二. 执行摘要

1. 本文件是提交《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会第十七届会议的报告，旨在介绍全球环境基金（GEF）响应《昆明-蒙特利尔全球生物多样性框架》（《昆蒙框架》）和 2025 年 2 月收到的缔约方大会第十六届会议对 GEF 的指导意见而开展的活动。为了更好地协助缔约方大会第十七届会议进行《昆蒙框架》集体执行进度全球审查，本报告涵盖 2022 年 7 月 1 日至 2026 年 6 月 30 日，对应整个 GEF-8 增资期。

GEF 各基金为《昆蒙框架》规划资金

2. 本报告所述期间，GEF 所有相关基金和 GEF-8 规划科目（GEF 信托基金资助的重点领域、综合方案、非赠款工具和小额赠款计划以及最不发达国家基金和气候变化特别基金、适应基金、全球生物多样性框架基金）为《昆蒙框架》累计直接规划资金 46.4 亿美元²。全环基金对应项目和方案带动共同融资 296.9 亿美元，包括来自私营部门的 24.1 亿美元，来自受援国政府的 130.5 亿美元，相当于本报告所述期间 GEF 每投资一美元即撬动共同融资 6.4 美元。

3. 这些资金共资助 649 个项目和方案，其中包括 11 个综合方案（下含 215 个生物多样性子项目）。共有 144 个国家受益于 GEF-8 核拨给《昆蒙框架》的资金。跨基金和跨规划科目的生物多样性融资，非洲占三分之一（33.3%），拉丁美洲和加勒比占四分之一（24.6%），亚洲占 24.1%，欧洲和中亚占 4.7%，其余 13.3% 用于全球和区域项目。本报告所述期间，小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家占 GEF 资助总额的 41.6%。附件 3 列有这些项目的完整清单。

4. GEF-8 对《昆蒙框架》各行动目标³的预期规划包括以下量化贡献（详见第一节）：

- 行动目标 1—规划和管理所有区域以减少生物多样性的丧失：直接影响陆地和海洋总面积 32.803 亿公顷，使生物多样性受益；改善 80 个共享水生态系统的管理。
- 行动目标 2—恢复 30% 的所有退化生态系统：1,470 万公顷陆地和生态系统在恢复中
- 行动目标 3—保护 30% 的陆地、水域和海洋：已建立或正在加强管理的保护区 22.473 亿公顷，包括保护区 22.07 亿公顷，其他基于区域的有效保护措施 4,020 万公顷。
- 行动目标 7—将污染减少到对生物多样性无害的水平：减少全球关切化学品及其废物 242,098 公吨，避免残余塑料废物 440 万公吨。

- 行动目标 8—最大限度地减少气候变化对生物多样性的影响并提高复原力和行动目标 11—恢复、维持和增进自然对人类的贡献：减少排放温室气体 68.528 亿吨（二氧化碳当量）。
- 行动目标 10—增强农业、水产养殖、渔业和林业的生物多样性和可持续性：改善陆地景观 1.431 亿公顷，改善 80 个共享淡水生态系统的管理，220 万公吨被过度捕捞的海洋渔业恢复至可持续捕捞水平。
- 行动目标 19—每年从所有来源筹集生物多样性资金 2,000 亿美元，其中 300 亿美元通过国际融资筹集：共同融资 296.9 亿美元，包括私营部门的 24.1 亿美元，按照里约标值方法计算，对生物多样性项目总投资 343.4 亿美元。
- 行动目标 22—确保所有人的生物多样性决策参与权、诉诸司法权和信息获取权和行动目标 23—在生物多样性行动中采用促进性别平等的方法确保性别平等：4,200 万人受益于生物多样性保护、可持续利用或恢复，其中包括女性 2,090 万人。

生物多样性重点领域

5. GEF-8 期间，共为 GEF 信托基金生物多样性重点领域分配资金 19.2 亿美元，其中 14.5 亿美元通过生物多样性资金透明分配系统（STAR）提供给各国，包括名义上用于综合方案的 6.41 亿美元。这笔资金已使用 17.95 亿美元（即 94%）。
6. 本报告所述期间，通过 GEF 扶持活动模式批准 4 个全球方案，资助《公约》及其议定书下的规划和报告活动，GEF 项目融资总额为 1.218 亿美元。
7. 2023 年 6 月批准的支持修订和更新国家生物多样性战略和行动计划和编写第七次国家报告总括方案（GEF 项目融资：72,035,000 美元）共资助 139 个国家。截至 2026 年 6 月 15 日，已有 57 个国家提交国家生物多样性战略和行动计划，91 个国家提交第七次国家报告。总括方案由联合国环境规划署（环境署）和联合国开发计划署（开发署）执行，其基础是 GEF-7 期间在 138 个国家启动国家框架与《昆蒙框架》相衔接的全球生物多样性框架早期行动支持项目（GEF 项目融资：39,308,274 美元）。此外，2022 年 12 月批准的支持制定生物多样性融资计划总括方案（GEF 项目融资：42,030,950 美元）资助 98 个国家制定其第一个国家生物多样性融资计划。附件 5、6 和 7 载有这一资助进展的详细信息。
8. 支持编写《卡塔赫纳生物安全议定书》执行情况第五次国家报告（GEF 项目融资：4,059,825 美元）和支持编写《关于获取遗传资源和公正和公平分享其利用所产生惠益的名古屋议定书》执行情况第一次国家报告（GEF 项目融资：3,701,250 美元）的两个项目分别资助 105 个和 96 个符合条件的缔约方履行《卡塔赫纳议定书》和《名古屋议定书》国家报告义务。两个项目均由环境署执行，2025 年 4 月批准。截至 2026 年 6 月 15 日，参与这些扶持活动的 88 个和 73 个缔约方分别提交了《卡塔赫纳议定书》和《名古屋议定书》国家报告。附件 8 和 9 载有这一资助进展的详细信息。
9. GEF 土著人民和地方社区专门供资第二期付款，即 GEF-8 养护之心脏倡议（GEF 项目融资：22,535,780 美元），于 2024 年 12 月获理事会批准。次级项目伙伴组织公开招募共收到 800 份申请，其中 10 份被土著领导人选中。第一期付款，即 GEF-7 包容性保护倡议（GEF 项目融资：22,535,780 美元），在本报告所述期间继续执行，向 12 个国家的 10

个土著人民和地方社区牵头次级项目提供直接资助。此外，如第一.4 节所示，GEF 组合的所有重点领域都批准了许多资助土著人民和地方社区的项目。

10. 关于《生物多样性公约》的两项议定书即《卡塔赫纳生物安全议定书》和《关于获取遗传资源和公正和公平分享其利用所产生惠益的名古屋议定书》的活动，分别在第一.2 节和附件 1 和 2 中作了详细介绍。各基金资助 7 个国家根据行动目标 17 执行生物安全措施，GEF 项目融资总额 1,780 万美元，撬动共同融资 4,980 万美元。资助 15 个国家根据行动目标 13 执行获取和惠益分享，包括支持批准《名古屋议定书》，GEF 项目融资总额 5,700 万美元，撬动共同融资 2.663 亿美元。

其他重点领域和规划科目

11. 根据 GEF 一体化议程和《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会跨公约协同作用指导意见，通过 GEF 信托基金的土地退化、气候变化、国际水域、化学品和废物重点领域规划的资金中，有 22.1 亿美元，即 59%，用于执行《昆蒙框架》。关于 GEF 信托基金通过其他重点领域和规划科目为《昆蒙框架》核拨的资金详见第一.3 节。

12. GEF-8 规划指南增加了对创新混合融资解决办法的承诺。本报告所述期间批准了 8 个直接支持《昆蒙框架》的混合融资项目，包括印度尼西亚、卢旺达和马达加斯加的 3 个创新生物多样性成果债券，拉丁美洲和加勒比的 1 个债务换自然机制，3 个粮食和农业部门项目。GEF 为这些项目融资 1.228 亿美元，撬动共同融资 20.3 亿美元。GEF 向生物多样性混合融资项目每投资 1 美元，就能额外撬动 16.60 美元。

13. 本报告所述期间对小额赠款计划进行了宏伟改革，称为 SGP 2.0，以更好地支持《昆蒙框架》的全社会办法。4 个小额赠款计划全球核心项目（涵盖 135 个国家）获批准，2023 年 6 月至 2024 年 12 月 GEF 共融资 2.415 亿美元，共同融资 1.157 亿美元。改革使国家对执行机构有了更多选择，扩大了国家覆盖面，增加了资源，改善了公平获取，向民间社会提供了更大份额的资金，并试行了新的方法，包括一个民间社会组织挑战方案和小额信贷倡议。2022 年 7 月 31 日至 2025 年 6 月 30 日，执行中的赠款项目达 5,952 个，赠款总额 2.26 亿美元，共同融资总额 2.238 亿美元，平均占组合的 43%。在此期间完成的 992 个小额赠款计划生物多样性项目改善了多达 154 个保护区和多达 260 个土著人民和地方社区保护区的管理，总面积达 1,050 万公顷。小额赠款计划项目还帮助维持或改善了至少 873 个物种的保护状况。

全球生物多样性框架基金

14. 《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会第十五届会议要求设立一个专门的、可资利用的、能够从所有来源迅速调动和支付新额外资源的基金。应此要求，GEF 以创纪录的速度设立了 GBFF 并将其投入运作。该基金采用简化的项目周期和扩大的治理安排，包括增设 10 个理事会观察员席位，设立一个由来自发展中国家（其境内有特别重要的生物多样性和生态系统功能和服务区域）的专家组成的附属机构，一个由非主权参与方组成的咨询小组。第二节详细介绍了 GBFF 的运作及其扩大的治理、资源调动和规划。

