its work during the second part of the meeting (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.4). The proposed organization of work provides for plenary and two working groups. The document proposes a division of responsibilities between the plenary and the two working groups, and also includes the proposed schedule for the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the fourth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol.

19. The organization of work has been prepared taking into account the experience gained with the convening of the concurrent meetings of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention and the meetings of the Parties to the Cartagena and Nagoya Protocols in December 2016 and November 2018.

20. Interpretation will be available for the plenary and morning and afternoon sessions of the working groups.

21. The list of working documents and a preliminary list of information documents issued for the meeting are contained in annex I to the present document.

ITEM 3. REPORT ON THE CREDENTIALS OF REPRESENTATIVES TO THE TENTH MEETING OF THE CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES SERVING AS THE MEETING OF THE PARTIES TO THE CARTAGENA PROTOCOL

22. Rule 18 of the rules of procedure states that:

“The credentials of representatives and the names of alternate representatives and advisers shall be submitted to the Executive Secretary of the Conference of the Parties or the representative of the Executive Secretary not later than twenty-four hours after the opening of the meeting. Any later change in the composition of the delegation shall also be submitted to the Executive Secretary or his representative. The credentials shall be issued by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization.”

23. Rule 19 provides that “the Bureau of any meeting shall examine the credentials and submit its report to the Conference of the Parties for decision”. The rules of procedure apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the meetings of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol.

24. In order to assist Parties in fulfilling the requirements of rule 18, the Executive Secretary issued a notification³ which included information on requirements for credentials and a link to where sample formats of appropriate credentials may be found. Following previous practice, representatives of Parties to the Convention that are also Parties to the Cartagena Protocol and to the Nagoya Protocol may submit a single set of credentials for the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention, the tenth

meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol and the fourth meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol.

25. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol may wish to consider and adopt the report on credentials submitted to it by the Bureau.

ITEM 4. REPORTS OF SUBSIDIARY BODIES

26. Article 30, paragraph 1, of the Cartagena Protocol provides that “[a]ny subsidiary body established by or under the Convention may, upon a decision by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to this Protocol, serve the Protocol, in which case the meeting of the Parties shall specify which functions that body shall exercise.”

27. Under this item, the President will inform the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol of the meetings of subsidiary bodies held during the intersessional period and the corresponding reports, on the understanding that the substantive issues arising therefrom will be taken up under the appropriate agenda item.

28. The following reports were presented to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol at the first part of its tenth meeting:

(a) Report of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice on its twenty-third meeting (CBD/SBSTTA/23/9);

(b) Report of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation on the first part of its third meeting (CBD/SBI/3/20);

(c) Report of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice on the first part of its twenty-fourth meeting (CBD/SBSTTA/24/11);

(d) Reports of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework on its first, second and the first part of its third meeting (CBD/WG2020/1/5; CBD/WG2020/2/4 and CBD/WG2020/3/5).

29. The reports that will be presented at the second part of the tenth meeting include the following:

(a) Report of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice on its twenty-fourth meeting (CBD/SBSTTA/24/12);

(b) Report of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation on its third meeting (CBD/SBI/3/21);

(c) Reports of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework on its third meeting (CBD/WG2020/3/7), its fourth meeting (CBD/WG2020/4/4) and its fifth meeting (CBD/WG2020/5/-).

ITEM 5. REPORT OF THE COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE

30. The Compliance Committee under the Protocol is required to report and submit its recommendations to the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol. During the first part of the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol, the Committee submitted its report on the work it had undertaken following the ninth meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol (CBD/CP/MOP/10/2).

31. During the first part of the meeting, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol took note of the report by the Chair of the Compliance Committee and decided to defer consideration of the Committee’s recommendations and the election of new members until the second part of the meeting.

32. During the second part of its tenth meeting, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol is expected to consider the report and the recommendations of the Compliance Committee and to take appropriate action. It is expected that the Committee’s

recommendations will be considered under the agenda item to which they most closely pertain as indicated in the Committee's report.

33. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol will also be invited to elect members to the Compliance Committee. The Secretariat issued a notification providing further information on this matter.⁴

ITEM 6. ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROTOCOL AND BUDGET FOR THE TRUST FUNDS

34. The report of the Executive Secretary on the administration of the Convention, including the budget for the trust funds of the Convention (CBD/COP/15/6) will be before the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol for its consideration. The meeting of the Parties to the Protocol will be invited to take note of the report.