15. 从 2023 年 8 月启动到 2026 年 6 月 30 日，GBFF 从 11 个主权政府和 1 个次国家政府收到书面承诺 3.872 亿美元。经 5 轮竞争性选择，这些资金规划给 87 个国家（包括 47 个小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家）的项目，规划总额 3.621 亿美元。为展示交付速度，

截至 2026 年 6 月 30 日，31 个编制就绪的 GBFF 项目（GBFF 融资 1.495 亿美元）已得到首席执行官背书，从而为执行扫清了障碍。

16. GBFF 理事会制定的所有三个组合层面目标都已实现。38.8%的资金规划给小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家，而目标为 36%+3%；30.4%的资金通过国际金融机构规划，而目标为 25%；31.8%的规划资金分配给土著人民和地方社区的生物多样性行动，而目标为 20%。

对缔约方大会指导意见的回应，包括 GEF-9 一揽子计划

17. 本报告第四节详细总结了 GEF 对缔约方大会第十六届会议指导意见的回应。

18. GEF 通过其信托基金第九次增资对《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会 GEF-9 资金需求评估进行了处理。增资参与方为 2026 年 7 月 1 日至 2030 年 6 月 30 日期间认捐初始资金 39 亿美元。GEF-9 总资源的 35%分配给生物多样性重点领域，使该领域保持其最大重点领域地位。还决定，按照里约标值方法计算，GEF-9 的 70%的规划应助力实现《生物多样性公约》的目标。

19. 对指导意见的其他主要回应包括将实现缔约方大会第十六届会议通过的《生物多样性公约》及其议定书成果导向四年期生物多样性方案重点框架的所有要素列入 GEF-9 的规划指南；GEF-9 政策建议包括一个一揽子 21 项改革，围绕 5 个政策目标展开：加速和简化交付、扩大获取和赋权国家、适当架构和代表性、负担得起的规模化融资、灵活和有效执行。这些措施扩展了 GEF-8 期间就已通过的政策改革和 GBFF 试行的创新，以全面响应《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会的指导意见。

执行中的项目组合和政策改革进度

20. 截至 2026 年 6 月 30 日，执行中的跨 GEF 基金和规划科目的生物多样性相关项目组合价值达到 48 亿美元。包括 658 个项目，其中 231 个项目完全由 GEF 信托基金生物多样性重点领域融资，总额 11 亿美元。

21. GEF-8 为简化和加快获取资金过程而采取的改革的累积效应，在提交 GEF 信托基金的所有申请的项目组合处理数据中均有体现。对于大型项目，从首次提交项目概念（立项申请表）到首次发放资金的平均处理时间从 GEF-6 的 44.2 个月和 GEF-7 的 42.1 个月下降到 GEF-8 的 30 个月，比两个周期前缩短了 14.2 个月即三分之一。

22. 截至 2025 年 6 月，执行中的生物多样性组合中，86%的项目的执行进度评分处于满意范围，88%的项目实现其发展目标的可能性评分处于满意范围，高于 GEF 的平均水平。

23. 报告 2022 年 7 月至 2025 年 6 月在 GEF 核心指标方面取得成果的执行中的项目子集对《昆蒙框架》行动目标作出了重要贡献。这 277 个项目共获 GEF 资金 17 亿美元，其成果包括：

- 行动目标 1：直接影响陆地和海洋总面积 5.789 亿公顷，使生物多样性受益。
- 行动目标 2：2,550 万公顷土地和生态系统得到恢复。
- 行动目标 3：建立和/或改善管理的保护区面积 3.409 亿公顷，其中一半是通过 GEF 资助建立的新保护区。

- 行动目标 7：减少全球关切化学品及其废物 32,134 公吨。
- 行动目标 8 和行动目标 11：减少排放温室气体 8.817 亿公吨（二氧化碳当量）。
- 行动目标 10：8,070 万公顷陆地景观采用改良做法，25 个共享水生态系统的管理得到改善。
- 行动目标 19：共同融资 72 亿美元，包括私营部门的 2.329 亿美元，按照里约标值方法计算，对生物多样性项目总投资 89 亿美元。
- 行动目标 22 和行动目标 23：640 万人从生物多样性保护、可持续利用或恢复中受益，其中女性 320 万人。

24. GEF 独立评估办公室开展了 11 项与生物多样性重点领域相关的评估，包括 GBFF 第一次和第二次形成性评估以及 GEF 第八次全面评估。第六节总结了这些评估的关键讯息和得到 GEF 理事会背书的 GEF 秘书处管理层的回应。

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一. 支持执行《生物多样性公约》的项目活动

1. 本文件是提交《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会第十七届会议的报告，旨在介绍全球环境基金（GEF）根据《昆明-蒙特利尔全球生物多样性框架》和2025年2月收到的缔约方会议第十六届会议对GEF的指导意见而开展的活动。本报告涵盖时间为2022年7月1日至2026年6月30日。

一.1 GEF 各基金为支持《昆明-蒙特利尔全球生物多样性框架》而进行的规划工作

2. GEF-8的规划指南和GBFF的规划指南是为支持执行《昆蒙框架》而制定的，同时在最不发达国家基金和气候变化特别基金中追踪生物多样性的附带效益，这两个基金是根据《联合国气候变化框架公约》（UNFCCC）设立的两个气候变化适应基金。

3. 表1汇总了本报告所述期间所有相关GEF基金和规划科目对《昆蒙框架》的累积规划资金。根据经济合作与发展组织发展援助委员会（经合组织发援会）里约标值方法⁴，GEF-8批准的用于实现《生物多样性公约》长期目标和行动目标的资金总额为46.4亿美元⁵。其中82%通过GEF信托基金规划，42.9%通过GEF-8综合方案规划。最不发达国家基金和气候变化特别基金合计占10%，而2023年所设GBFF占这一总数的7.8%。

4. 这些项目撬动共同融资296.9亿美元。也就是说，GEF在项目中为《昆蒙框架》投入的每一美元都带来6.4美元额外资金，使资金总额达到343.4亿美元。表2提供了按来源分列的共同融资细目，其中包括来自私营部门的24.1亿美元和来自受援国政府的130.5亿美元。

5. 这些资金支持了511个GEF信托基金项目和方案，包括11个综合方案（见第一.2节）。还支持了GBFF下的82个项目（见第二.2节）、最不发达国家基金和气候变化特别基金下的56个项目（见第三节），其中包括23个多信托基金项目，这些多信托基金项目整合了这些信托基金和GEF信托基金之间的资源。

6. 在生物多样性重点领域之外为《昆蒙框架》规划的大量资金，反映出GEF理事会为GEF信托基金设定的目标，即在GEF-8期间实现GEF资金的百分之六十（60%）用于生物多样性，按照经合组织发援会里约标值方法衡量，是一个主要或曰重要目标。这个目标响应了《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会的指导意见，该指导意见要求GEF-8促进GEF所服务的各公约在执行中的协同作用。GEF-8超过了这一目标，71%的GEF信托基金规划被标记为与生物多样性相关。

7. 表3开列了区域细目，以及分配给小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家的GEF资源的数额和百分比以及相关的共同融资。为生物多样性相关项目规划的资金，非洲占三分之一（33.3%），拉丁美洲和加勒比占四分之一（24.6%），亚洲占24.1%，欧洲和中亚占4.7%。本报告所述期间，小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家合计获得各基金和规划科目所规划的生物多样性相关资金的41.6%。

8. 本报告所述期间，GEF各基金资助的项目都是针对《昆蒙框架》所有23个行动目标¹²的行动。表4列出了GEF-8综合方案对实现各行动目标的贡献。《昆蒙框架》行动目标的具体预期成果包括：

- 行动目标1—规划和管理所有区域以减少生物多样性的丧失：直接影响陆地和海洋总面积32.803亿公顷，使生物多样性受益；改善80个共享水生态系统的管理。
- 行动目标2—恢复30%的所有退化生态系统：1,470万公顷陆地和生态系统得到恢复。
- 行动目标3—保护30%的陆地、水域和海洋：建立或改善管理22.473亿公顷保护区，包括保护区22.07亿公顷，其他基于区域的有效保护措施4,020万公顷。
- 行动目标7—将污染减少到对生物多样性无害的水平：减少全球关切化学品及其废物242,098公吨，避免残余塑料废物440万公吨。
- 行动目标8—最大限度地减少气候变化对生物多样性的影响并提高复原力和行动目标11—恢复、维持和增进自然对人类的贡献：减少排放温室气体68.528亿公吨（二氧化碳当量）。
- 行动目标10—增强农业、水产养殖、渔业和林业的生物多样性和可持续性：改善陆地景观1.431亿公顷，改善80个共享淡水生态系统的管理，220万公吨被过度捕捞的海洋渔业恢复至可持续捕捞水平。

- 行动目标19—每年从所有来源筹集生物多样性资金2,000亿美元，其中300亿美元通过国际融资筹集：共同融资296.9亿美元，包括私营部门的24.1亿美元，按照里约标准值方法计算，对生物多样性项目总投资343.4亿美元。
- 行动目标22—确保所有人的生物多样性决策参与权、诉诸司法权和信息获取权和行动目标23—在生物多样性行动中采用促进性别平等的方法确保性别平等：4,200万人受益于生物多样性保护、可持续利用或恢复，其中包括女性2,090万人。

9. GEF通过GEF信托基金和GBFF资助的14个项目至少在17个国家（阿根廷、巴哈马、巴巴多斯、科摩罗、库克群岛、斐济、印度、印度尼西亚、马达加斯加、马绍尔群岛、瑙鲁、纽埃、塞舌尔、汤加、图瓦卢和委内瑞拉）支持实现行动目标6—将外来入侵物种引进率减少50%并尽量降低其影响。这些项目旨在预防、控制和管理外来入侵物种，GEF融资总额为8,150万美元，撬动共同融资3.664亿美元。

10. GEF通过GEF信托基金和GBFF资助的15个独立项目支持15个国家（伯利兹、巴西、布基纳法索、柬埔寨、赤道几内亚、斯威士兰、洪都拉斯、印度、印度尼西亚、马来西亚、密克罗尼西亚、巴基斯坦、泰国、斯里兰卡和也门）实现行动目标13—增加遗传资源、数字序列信息和传统知识的惠益分享。这些项目旨在改善获取和惠益分享，包括支持伯利兹、泰国和斯里兰卡批准《名古屋议定书》。GEF项目融资总额5,700万美元，撬动共同融资2.663亿美元。

11. GEF通过资助7个国家（冈比亚、洪都拉斯、牙买加、南非、斯里兰卡、苏丹和乌兹别克斯坦）实施生物安全措施独立项目支持实现行动目标17—加强生物安全，分配生物技术惠益。洪都拉斯和斯里兰卡的项目还有助于实现行动目标13。GEF共为这7个项目融资1,780万美元，撬动共同融资4,980万美元。

12. GEF-8国家生物多样性融资计划全球总括方案资助98个国家根据《昆蒙框架》行动目标18—每年至少减少5000亿美元的有害激励措施，扩大有利于生物多样性的激励措施，对激励措施和补贴进行全面评估。截至2026年6月，15个国家完成了全面生物多样性补贴报告，71个国家正在利用开发署生物多样性融资倡议（BIOFIN）方法作为标准化分析框架，积极起草和完成补贴评估报告，确保全球一致性，同时适应各国国情。

13. GEF项目对实现行动目标20—加强生物多样性能力建设、技术转让和科技合作和行动目标21—确保可获取现有知识指导生物多样性行动作出了重要贡献。虽然没有用GEF信托基金核心指标具体衡量，但大多数（如果不是全部）项目都积极支持这些行动目标，以实现方案和项目目标。

14. GEF土著人民和地方社区及性别平等政策框架确保所有GEF投资有助于实现行动目标22—确保所有人的生物多样性决策参与权、诉诸司法权和信息获取权和行动目标23—在生物多样性行动中采用促进性别平等的方法确保性别平等。

一.2 生物多样性重点领域的规划

15. GEF-8生物多样性重点领域战略响应了《生物多样性公约》及其议定书的目标以及涉及GEF的生物多样性相关公约的目标。其目标是保护、可持续利用和恢复具有全球意义的生物多样性。

16. 为实现这一目标，该战略支持以下三个目的：

- (1) 改进自然生态系统的保护、可持续利用和恢复；
- (2) 有效执行《卡塔赫纳议定书》和《名古屋议定书》；
- (3) 加大国内生物多样性资源调动力度。

17. GEF-8期间共向生物多样性重点领域拨款19.2亿美元，包括通过生物多样性STAR系统向各国提供的14.5亿美元，其中6.41亿美元名义上用于资助综合方案。这些数字包括机构费用和项目编制赠款。

18. 为生物多样性相关项目规划资金17.95亿美元，占分配资金的94%。表5按规划科目列出细目。GEF-8期间生物多样性STAR分配资金14.5亿美元，14亿美元已规划完毕

（97%），其中13.2亿美元作为生物多样性STAR编列在生物多样性重点领域科目下，此外还根据GEF业务联络员的决定，充分利用STAR的分配灵活性，为气候变化和土地退化两个重点领域编列8,500万美元。

19. 这些资金资助了生物多样性相关项目83个、多领域项目317个、规划方法21个（其中包括11个综合方案）。综合方案和其他方案包含子项目206个。144个国家受益于这些投资中受益。这些项目的完整清单见本报告附件3。

20. 附件4列出了本报告所述期间向GEF信托基金提出生物多样性重点领域供资申请但未获批准的项目及其理由。有14个因不符合GEF供资条件或未被竞争性非赠款工具窗口选中被拒绝的项目。有被执行机构放弃的项目，其中许多以另一种形式重新提交（例如作为

两步中型项目而不是一步中型项目）而获批准。还有2个自动放弃的项目，因为它们尚未完成技术审核并提交批准而周期已经结束。

支持执行《生物多样性公约卡塔赫纳生物安全议定书》

21. GEF-8期间符合条件的缔约方共提交8个与执行《卡塔赫纳议定书》有关的项目，其中4个提交GEF信托基金，4个项目编制赠款申请提交GBFF。提交GEF信托基金的所有项目都获得批准。提交GBFF的4个项目编制赠款申请有3个在GBFF的竞争性分配过程中被选中。

22. 在各基金中，7个国家（冈比亚、洪都拉斯、牙买加、南非、斯里兰卡、苏丹、乌兹别克斯坦）通过独立项目获得资助，根据行动目标17实施生物安全措施，GEF项目融资总额1,780万美元，撬动共同融资4,980万美元。

23. 支持行动目标17的项目的一个例子是根据《卡塔赫纳生物安全议定书》在乌兹别克斯坦执行国家生物安全框架（GEF编号11988；GEF项目融资：1,784,863美元；执行机构：国际自然保护联盟），旨在通过支持制定和实施生物安全政策以及监管和体制框架，并通过建设改性活生物体风险评估、风险管理的国家能力和改进监测，消除阻碍乌兹别克斯坦安全处理改性活生物体的障碍。公众意识运动和能力建设活动将促进各利益攸关方的知识。

支持批准和执行《生物多样性公约关于获取遗传资源和公正和公平分享其利用所产生惠益的名古屋议定书》

24. GEF信托基金收到8份与行动目标13有关的供资申请，GBFF收到17份项目编制赠款申请，包括在GBFF几轮选择中重新提交相同申请。向GEF信托基金提交的所有申请都获得批准。GBFF项目编制赠款的17个申请有7个在GBFF的竞争性分配过程中被选中。

25. 在GEF信托基金和GBFF中，15个国家（伯利兹、巴西、布基纳法索、柬埔寨、赤道几内亚、斯威士兰、洪都拉斯、印度、印度尼西亚、马来西亚、密克罗尼西亚、巴基斯坦、斯里兰卡、泰国、也门）通过15个独立项目得到资助，根据行动目标13实施获取和惠益分享，包括支持伯利兹、泰国和斯里兰卡批准《名古屋议定书》。这些项目的GEF项目融资总额为5,700万美元，撬动共同融资2.663亿美元。

26. 支持行动目标13的项目的一个例子是加强马来西亚的获取和惠益分享框架、数字合规和私营部门-社区伙伴关系（GEF编号12154；GEF项目融资：4,651,950美元；执行机构：开发署）旨在解决马来西亚2017年获取和惠益分享法案持续存在的执行差距，特别是需要最终确定附属法规，标准化国家标准操作程序，建立检查站尽职调查机制，澄清与《生物多样性公约》多边机制一致的国家数字序列信息做法，加强国家秘书处和用户能力，加强土著人民和地方社区的途径以确保有助于生物多样性的公平惠益分享。预期结果是一个全面运作、数字化、可信的获取和惠益分享系统，这个系统可提高合规性、使土著人民和地方社区受益，为实地保护提供资金。

扶持活动

27. 本报告所述期间批准了4个全球方案，通过GEF扶持活动模式支持《生物多样性公约》及其议定书下的规划和报告。

- 2023年6月，通过一个由环境署作为GEF机构的项目（GEF项目融资：36,435,000美元）和一个由开发署作为GEF机构的项目（GEF项目融资：35,600,000美元），批准了支持修订和更新国家生物多样性战略和行动计划以及编写第七次国家报告的总括方案。每个项目有三个构成部分：构成部分1侧重于修订和更新现有的国家生物多样性战略和行动计划，以与《昆蒙框架》保持一致；构成部分2旨在支持各国使用《昆蒙框架》监测框架的指标完成第七次国家报告。两者都建立在GEF-7全球生物多样性框架早期行动支持项目开始的工作的基础上并对其补充。构成部分3包括全球知识支持和学习以及技术援助。总括方案在每个国家有两个主要产出：经修订的国家生物多样性战略和行动计划和《生物多样性公约》国家报告。截至2026年6月15日，总括方案共资助139个国家，其中57个国家提交了国家生物多样性战略和行动计划，91个国家提交了第七次国家报告。附件6提供了各参加国状况的详细报告。
- 支持制定生物多样性融资计划的总括方案（GEF项目融资：42,030,950美元）于2022年12月获得批准，2026年6月进行了修订，以增加7个此前未申请资助的符合条件的国家。方案旨在通过支持98个国家制定国家生物多样性融资计划，包括基线诊断、能力和机构安排，大规模调动资源执行《昆蒙框架》。该活动响应GEF生物多样性战略的目标三，支持国内资源调动，支持尚未受益于开发署生物多样性融资倡议的国家。总括方案建立了一个全球知识共享和技术支持平台，以便在伙伴组织的参与下，在参加国之间分享知识和经验。平台提供专门的专家技术建议，支持国家进程，解决技术和财务问题。附件7提供了各参加国状况的详细报告。
- 2025年4月批准了由环境署执行的支持编写《卡塔赫纳生物安全议定书》执行情况第五次国家报告方案（GEF项目融资：4,059,825美元）。方案支持105个符合条件的《卡塔赫纳议定书》缔约方履行国家报告义务。截至2026年6月15日，已有88个国家提交了第五次国家报告。附件8提供了各参加国状况的详细报告。
- 2025年4月批准了支持编写《关于获取遗传资源和公正和公平分享其利用所产生惠益的名古屋议定书》执行情况第一次国家报告方案，方案由环境署执行（GEF项目融资：3,701,250美元），支持96个符合条件的《名古屋议定书》缔约方履行国家报告义务。截至2026年6月15日，已有73个提交了第一次国家报告。附件9提供了各参加国状况的详细报告。