35. Following the postponement of the tenth meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol, the fifteenth meeting of the Parties to the Convention and the fourth meeting of the Parties to the Nagoya Protocol, an interim budget for 2021 was approved by extraordinary meetings in November 2020 (see decision CP-EM-1/1) and an interim budget for 2022 was approved at the first part of this meeting in October 2021 (see decision CP-10/1). Decision CP-10/1 (as well as decisions 15/1 and NP-4/1) requested the Executive Secretary to prepare proposals for the budget for the biennium 2023-2024.

36. Under this item, the Conference of the Parties, as well as the meeting of the Parties of the Protocol, is expected to adopt a programme budget for the biennium 2023-2024 on the basis of a proposal prepared by the Executive Secretary (CBD/COP/15/7 and CBD/COP/15/7/Add.1), in accordance with decisions 14/37 and 15/1. Further information on the requirements for the Trust Fund for Additional Voluntary Contributions in Support of Approved Activities, including a summary of the financial implications of draft decisions, will also be provided (CBD/COP/15/7/Add.2). Further to decision 14/37, the meeting of the Parties will also consider, under this agenda item, matters related to the funding of participants from developing countries (CBD/COP/15/7/Add.3). Elements of a draft decision have been prepared by the Executive Secretary and are provided in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).

37. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol may wish to refer the proposed budget for the biennium to the budget contact group expected to be established by the Conference of the Parties to the Convention at its first plenary session.

ITEM 7. IMPLEMENTATION PLAN AND CAPACITY-BUILDING ACTION PLAN FOR THE CARTAGENA PROTOCOL

38. In decision CP-9/7, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol decided to develop a specific Implementation Plan for the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety that is anchored in and complementary to the post-2020 global biodiversity framework and also stressed the importance of including biosafety in the post-2020 global biodiversity framework. In decision CP-9/3, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol acknowledged the need for a specific action plan for capacity-building for implementation of the Cartagena Protocol and its Supplementary Protocol that is aligned with the implementation plan and complementary to the long-term strategic framework for capacity-building beyond 2020.

39. Decisions CP-9/7 and CP-9/3 set out processes for developing the plans, including the submission of views, open-ended online discussions, review by the Liaison Group on the Cartagena Protocol, as well as a review process by Parties and observers and consideration by the Subsidiary Body on Implementation at its third meeting.

40. The Subsidiary Body on Implementation, at its third meeting, considered the draft plans. The Subsidiary Body adopted recommendation 3/4 which contains two draft decisions for consideration by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol.

41. Accordingly, under this item, the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol will be invited to consider this item on the basis of recommendation 3/4 of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation and to adopt decisions on the implementation plan and the capacity-building action plan (see the draft decisions contained in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5)).

ITEM 8. MONITORING AND REPORTING (ARTICLE 33)

42. In decision CP-9/5, the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol adopted the reporting format for the fourth national reports on the implementation of the Protocol and requested Parties to submit their fourth national report twelve months prior to the tenth meeting of the Parties to the Protocol. Fourth national reports on the implementation of the Cartagena Protocol were due on 1 October 2019.

43. Under this item, the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol will have before it a note by the Executive Secretary containing an overview of the status of submission of fourth national reports and the draft reporting format for the fifth national reports (document CBD/CP/MOP/10/5). A reference table showing how the questions in the format for the fifth national report correspond to questions in the fourth national report is provided in document CBD/CP/MOP/10/INF/3.

44. The meeting is expected to consider the information provided in the document and adopt a decision on the format for the fifth national reports (see the draft decision reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5)).

ITEM 9. ASSESSMENT AND REVIEW OF THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROTOCOL (ARTICLE 35) AND FINAL EVALUATION OF THE STRATEGIC PLAN FOR THE CARTAGENA PROTOCOL ON BIOSAFETY FOR THE PERIOD 2011-2020

45. In decision CP-9/6, the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol decided that the fourth assessment and review of the Cartagena Protocol would be combined with the final evaluation of the Strategic Plan for the Protocol.

46. The decision requested the Executive Secretary to analyse and synthesize information on the implementation of the Protocol, drawing from the fourth national reports, the Biosafety Clearing-House, experience from capacity-building projects and the Compliance Committee, as appropriate, to facilitate the fourth assessment and review and final evaluation of the Strategic Plan. This information was made available to the Liaison Group on the Cartagena Protocol and the Compliance Committee, which contributed to the fourth assessment and review and the final evaluation of the Strategic Plan and their conclusions were submitted for consideration by the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, at its third meeting.