GEF 综合方案对《昆明-蒙特利尔全球生物多样性框架》行动目标的贡献

28. GEF-8的规划指南¹⁸指出了GEF-8的11个综合方案对执行2020年后全球生物多样性框架即后来通过的《昆蒙框架》¹⁹的潜在贡献。下文列出了每个综合方案，并简要说明其对《昆蒙框架》行动目标的贡献，包括其对GEF核心指标的预期贡献。

29. 所有综合方案都有助于实现**行动目标20**和**行动目标21**。虽然未经GEF核心指标具体衡量，但大多数子项目和每个综合方案的全球协调项目都嵌入了对这些行动目标的支持，因为这些行动目标与实现综合方案的目标和目的相关。同样，对于**行动目标22**和**行动目标23**，在国家一级执行《昆蒙框架》的重点是公平、包容和促进性别平等的参与以及性别平等。GEF关于土著人民和地方社区和性别平等政策框架确保GEF信托基金下的所有GEF投资都有助于实现这些行动目标。总体而言，综合方案通过以区域为基础的保护/可持续利用/生物多样性主流化以及支持生物多样性保护和可持续利用的政策协调，有助于实现**行动目标11**，产生大规模的生物多样性成果。

30. **生态系统恢复综合方案**。参加国：安哥拉、巴西、柬埔寨、乍得、刚果民主共和国、科特迪瓦、海地、马达加斯加、马里、毛里塔尼亚、墨西哥、莫桑比克、尼泊尔、秘鲁、卢旺达、圣多美和普林西比、塞拉利昂、南非、乌兹别克斯坦、越南。目标是通过采用综合和创新的方法来恢复退化的生态系统，产生多种持久的全球环境和社会经济效益。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果：

- 642,000公顷陆地保护区的管理得到改善：**行动目标3**。
- 170万公顷土地和生态系统得到恢复：**行动目标2**。
- 600万公顷陆地景观采用有益于生物多样性的改良做法：**行动目标10**。
- 减少排放温室气体1.7亿公吨（mtCO₂e）：**行动目标8**和**行动目标11**。
- 1个共享淡水生态系统的管理得到改善：**行动目标1**和**行动目标10**。
- 300万人受益于GEF融资的投资（150万女性和150万男性）：**行动目标22**和**行动目标23**。

31. 此外，综合方案将有助于推动国家层面生态系统恢复的政策一致性，方法是改变政策，克服恢复障碍和/或抑制因素，使更多的私营部门能够参与（**行动目标14**和**15**）。综合方案还支持以恢复目标生态系统为重点的综合性空间分析计划（**行动目标1**）。

32. **蓝绿岛屿综合方案**。参加国家：伯利兹、佛得角、科摩罗、古巴、马尔代夫、毛里求斯、密克罗尼西亚、帕劳、巴布亚新几内亚、萨摩亚、塞舌尔、圣卢西亚、东帝汶、特立尼达和多巴哥、瓦努阿图。目标是在小岛屿发展中国家促进自然向好发展，减少生态系统退化，方法是珍视自然，将基于自然的解决方案具体应用于粮食、旅游和城市部门。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果：

- 新建20,057公顷陆地保护区：**行动目标3**。
- 新建1,453,483公顷海洋保护区：**行动目标3**。
- 243,712公顷陆地保护区的管理得到改善：**行动目标3**。
- 2,284,348公顷海洋保护区的管理得到改善：**行动目标3**。
- 77,356公顷土地和生态系统得到恢复：**行动目标2**。
- 178,540公顷陆地景观采用有益于生物多样性的改良做法：**行动目标10**。
- 398,005公顷海洋生境采用改良做法：**行动目标10**。

- 2个渔区实行纳入生物多样性考虑的第三方认证：**行动目标10**。
- 减少排放温室气体51,324,458公吨（直接）和892,793公吨（间接）（mtCO₂e）：**行动目标8和行动目标11**。
- 2个共享水系统的管理得到改善：**行动目标10**。
- 237,019公吨全球过度开发的海洋渔业恢复到更可持续的水平：**行动目标10**。
- 734,422人受益于GEF融资的投资（351,024名女性和383,398名男性）：**行动目标22和行动目标23**。

33. 此外，综合方案旨在通过加强能力将自然价值纳入国家一级关键经济部门包括纳入部门规划来推进政策一致性（**行动目标14**）；推进国家财政规划和国内资源调动（**行动目标19**）。

34. **净零自然向好加速器综合方案**。参加国：智利、哥斯达黎加、科特迪瓦、印度尼西亚、毛里求斯、墨西哥、摩洛哥、尼日利亚、坦桑尼亚、泰国、特立尼达和多巴哥、越南。目标是加强机构和催化投资，以加快自然向好的净零路径。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果。虽然这些数字目标貌似平平，但综合方案将重心放在加强体制、监管、财政和金融环境，对促进执行《昆蒙框架》具有最大的潜力。这有助于执行净零自然向好战略，同时使国家预算与国家发展和环境可持续性目标保持一致。它可能会对更有力地实现下列行动目标产生重大的连锁效应，为实现这些行动目标作出更大的长期贡献，并可能对**行动目标3、8、14、18和19**作出贡献。

- 39,312公顷土地和生态系统得到恢复：**行动目标2**。
- 75,753公顷陆地景观采用有益于生物多样性的改良做法，577,500公顷生产性土地的管理得到改善：**行动目标10**。
- 新建56,740公顷陆地保护区：**行动目标3**。
- 690,819公顷陆地保护区的管理得到改善：**行动目标3**。
- 减少排放温室气体23,505,000公吨（直接）和43,143,968公吨（间接）（mtCO₂e）：**行动目标8和行动目标11**。
- 1,660,496人受益于GEF融资的投资（803,196名女性和857,300名男性）：**行动目标22和行动目标23**。

35. **塑料污染循环解决办法综合方案**。参加国：巴西、布基纳法索、柬埔寨、库克群岛、哥斯达黎加、多米尼加共和国、印度、约旦、老挝人民民主共和国、摩洛哥、尼日利亚、秘鲁、菲律宾、塞内加尔、南非。目标是在粮食和饮料行业向塑料循环经济过渡，以防止塑料污染。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果：²⁰

- 避免1,504,086.20公吨残余塑料废物：**行动目标7、行动目标15和行动目标16。**
- 6,680,661人受益于GEF融资的投资（3,330,055名女性和3,344,708名男性）：**行动目标22和行动目标23。**
- 减少131.26克有毒当量无意持久性有机污染物：**行动目标7。**

36. 此外，塑料综合方案通过制定和加强塑料循环经济的国家监管和政策框架，包括关于生产者责任延伸制度、产品标准、再利用和再填充系统、采购、生态设计以及淘汰或减少有问题和不必要的一次性塑料的措施，推进政策一致性。这有助于通过将减少塑料污染纳入行业政策和决策实现**行动目标14**。通过与粮食和饮料行业、零售商、品牌、生产者责任组织、金融机构和中小型企业合作，综合方案还支持提高塑料包装价值链的透明度、数据收集、报告和商业责任。这些措施有助于企业了解并减少其对生物多样性的影响，同时为消费者和市场提供更好的信息，支持更可持续的选择，为**行动目标15**作出贡献。综合方案非常重视上游和中游措施，以减少消费量，避免产生废物，淘汰不必要的一次性塑料，并扩大再利用、填充、重新设计、替代和循环商业等模式。这些做法可促进可持续消费模式，减少塑料使用和废物的全球足迹，直接推动**行动目标16**。最后，通过建立支持塑料行业循环经济最佳实践的法规、激励措施、财政措施、标准和机构协调机制，综合方案有助于为循环解决方案创造有利的政策环境，同时加强政府各部门之间的协调一致，确保减少塑料污染的措施不会因相互矛盾的政策、补贴或市场信号而受到削弱。这有助于实现**行动目标18**，并通过直接减少塑料污染、避免残留塑料废物和减少露天焚烧造成的无意持久性有机污染物排放来强化**行动目标7**。

37. **消除供应链中的危险化学品综合方案。** 参加国：柬埔寨、哥斯达黎加、厄瓜多尔、印度、蒙古、巴基斯坦、秘鲁、特立尼达和多巴哥。目标是将时尚和建筑供应链转变为“绿色设计”方式，加强这一转变所需的有利环境。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果：

- 289万公顷陆地景观采用有益于生物多样性的改良做法：**行动目标10。**
- 减少排放温室气体2,965,038公吨（直接）和7,700,780公吨（间接）（mtCO₂e）：**行动目标8和行动目标11。**

38. 此外，供应链综合方案旨在利用融资并影响资金流、采购系统、补贴、激励措施和投资标准，支持可持续和循环供应链，包括通过孵化器、混合和促进性别平等的融资、绿

色贷款、财政激励措施、可持续采购和基于市场的机制，帮助企业采用更安全的材料、清洁生产和循环商业模式。这有助于为生物多样性向好和无污染生产系统调动和整合资源，从而有助于实现**行动目标19**。综合方案还有助于加强为创新、更安全和更可持续产品创造和扩大市场所需的监管和政策环境，包括通过标准、认证体系、生态标签、进口控制、生产者责任延伸、绿色公共采购以及经济和财政政策改革。这些措施有助于**行动目标14**，将生物多样性、污染预防和循环经济考虑纳入时尚、建筑、纺织、皮革和相关供应链的行业政策和决策。最后，综合方案的方案层面指标跟踪法律、行政和政策措施，这些措施旨在鼓励和支持企业（包括大型跨国公司和金融机构）降低污染风险、提高透明度和可追溯性、评估和管理依赖性和影响，并为消费者和市场提供支持更安全、更可持续消费模式的可靠信息。这有助于实现**行动目标15**，同时也通过减少浪费、促进循环以及将消费转向更持久、影响更小的产品的措施强化**行动目标16**。