47. The Subsidiary Body on Implementation, at its third meeting, considered the information and conclusions from the Liaison Group and the Compliance Committee and submitted its findings and recommendations to the tenth meeting of the Parties to the Protocol as outlined in SBI recommendation 3/2.

48. The Subsidiary Body on Implementation requested that an update to the analysis of information be prepared, should 80 per cent of fourth national reports be received prior to the tenth meeting of the Parties to the Protocol. The update to the analysis is provided in document CBD/CP/MOP/10/INF/2.

49. Accordingly, under this item, the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol will be invited to undertake the fourth assessment and review of the Protocol and the final evaluation of the Strategic Plan for the Protocol on the basis of the findings and recommendations from the Subsidiary Body on Implementation (see the draft decision in CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).

ITEM 10. MATTERS RELATED TO THE FINANCIAL MECHANISM AND RESOURCES (ARTICLE 28)

50. In accordance with decision 14/23, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, at its third meeting, prepared proposals for a four-year outcome-oriented framework of programme priorities for the Convention and its Protocols, for the eighth replenishment period (July 2022 to June 2026) of the Global Environment Facility Trust Fund, aligned with the draft post-2020 global biodiversity framework (para. 17). The Subsidiary Body on Implementation also prepared terms of reference for an evaluation of the effectiveness of the financial mechanism (para. 13) and considered the estimated funding requirements for the implementation of the Convention and its Protocols in the eighth replenishment period of the Trust Fund of the GEF (para. 16) and a preliminary report of the Council of the Global Environment Facility. Accordingly, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation made a recommendation to the Conference of the Parties addressing these elements (SBI recommendation 3/7).

51. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol will have before it a note by the Executive Secretary summarizing relevant information regarding support for biosafety from the Global Environment Facility (CBD/CP/MOP/10/6). It will also have before it the final report of the Council of the Global Environment Facility to the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (CBD/COP/15/8). In addition, a note by the Executive Secretary submitted to the Conference of the Parties concerning the financial mechanism and the provision of guidance to the Global Environment Facility (CBD/COP/15/10) is also relevant to its deliberations.

52. The meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol is expected to consider the elements of a draft decision in the document CBD/CP/MOP/10/6, reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5), including relevant recommendations from the Compliance Committee, and to adopt a decision on this matter. It is further expected that the meeting of the Parties will consider the recommendation by the Subsidiary Body on Implementation to the Conference of the Parties (SBI recommendation 3/7) and related aspects of the note by the Executive Secretary (CBD/COP/15/10), as well as the report of the Council of the GEF (CBD/COP/15/8) and include in its decision a recommendation to the Conference of the Parties on guidance to the Global Environment Facility, as appropriate.

ITEM 11. OPERATION AND ACTIVITIES OF THE BIOSAFETY CLEARING-HOUSE (ARTICLE 20)

53. In decision CP-VIII/2, the Executive Secretary was requested to undertake a number of tasks on the Biosafety Clearing-House (BCH) including carrying out the full migration of the BCH to its new platform.

54. In decision CP-9/2, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol noted with concern that important activities requested in decision CP-VIII/2 had not been undertaken and requested the Executive Secretary, as a matter of priority, to act upon the requests in this decision including by completing the migration of the BCH, continuing to make improvements to the central portal of the BCH and following up on the recommendations of the Informal Advisory Committee on the BCH from its tenth meeting.

55. Accordingly, under this agenda item, the meeting will be invited to consider a report by the Executive Secretary on the activities undertaken on the BCH in the intersessional period (document CBD/CP/MOP/10/7) and to adopt a decision on the matter, reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).

ITEM 12. COOPERATION WITH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS, CONVENTIONS AND INITIATIVES

56. The meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol will have before it a note by the Executive Secretary (CBD/CP/MOP/10/8) providing an update on cooperative activities between the Secretariat and other conventions, international organizations and initiatives relevant to the implementation of the Protocol.

57. The meeting may wish to take note of this information.

ITEM 13. REVIEW OF EFFECTIVENESS OF STRUCTURES AND PROCESSES UNDER THE CONVENTION AND ITS PROTOCOLS

58. At its ninth meeting, the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol reviewed experience with concurrent meetings and, in decision CP-9/8 requested the Executive Secretary to further develop the review of experience on the basis of the experience gained from the concurrent meetings in Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt, for consideration by the Subsidiary Body on Implementation at its third meeting.

59. The second and final review prepared by the Executive Secretary was considered by the Subsidiary Body on Implementation, at its third meeting. In light of the circumstances arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, the Subsidiary Body also considered the challenges and opportunities of conducting meetings through online modalities,

60. The Conference of the Parties serving as a meeting of the Parties will be invited to consider this item on the basis of the draft decision arising from SBI recommendation 3/13, reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).