39. 亚马孙可持续陆地景观综合方案。参加国：玻利维亚、巴西、哥伦比亚、厄瓜多尔、圭亚那、秘鲁、苏里南、委内瑞拉。综合方案第三阶段的目标是改善区域合作和国家投资，实现包括亚马孙地区原始森林在内的目标地区的综合景观保护和可持续管理。综合方案始于GEF-6。将在前两个GEF周期的基础上，继续与土著人民和地方社区密切合作，促进其赋权和社会生物经济和相关价值链（**行动目标5、9和22**）。综合方案还促进走廊的保护和恢复，协调对亚马孙生物群落保护的财政支持（**行动目标19**）。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果：

54. 综合方案致力于在交通基础设施的最初阶段就将生物多样性纳入其主流，因为这一阶段对生物多样性和气候的潜在影响最大。这有助于**行动目标2、3、5、8、9、10、11、22和23**。综合方案通过 a) 避免或减少交通基础设施发展对生态系统的负面影响，b) 创造有利条件将生物多样性向好的交通基础设施解决方案纳入国家基础设施组合的主流，激励养护健康的生态系统，助力实现全球环境效益和《昆蒙框架》各行动目标。

55. **可持续城市综合方案**。参加国：阿尔及利亚、伯利兹、贝宁、智利、中国、刚果、古巴、加蓬、危地马拉、肯尼亚、马达加斯加、马来西亚、马里、蒙古、秘鲁、菲律宾、塞尔维亚、南非、斯里兰卡、津巴布韦。目标是支持城市和地方政府进行综合城市规划，实施政策，投资于自然向好、气候复原力和碳中和城市发展。综合方案旨在实现以下有助于《昆蒙框架》的成果：

56. GEF 信托基金的土地退化、气候变化、国际水域、化学品和废物 4 个重点领域，通过各综合方案，通过将资源与生物多样性重点领域相结合的多重点领域项目，通过完全由这 4 个重点领域资助的项目，为生物多样性作出贡献。表 6 详细列出了按照经合组织发援会里约标值方法计算这些重点领域规划的有助于《昆蒙框架》的资源。这 4 个重点领域规划的有助于《昆蒙框架》的资源达 22.13 亿美元（占 GEF 资源的 59%）。

58. **超越“30×30”：通过加强跨境合作确保东热带太平洋地区的复原力**（厄瓜多尔、哥斯达黎加、哥伦比亚、巴拿马）（GEF 项目融资：15,673,000 美元，共同融资：53,383,037 美元）。项目由国际水域重点领域提供资金支持，预期通过加强区域治理、确保区域连通性、改善气候复原力管理、协调可持续蓝色经济投资和养护工作，加强东热带太平洋海洋走廊区域至少 31,250,000 公顷海洋保护区的长期复原力和养护。

59. **通过海洋旗舰开启蓝色太平洋繁荣之路**（库克群岛、斐济、基里巴斯、马绍尔群岛、密克罗尼西亚、纽埃、帕劳、萨摩亚、所罗门群岛、汤加、图瓦卢、瓦努阿图）（GEF 项目融资：18,048,624 美元；共同融资：102,706,318 美元）。这一国际水域重点领域项目旨在协助执行一项由太平洋国家主导的倡议，以可持续的方式管理和保护太平洋岛国的广阔领海。其目标是可持续管理 100% 的太平洋海域，到 2030 年保护至少 30% 的海洋区域，建立拥有健全粮食系统的健康、有复原力的社区，所有这些都得到创新和“切合实际”的融资支持。项目由国际水域重点领域提供资金支持，旨在对 8.4 亿公顷海洋生境

采用改良做法，将2,900吨海洋渔业产量提升至更可持续的水平，通过新建或改进合作管理机制促进共享水域生态系统建设，使3,045,597人直接受益，其中1,492,940人为女性。

60. 转变大规模投资方式支持执行绿色长城倡议（区域、布基纳法索、乍得、埃塞俄比亚、冈比亚、马里、毛里塔尼亚、尼日尔、尼日利亚、塞内加尔）（GEF项目融资：86,998,782美元；共同融资：2,998,018,615美元）。这个多信托基金和多重点领域方案融合生物多样性、气候变化和土地退化重点领域以及最不发达国家基金的资源。方案的目标是，在适应活动的支持下，加强地方和区域可持续土地管理能力，采用跨国和协调一致的方法，为生活在萨赫勒绿色长城地区干旱和半干旱环境中的有复原力的社区恢复陆地景观和生态系统服务。方案以绿色长城倡议的现有基线为基础，旨在通过4个相互关联的组成部分实现其目标：（一）加强萨赫勒地区以性别平等和气候韧性方式恢复陆地景观的有利环境；（二）利用可持续融资扩大适应气候变化的投资；（三）通过可持续土地管理做法和基于生态系统的适应，提高生态系统和社区的复原力；（四）加强绿色长城国家的知识管理和信息传播。方案与《昆蒙框架》**行动目标2、8、10、11和14**相一致。

61. 综合协作促进可持续旅游业方案（全球-伯利兹、多米尼加共和国、埃及、洪都拉斯、印度尼西亚、牙买加、马尔代夫、墨西哥、摩洛哥、塞舌尔、坦桑尼亚、特立尼达和多巴哥、土耳其、瓦努阿图；GEF项目融资：81,834,862美元；共同融资：737,768,029美元）。方案由化学品和废物、国际水域2个重点领域资助，是一个多国规划倡议，旨在通过为可持续做法营造有利环境来推动旅游业的变革。方案通过实施基于自然的解决方案和可持续土地管理做法，扭转旅游业对生物多样性丧失的不利影响，促进生态系统的保护和恢复。方案旨在减少排放温室气体6,101,580公吨二氧化碳当量，减少使用和排放危险化学品13,370公吨，改善水质和人类健康，最大限度地减少废物产生和改善废物管理做法，特别是处理塑料废物269,267公吨。通过支持基于社区的旅游计划，方案赋权地方社区，包括土著人民和地方社区，使其能够可持续地管理和受益于他们的自然和文化资源，确保他们参与旅游业开发。方案与**行动目标7、8和16**相一致。

62. 农用化学品减量和管理融资方案增强版-FARM+（全球-贝宁、哥斯达黎加、埃及、冈比亚、加纳、墨西哥、尼泊尔、尼日利亚；GEF项目融资：59,074,144美元，包括最不发达国家基金5,390,302美元和GEF信托基金53,683,842美元；共同融资：556,741,692美元）。以GEF-7的FARM方案为基础，这个多信托基金和多重点领域方案融合来自化学品和废物、国际水域、气候变化3个重点领域以及最不发达国家基金的资源。方案支持各国政府和农业利益攸关方从不可持续的农业做法过渡到可持续和适应气候变化的农业做法，保护和改善陆地景观，减少有害农用化学品的污染。方案利用私营部门的资源，如共同融资、经验、专业知识和推广服务，支持和扩大执行可持续农业和气候韧性项目。通过其5个组成部分，支持一个多利益攸关方的、基于系统的方法，促进整个粮食系统的变革，促进可持续和适应气候变化的农业做法，增加获得融资和保险的机会。方案预期减少3,816,870公吨二氧化碳当量，以环境安全的方式处置99,639公吨含有持久性有机污染物和高度危险农药的危险废物，避免53克有毒当量的无意持久性有机污染物，恢复25,603公顷土地和生态系统，在1,759,510公顷土地和40,000公顷海洋生境中实施改良做法，管理120,000公顷土地以提高气候复原力。方案与**行动目标2、7、8、10和16**相一致。

63. GEF-8的规划指南认识到混合融资的重要性，加大了对创新性混合融资解决方案的承诺。GEF的4年融资水平为1.96亿美元，已经确定混合融资的优先事项，涵盖《公约》的要求，致力于多重点惠益。GEF正在加速使用非赠款工具进行混合融资，支持实现与重点领域目标相一致的全球环境惠益，重点放在能够达到一定规模并通过全球和国家两级资本市场调动资金的项目。

64. 2022年12月GEF理事会批准的新的GEF混合融资方案和非赠款工具政策增加了新的金融工具和政策要求，鼓励GEF机构在每半年一次的竞争性提案征集活动中提交高质量和创新性提案。

65. 2023年以来，提案征集活动产生了几项应对多重环境挑战的创新性提案。表7列出了本报告所述期间批准的8个混合融资项目，这些项目直接有助于《昆蒙框架》。GEF为这8个项目融资1.228亿美元，撬动共同融资20.33亿美元。也就是说，GEF投资于生物多样性相关混合融资项目的每一美元撬动了16.60美元的额外资金。