ITEM 14. RISK ASSESSMENT AND RISK MANAGEMENT (ARTICLES 15 AND 16)

61. In decision CP-9/13, the meeting of the Parties established a process for the identification and prioritization of specific issues regarding risk assessment of living modified organisms. It also decided to consider whether additional guidance materials on risk assessment are needed for (a) living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives, and (b) living modified fish. Actions agreed to in decision CP-9/13 include the submission of views, the commissioning of studies, discussions through an online forum, work by an ad hoc technical expert group and consideration of the outcomes by the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice.

62. The meeting of the Parties will be invited to consider this item on the basis of a recommendation 24/5 from the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (see the draft decision in CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).

ITEM 15. DETECTION AND IDENTIFICATION OF LIVING MODIFIED ORGANISMS

63. In decision CP-9/11, Parties were invited to submit information on: (a) their capacities and needs with regard to detection and identification of living modified organisms; and (b) a list of laboratories, including information on the specific activities carried out by such laboratories. The meeting of the Parties also requested the Executive Secretary to continue the facilitation of online discussions of the Network of Laboratories for the Detection and Identification of Living Modified Organisms, as well as to continue capacity building efforts.

64. Document CBD/CP/MOP/10/10/Rev.1 provides a summary of activities on detection and identification undertaken by the Secretariat in the intersessional period. Additional information is contained in document CBD/CP/MOP/10/INF/4, which provides a synthesis of information on detection and identification of living modified organisms, and in document CBD/CP/MOP/10/INF/5, which contains a summary of the online discussions of the network of laboratories for the detection and identification of living modified organisms.

65. Under this item, the meeting will be invited to consider document CBD/CP/MOP/10/10/Rev.1 and to adopt a decision (reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5)).

ITEM 16. SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONSIDERATIONS (ARTICLE 26)

66. In decision CP-9/14, the meeting of the Parties took note of the “Guidance on the Assessment of Socio-Economic Considerations in the Context of Article 26 of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety” as contained in the annex to document CBD/CP/MOP/9/10.

67. The decision established a process to supplement the Guidance with examples of methodologies and applications of socio-economic considerations, preferably in the form of case studies. The process

included submissions, moderated discussions through an online forum and work by an ad hoc technical expert group.

68. Under this item, the meeting of the Parties will be invited to consider the outcomes of this process and adopt a decision (see document CBD/CP/MOP/10/11, reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5)).

ITEM 17. NAGOYA – KUALA LUMPUR SUPPLEMENTARY PROTOCOL ON LIABILITY AND REDRESS

69. The Nagoya – Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol on Liability and Redress was adopted by the fifth meeting of the Parties to the Protocol and entered into force on 5 March 2018.

70. Further to Article 10 of the Supplementary Protocol, decision CP-9/15 requested the Executive Secretary to undertake a comprehensive study addressing (a) the modalities of financial security mechanisms; (b) an assessment of the environmental, economic and social impacts of such mechanisms, in particular on developing countries; and (c) an identification of the appropriate entities to provide financial security.

71. Under this item, the meeting will have before it a note by the Executive Secretary (document CBD/CP/MOP/10/9) containing the executive summary of the study. The complete study is available as information document CBD/CP/MOP/10/INF/1. The note by the Executive Secretary also provides an update on the status of the Supplementary Protocol, steps taken to enable Parties to publish information on their competent authorities in the Biosafety Clearing-House and an overview of relevant information from the fourth national reports. The meeting will be invited to consider the document and to adopt a decision, reproduced in the compilation of draft decisions (CBD/CP/MOP/10/1/Add.5).

ITEM 18. OTHER MATTERS

72. The Parties to the Cartagena Protocol may wish to consider other matters raised and accepted for discussion in accordance with the rules of procedure.

73. Under this agenda item, the President is expected to inform the plenary about the outcome of the high-level segment held from 15 to 17 December 2022.

ITEM 19 ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

74. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol will be invited to consider and adopt the report on the work of the second part of its tenth meeting on the basis of the draft report prepared by the Rapporteur.

75. The reports of parts I (CBD/CP/MOP/10/4) and II will together constitute the proceedings of the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Protocol.

76. In accordance with established practice, the Parties will be invited to authorize the Rapporteur to complete the final report after the meeting with the guidance of the President and the assistance of the Secretariat.

ITEM 20. CLOSURE OF THE MEETING

77. It is expected that the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety will be formally closed on Monday, 19 December 2022, at approximately 6 p.m.