66. 下文概述这些项目（包括3个创新性生物多样性成果债券和1个债务换自然机制）及其预期成果。

- **自然资本基金：投资于亚太地区自然向好农业粮食企业**（亚太地区；GEF机构：亚洲开发银行；GEF项目融资：13,761,469美元；共同融资：632,738,531美元）。该项目将GEF确立为一个面向气候智能型农业、粮食企业和小农户综合基金的锚定投资者。自然资本基金是一个6.5亿美元的催化性自然资本混合融资基金，旨在支持农业粮食系统的转型（提高生产率、增强弹性和减少温室气体排放）。该项目将恢复120万公顷土地，对250万公顷土地采用改良做法，消除3,000多公吨高度危险的农药，避免2,000吨塑料残留物。该项目将惠及30万人（51%为女性）。
- **Yield Lab Opportunity Fund I：加速拉丁美洲和加勒比地区可持续和脱碳粮食系统的技术和地方创新**（拉丁美洲和加勒比地区；GEF机构：美洲开发银行；GEF项目融资：6,000,000美元；共同融资：27,275,000美元）。该项目为多达30家早期“农业技术”公司提供资金和指导，这些公司将获得股权和专项支持。其执行合作伙伴Yield Lab Latam是一家投资基金，致力于支持中美洲、墨西哥和加勒比地区从事集约作物以及南美洲和安第斯地区牲畜、农业和水产养殖的早期初创企业。GEF的资金以股权伙伴形式进行投资。该项目旨在改善1,150万公顷土地的耕作方式，在20年内减少2,970万公吨二氧化碳当量，减少15,680多吨全球化学品。该项目将惠及20万人（30%为女性）。
- **拉丁美洲和加勒比生物多样性保护和恢复金融工具的创新使用**（拉丁美洲和加勒比地区；GEF机构：美洲开发银行；GEF项目融资：40,180,000美元；共同融资：641,280,000美元）。该项目建立了一个区域机制，向拉丁美洲和加勒比地区至少3个参加国提供创新的混合融资解决方案，支持债务换自然。这将有助于各国同时解决自然和债务目标，确保保护区或其他基于区域的有效保护措施长期融资、空间规划、有效管理和/或扩大，而不增加债务上限。这种混合融资结构通过将美洲开发银行的信用增级和GEF的担保与保护努力的强大激励结合起来，为严峻的保护挑战提供了一种创新性解决办法：如果达到某些保护里程碑，GEF的担保可以转化为针对保护努力的赠款。该项目预计将使2,150万至3,770万公顷土地和/或海洋得到保护、恢复和/或改善管理。
- **巴西活亚马孙机制**（GEF机构：巴西生物多样性基金；GEF项目融资：6,200,000美元；共同融资：42,977,606美元）。该项目的目标是通过加强巴西保护区系统中的社会生物多样性组织、企业和供应链来保护亚马孙雨林。活亚马

孙机制是一种新的商业模式，利用一个叫做Agribusiness Receivable Certificate的资本市场产品来资助亚马孙守护者（土著人民和地方社区）和Natura（一家化妆品公司，是生物经济的主要参与者）价值链中的中小企业的保护活动。该项目预计将提高亚马孙1,200万公顷保护区的管理效率，使20,000人受益，其中50%是女性。

- **再生农业促进粮食供应链**（GEF机构：世界银行；GEF项目融资：13,761,468美元；共同融资：202,200,000美元）。该项目旨在激励拉丁美洲农业价值链采用再生农业做法。它有助于减少燃料使用和化学品投入，在自然植被和土壤中隔离碳，减少土地退化，恢复生产性景观。该项目侧重于公司农业价值链，优先考虑玉米、水稻、小麦、大豆和其他粮食作物。该项目融合GEF的资源、国际金融公司的资金以及商业金融机构的共同融资，以降低投资风险，激励可持续的做法。GEF的资金要么用于与可持续性挂钩的贷款，降低利率以激励再生性做法，要么用于次级贷款，以降低国际金融公司向采用再生性农业做法的农民提供的商业银行贷款的风险。项目的技术援助部支持农民采用再生农业做法。该项目预计将恢复500,000公顷退化土地和生态系统，改善500,000公顷景观的管理，减少15,973,629公吨二氧化碳当量。它还将惠及10,000人，其中至少35%是女性。
- **印度尼西亚珊瑚债券**（GEF机构：世界银行；GEF项目融资：13,761,468美元；联合融资：166,100,000美元）。印度尼西亚的“珊瑚债券”是世界上第一个基于成果的海洋保护区债券，为地球上195万公顷最具生物多样性的珊瑚礁和相关生态系统提供经独立核实的全球环境效益。基于从GEF犀牛债券中吸取的经验教训，投资世界银行在资本市场发行的债券的投资者将放弃票息支付，而将其用于项目，以改善珊瑚三角区内三个优先海洋保护区生态系统层面的管理有效性和生物多样性成果。债券到期时，将根据反映珊瑚礁健康状况的关键绩效指标的实现情况，向投资者支付0美元至约1,486万美元的保护成功付款（GEF非赠款工具支付1,376万美元，法国巴黎银行支付110万美元）。除了上述195万公顷土地带来的全球环境效益之外，该项目预计将把1,700吨过度开发的渔业恢复到更可持续的水平，减少83,150公吨二氧化碳当量的温室气体排放量，并将使173,836人受益。
- **卢旺达野生生物保护债券业务**（GEF机构：世界银行；GEF项目融资：9,000,000美元；联合融资：158,200,000美元）。该项目在一个最不发达国家试行基于成果的金融工具。由世界银行司库部发行的卢旺达野生生物保护债券利用投资者放弃的票息支付为保护活动提供资金，并向卢旺达发展委员会和非洲公园提供基于成果的赠款。投资者回报与衡量成功恢复濒危黑猩猩生境的景观连通性和表面积的关键绩效指标挂钩。该项目保护两个国家公园，创造绿色就业机会，加强社区复原力，为全球生物多样性行动目标作出贡献。该项目有助于恢复24,426公顷土地，改善181,826公顷土地的管理，在190,660公顷土地采用改良做法。还减少874,946公吨二氧化碳当量的排放量，惠及300,000人。
- **马达加斯加基于科学的生物多样性和自然资源管理促进经济发展项目**（GEF机构：世界银行；GEF项目融资：20,000,053美元；共同融资：162,300,000美

元)。该多信托基金项目融合马达加斯加、非赠款工具和最不发达国家基金的资源，以解决马达加斯加生物多样性保护、土地退化、适应和可持续发展等相互关联的问题。该项目改善综合景观管理的法律和体制安排，重点是部际和部门间合作、与社区的协作管理、土地权属登记和土地使用规划一体化进程。该项目还引入一种创新的成果支付债券——狐猴债券，以利用资本市场作为生物多样性保护的资金来源。狐猴债券是2024年10月国际货币基金组织、世界银行和马达加斯加政府与国际金融机构、发展伙伴和私营部门共同召开的气候金融圆桌会议确定的工作流。该项目将加强712,133公顷陆地保护区和328,216公顷海洋保护区的管理成效。再恢复20,300公顷生态系统，对5,000公顷土地和2,000公顷海洋生境采用改良做法，并通过基于自然的的活动减少7.98公吨二氧化碳当量。260,000人将直接受益于该项目，其中一半是女性。

小额赠款计划

67. 自1992年成立以来，GEF的小额赠款计划已资助30,000多笔赠款，管理GEF资金15.4亿美元，为136个国家的地方社区和民间社会组织提供资金。此外，还调动近10.11亿美元共同融资资助这些以社区为基础的小额赠款计划项目。GEF-8期间小额赠款计划已在136个国家运作，其中38个是小岛屿发展中国家，42个是最不发达国家。

68. 本报告所述期间的可用数据基于截至2025年7月的年度监测报告。报告的小额赠款计划活动对应于开发署的GEF-7规划活动。GEF小额赠款计划在127个国家运作，资助2,720个新项目，总额8,250万美元。在此期间，有5,952个小额赠款计划在执行中，赠款额2.26亿美元，共同融资总额2.238亿美元。此外，本报告所述期间共完成和关闭2,528个项目。

69. 正在执行的所有小额赠款计划的重点领域分布仍然以生物多样性为主，平均占43%，是小额赠款计划全球组合中的最大份额。其次是减缓气候变化（21%）和土地退化（19%）。

70. 2022年7月1日至2025年6月30日，完成并关闭992个小额赠款计划生物多样性项目。这些项目直接或间接地改善了多达154个保护区和260个土著和社区保护区的管理，总面积达1,050万公顷。小额赠款计划还帮助维持或改善至少873个物种的保护状况。小额赠款计划的生物多样性重点领域组合重点支持提高保护区的管理成效，将生物多样性保护和可持续利用纳入陆地景观/海洋景观和部门的主流。

71. GEF-8期间，分两批批准4个小额赠款计划全球核心项目，涵盖135个国家，供资总额2.415亿美元，共同融资总额1.157亿美元，资源分配总额3.572亿美元。由于实地活动将于2026年上半年和下半年开始，因此尚未提供成果报告。这些项目是：

- GEF编号 11285（第一批次），由开发署在99个国家执行；2023年6月批准。GEF融资：1.375亿美元，包括STAR资源7,004万美元，其中生物多样性STAR 3,980万美元。共同融资：3,500万美元。
- GEF编号 11726，由开发署在122个国家执行；2024年12月批准；GEF融资：8,070万美元，包括STAR资源3,280万美元，其中生物多样性STAR 1,950万美元。共同融资：5,680万美元。

- GEF编号 11719，由国际保护组织（CI）在5个国家执行；2024年11月批准。GEF融资：480万美元（无STAR资源）。共同融资：696万美元。
- GEF编号 11698，由联合国粮食及农业组织（粮农组织）在13个国家执行；2024年12月批准；GEF融资：1,849万美元，包括STAR资源868万美元，其中生物多样性STAR 640万美元；共同融资：1,697万美元。

72. GEF-8增资期商定的改革和更新小额赠款计划的宏伟进程（称为SGP 2.0）也取得了重大进展。这包括：

- **扩大国家选择并引进新的方法：**通过根据各国的国家需求以及开发署以外的小额赠款计划执行机构的优先事项，为各国提供更多选择，从而改进以国家为主导的项目规划，引进粮农组织和保护国际作为两个新的小额赠款计划机构，为GEF小额赠款计划带来新的机构知识、范围和方法。
- **扩大国家覆盖面：**将参加小额赠款计划的国家从GEF-7的124个增加到GEF-8的136个（共有144个国家符合条件），新添国家包括安哥拉、波斯尼亚和黑塞哥维那、智利、赤道几内亚、利比亚、黑山、巴基斯坦、圣多美和普林西比、索马里、南苏丹、土库曼斯坦、叙利亚。
- **增加小额赠款计划核心资源，改善小额赠款计划核心资源的公平获取：**使小额赠款计划核心方案获得1.35亿美元，而GEF-7获得1.28亿美元，将小额赠款计划核心资金中近100万美元平等分配给135个国家，同时支持各国方案的可行性和连续性，无论其规模或先前的参与水平如何。
- **增加STAR资源分配：**自GEF-7以来，使STAR对小额赠款计划的分配额增加30%以上，从GEF-7的8,500万美元增加到GEF-8的1.115亿美元，与GEF-7相比，多了16个国家向小额赠款计划分配STAR资源（GEF-8为小额赠款计划全球方案获得GEF资源2.465亿美元：1.35亿美元核心+1.115亿美元STAR，而GEF-7为2.13亿美元）。
- **通过提高效率向民间社会提供更多资金：**制定目标，提高直接流向民间社会组织和社区组织的GEF小额赠款计划资金的赠款比例，使小额赠款计划核心GEF-8项目的赠款比例到达72%，而GEF-7的赠款比例为62%。
- **先进小额赠款计划监测和报告框架：**引进一个新的小额赠款计划成果框架，以更好地说明小额赠款计划的全部成果和影响，包括建立一个标准方法，用于报告跟踪小额赠款计划对全球环境惠益和社会经济成果的贡献的相关GEF-8核心指标。
- **改进两个试点和互补方法：**通过引进两个SGP 2.0民间社会组织举措，加强对青年、妇女和土著人民和地方社区的直接资助和支持：
- 小额赠款计划民间社会组织挑战方案，GEF编号 11757，自然保护联盟牵头，2026年6月5日在乌兹别克斯坦举行的GEF成员国大会第八届会议上正式启动。这项1,000万美元的方案支持地方民间社会组织获得财政和技术资源的竞争机会，以扩大创新性环境解决方案，提供达300,000美元的赠款。四次区域提案征集活动的第一次（东欧、高加索和中亚）目前已经开始。方案为25个国家的至少30个举措提供达300,000美元的资助。

- 小额赠款计划微额信贷项目，GEF编号 11903，世界银行牵头，已被纳入世界银行在巴西、哥伦比亚、马达加斯加、尼日利亚、南非、坦桑尼亚、土耳其等7个国家的现有项目，撬动共同融资14亿美元（比例接近150:1）。

一.4 支持土著人民和地方社区执行《昆明-蒙特利尔全球生物多样性框架》

73. GEF自成立以来一直与土著人民和地方社区合作，承认其在管理土地和领地以及维权方面发挥重要作用，是实现全球环境惠益的基础²⁴。

74. GEF-8的**养护之心脏倡议**（GEF项目融资：22,535,780美元；共同融资：83,799,902美元）由GEF信托基金的生物多样性重点领域供资，2024年12月获GEF理事会批准。GEF机构世界自然基金会（WWF-US）被GEF土著人民咨询小组选中。该项目旨在增加资源和组织力量，承认土著人民和地方社区对领地、土地、水和资源的治理和管理，以实现全球环境惠益。80%的养护之心脏倡议赠款将用于土著人民和地方社区及其组织。根据与土著人民和地方社区的协商，GEF-8养护之心脏倡议支持土著和地方社区执行伙伴利用GEF机构的直接赠款执行其自定的计划，以实现全球环境惠益和加强组织能力。一些土著人民和地方社区伙伴组织将获得直接赠款，以开展实地工作和加强组织。其他选定的土著伙伴组织是土著人民和地方社区领导的供资机制，这些机制将获得直接赠款，以加强其机构和技术能力，并向土著人民和地方社区组织提供次级赠款。除了通过支持土著人民和地方社区领导的基金带来的环境效益，养护之心脏倡议正在寻求建立必要的体制基础设施，以便在未来更直接地输送更多资金。本报告所述期间，该项目以四种语文（英文、法文、西班牙文和葡萄牙文）向伙伴组织发出公开呼吁²⁵，从世界各地土著人民和地方社区组织收到提案850多份，并完成了由临时全球指导委员会管理的严格审查和甄选。在世界自然基金会的推动下，临时全球指导委员会由GEF土著人民咨询小组和国际生物多样性问题土著论坛的土著人民和地方社区领导人以及GEF秘书处工作人员组成。在选择过程结束之后，2026年2月23日至27日在内罗毕举行了规划和设计讲习班，临时指导委员会选择了10个土著人民和地方社区组织接受支持。讲习班提出了次级项目的设计和执行情况，这些计划植根于它们自行确定的优先事项、环境和社会保障措施以及性别平等和利益攸关方参与计划等。将设立一个常设全球指导委员会，由每个受赠组织、GEF土著人民咨询小组成员和GEF秘书处选出的代表组成，确保在整个执行过程中，治理和决策权属于土著人民和地方社区本身。

75. 养护之心脏倡议的前身是GEF-7**包容性养护倡议**（GEF项目融资：22,535,780美元，共同融资：90,384,856美元），2022年开始执行，本报告所述期间取得了进展。在美洲、非洲、亚洲和太平洋地区，13个次级项目正在进行中。2025年，该项目的中期评价报告了重大成果：189万公顷保护区的管理成效得到加强，214万公顷保护区以外的陆地景观得到改善，10,280公顷生态系统得到恢复，52,598人受益，包括24,336名女性。该倡议正在建立和展示一个大规模、长期直接融资的模式，将土著机构——而不是中介——置于气候和生物多样性行动的中心。通过大规模和长期投资，使土著组织能够加强治理，全面管理领

地，保持几代人的领导力。项目全球指导委员会完全由社区选出的次级项目土著人民和地方社区领导人组成。委员会多次举行会议，包括《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会第十六届会议之前受区域土著理事会(CRIC - Consejo Regional Indígena del Cauca)接待在哥伦比亚卡利举行会议。包容性养护倡议受赠方与国际生物多样性问题土著论坛一起参加了缔约方大会会议，参加了2025年自然保护联盟世界养护大会，一些受赠方还参加了GEF成员国大会第八届会议。

76. 此外，本报告所述期间，GEF理事会批准了几个旨在支持土著人民和地方社区保护生物多样性行动和其他公约目标的项目和方案。例如**生物南方：太平洋-安第斯-亚马孙生态和文化联通走廊**项目（哥伦比亚，GEF项目融资：13,736,697美元，共同融资：41,341,421美元）支持修订保护区管理计划以纳入土著人民和地方社区、妇女和青年的意见和需求，登记土著人民和地方社区管理的其他基于区域的有效养护措施并为其制定参与性管理计划和财务机制。在东帝汶，**改善湿地管理促进生物多样性和改善人类与野生动物的共存**（东帝汶，GEF项目融资：2,932,000美元，共同融资：6,881,786美元）将支持土著社区可持续管理其湿地，同时解决人类与野生动物的冲突并增加收入。GEF-8**刚果盆地关键森林生物群落综合方案**的所有6个子项目（区域，赤道几内亚、中非共和国、刚果民主共和国、圣多美和普林西比、喀麦隆；GEF项目融资：56,259,439美元，共同融资：363,594,993美元）都包含以GEF-7刚果盆地可持续景观影响方案对土著人民和地方社区的大力支持为基础增强土著人民和地方社区、妇女和青年权能的内容。

77. 第二节进一步详细介绍了GBFF为更好地支持土著人民和地方社区而取得的重大进展，包括通过专门组合层面目标和支持土著人民和地方社区行动的相应指导方针。

二. 全球生物多样性框架基金

78. 认识到增加国际生物多样性融资的紧迫性，《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会第十五届会议在关于资源调动的第15/7号决定第29和30段以及关于财务机制的第15/15号决定第19和20段要求GEF在2023年专设一个便于利用的GBFF，从所有来源迅速调动和分配与《昆蒙框架》雄心相称的新的和额外资源^{26, 27}。

二.1 全球生物多样性框架基金的建立和运作

79. 针对这一要求，2023年6月GEF理事会批准设立GBFF²⁸及其规划指南²⁹。2023年8月GEF成员国大会第七届会议批准成立并启动该基金。

80. 2024年2月8日和9日举行的GBFF理事会第一次会议作出了重要决定，包括关于项目周期政策³⁰和资源分配政策³¹的决定，使得该基金能够及时启动规划。2024年6月19日，在缔约方大会决定设立该基金18个月后，GBFF理事会第二次会议批准了第一批编制就绪的

GBFF项目。会议还通过了GBFF咨询小组和附属机构的职权范围³²，最终确定了GBFF的扩大治理安排，其中包括：

- GBFF理事会增加了观察员代表名额，以下各界各两个席位：（一）养护和慈善组织，（二）土著人民和地方社区，（三）私营部门，（四）妇女，（五）青年³³。GBFF观察员参加理事会的所有会议，并可根据理事会的议事规则就任何议程项目发言。
- 附属机构第一期由拥有特别重要的生物多样性和生态系统功能和服务区域的发展中国家政府提名的17名专家组成³⁴。其任务是以全面和独立的方式就有关执行GBFF规划指南的事项向GBFF理事会提供技术咨询和建议。
- 非主权参与方咨询小组，由4名成员组成，2名次国家和区域公共机构的代表，2名生物多样性资源调动专家³⁵。其任务是向GBFF理事会和秘书处提供技术咨询，如何在实现GBFF目标中与非主权捐助方互动并支持执行规划指南。咨询小组目前的组成反映了GBFF理事会第三次会议批准的职权范围修正案³⁶，修正案扩大了咨询小组的规模，纳入了两类非捐助成员，每类最多选出两名成员。向GBFF捐款的每个非主权实体都将被邀请加入咨询小组。

81. GBFF扩大的治理结构旨在确保机构之间的互补性。GBFF观察员、附属机构和非主权参与方咨询小组都通过它们在本报告所述期间的贡献有效地影响了理事会的决定。GBFF观察员在就理事会文件草案进行专门协商期间提出的几项建议被纳入土著人民和地方社区行动准则³⁷、GBFF成果框架³⁸和GBFF成果框架执行准则。同样，通过与观察员和咨询小组磋商收到的意见反映在理事会第六次会议通过的文件《2026-2030年GBFF资源调动战略》中。此外，在同一次会议上GBFF理事会核可了附属机构关于促进实现与国际金融机构有关的GBFF一揽子目标的备选方案的建议。GEF秘书处通过向每次理事会会议提交的进度报告，定期向GBFF理事会提供每个治理机构的活动和贡献的最新情况³⁹。

82. 本报告所述期间，GBFF理事会进一步为GBFF配备了一个新的成果框架⁴⁰，成果框架与《昆蒙框架》的监测框架及其相关准则⁴¹、土著人民和地方社区行动准则⁴²以及融资可预测性特设工作组⁴³相一致。后者是为了探讨如何提高和加强对GBFF捐款的可预测性，包括通过多年期认捐和考虑自愿指示性捐款比额表的机会，以响应缔约方大会第十六届会议的指导意见。

83. GEF-9增资期的参与方已决定将GBFF倡导的几项创新纳入GEF大家庭的主流，包括简化的项目周期和涉及以下份额的组合层面目标——支持土著人民和地方社区行动的规划份额、国际金融机构的份额、分配给小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家的份额。

二.2 向全球生物多样性框架基金提供支持

84. 自2023年8月启动以来，GBFF从11个国家政府和1个地方政府收到签署的承诺3.872亿美元。这些资源经5轮竞争性选择，共规划3.621亿美元，资助87个国家的项目，包括47个小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家。

85. GBFF的项目周期政策从GEF项目和方案周期政策（适用于GEF各基金，包括GEF信托基金）简化而来⁴⁴。所有GBFF资源都以国家驱动的方式，通过连续几轮向所有符合条件的国家开放的选择，分配给各个项目。组织了几轮选择，根据可用资源、7项选择标准和GBFF规划指南所列3个组合层面目标批准项目编制赠款申请。

86. GBFF的选择标准是：

- 产生全球环境效益的潜力；
- 符合 GBFF 的规划指南，推进《昆蒙框架》的执行；
- 与国家生物多样性战略和行动计划、国家融资计划或类似文书相一致，以确定国家和/或区域优先事项；
- 多部委、机构、私营部门和民间社会的政策一致性和协调性水平；
- 区域间平衡；
- 调动私营部门和慈善机构的资源；
- 支持土著人民和地方社区并与之互动。

87. GBFF三个组合层面目标是：

- GBFF 总资源的 36%+3%分配给最不发达国家和小岛屿发展中国家。给最不发达国家和小岛屿发展中国家的 3%部分将在三年后进行审查，如未使用，将重新规划给其他国家。截至 2026 年 6 月 30 日，38.8%的 GBFF 资源规划给了小岛屿发展中国家和最不发达国家，达到了投资组合层面目标。
- GBFF 资源的 25%将全部通过担任 GEF 机构的国际金融机构进行规划。截至 2026 年 6 月 30 日，30.4%的 GBFF 资源通过国际金融机构进行规划，这一目标超额完成。
- 到 2030 年，GBFF 下分配的资源总量中，组合层面 20%的规划份额用于支持土著人民和地方社区保护、恢复、可持续利用和管理生物多样性的行动。这一目标也超额完成，31.8%的 GBFF 规划融资用于支持土著人民和地方社区行动。

88. GBFF组织了5轮选择，结果分别于2024年3月、2024年5月、2024年12月、2025年11月和2026年3月公布。共收到项目编制赠款申请254项，从中选出了82项（列于附件3）。

89. 首席执行官批准选定的项目编制赠款后，GEF机构按照GBFF项目取消规定在9个月内提交编制就绪的项目。500万美元以上的编制就绪项目列入工作方案，供GBFF理事会会议审议。500万美元以下的编制就绪项目在秘书处放行后，由首席执行官根据GBFF理事会的授权背书。

90. 截至2026年6月30日，首席执行官已给31个编制就绪的项目背书，GBFF融资总额达1.495亿美元，从而为项目的执行扫清了障碍。另外还收到11个编制就绪的项目，总额5,840万美元。其余40个项目，GBFF融资总额1.542亿美元，正由提案方编制。

91. 以下段落概述正在执行的3个GBFF项目，说明GBFF对《昆蒙框架》的支持。

92. **土著领地生物多样性养护**（巴西，GEF项目融资：9,064,221美元；共同融资：17,900,000美元）通过为土著领导的组织提供直接援助，支持巴西境内土著人民和地方社区主导的生物多样性守护工作。该项目符合巴西国家土著领地与环境管理政策，因而具备可推广性。在民间社会组织和政府机构的有力协助下，该项目利用领地与环境管理计划——这些计划通过参与式方式共同制定，充分考虑了各少数民族的文化特点——来改善640万公顷土地的管理状况。该项目直接有助于实现《昆蒙框架》**行动目标1、2、3、8、9、11、21、22和23**。GEF的全部项目融资，95%用于支持由土著人民和地方社区开展的各项行动。

93. **在加蓬解决未决障碍并利用持久金融机制实现行动目标3**（加蓬，GEF项目融资：1,364,496美元，共同融资：-美元），解决长期融资不足和人类与野生动物冲突增加而导致民众减少对保护区的支持的问题。该项目补充正在进行的GEF-7持久地球项目，后者正在加蓬制定一个持久项目融资办法，以确保保护区的长期供资。这个GBFF项目将通过制定一项国家人类与野生动物战略和将人类与野生动物冲突纳入加蓬永久项目融资来助力实现**行动目标3**。该项目还在4个保护区支持土著人民和地方社区设计的人类与野生动物冲突行动和共存方法。该项目有助于实现**行动目标3、4、19、21、22和23**，将提高100多万公顷保护区的管理成效，改善保护区以外14,000多公顷的管理做法。

94. **推进综合参与式空间规划，在全国范围内加强萨摩亚具有全球重要意义的生物多样性**（萨摩亚，GEF项目融资：1,009,361美元，共同融资：2,666,667美元），根据**行动目标**

1, 通过成本效益和多标准分析, 加强跨部门协调和能力, 支持2个主要岛屿 (Upolu 和 Savaii) 的参与式、综合和包容性生物多样性空间规划。该项目还将通过建立10,051公顷新保护区, 改善44,346公顷原始森林保护区的管理, 直接惠及5,050人, 从而为行动目标3作出贡献。

三. 气候变化特别基金和最不发达国家基金

95. 气候变化特别基金和最不发达国家基金是GEF管理的两个侧重于适应气候变化的独立信托基金。设立这两个基金是为了解决发展中国家在《气候公约》下的特殊需要。本报告所述期间两个基金批准的部分项目为《昆蒙框架》提供了3.8616亿美元的GEF融资。表1显示本报告所述期间最不发达国家基金资源和气候变化特别基金小岛屿发展中国家窗口-A为实现《昆蒙框架》的融资总额。

96. 值得注意的项目包括马达加斯加基于科学的生物多样性和自然资源管理促进经济发展项目以及第一.3节所述支持执行绿色长城倡议大规模投资转型方法。

97. 其他说明性实例包括:

- 在萨摩亚通过基于生态系统的适应加强气候适应、生物多样性养护和防治土地退化 (GEF 融资: 5,835,750 美元, 共同融资: 37,024,000 美元), 该项目通过恢复和保护萨摩亚高价值陆地和海洋生态系统, 包括河岸和沿海森林、红树林、珊瑚礁和社区主导的保护区, 从而提高生境完整性、连通性和复原力, 产生全球生物多样性惠益。该项目还通过基于生态系统的综合适应和社区管理, 减少对生物多样性的主要威胁, 保护受威胁的物种, 包括齿嘴鸠、黑胸裸吸蜜鸟、萨摩亚狐蝠、玳瑁和绿海龟。
- 初性社区、土地恢复和可持续生态系统管理 (赞比亚, GEF 融资: 12,873,000 美元, 共同融资: 103,699,557 美元) 通过恢复退化的生态系统和促进赞比亚中部和南部各省的可持续管理, 包括具有全球重要性的 Miombo 和 Mopane 林地, 实现重要生物多样性惠益。该项目通过减少来自不可持续农业、木炭生产和森林砍伐的压力, 同时支持适应气候变化的生计和替代能源, 助力保护生物多样性, 加强生态系统服务, 增强生产性陆地景观和依赖这些景观的社区的韧性。

98. 所有这些项目综合利用GEF信托基金、最不发达国家基金或气候变化特别基金的资源, 借助《生物多样性公约》和《气候变化框架公约》之间的协同作用, 为生物多样性和适应气候变化采取补充行动。

四. GEF 对缔约方大会第十六次会议指导意见的回应

99. 缔约方在缔约方大会第十六次会议上就GEF运作和具体生物多样性专题提出了指导意见。下文表8介绍GEF对这些指导意见作出的回应。

100. 《GEF-9方案编制指南》¹²¹是对指导作出的主要答复之一，《指南》的宗旨是交付缔约方大会第十六届会议通过的《生物多样性公约及其各项议定书成果导向四年期生物多样性方案重点框架》所有要素。表9显示这些要素的交付机制。

五. 执行项目组合和持续进行的改革的成果

102. GEF致力于不断改善其通过各机构在各国投资的项目组合，以产生更大、更持久的环境成果。自GEF-8以来，GEF启动一项持续议程，以增强各国的权能，简化其流程，促进获取融资，加强成果交付。

加强国家能力和增强国家自主权

103. GEF-8期间引入的国家参与战略¹²²使各国能够改善项目组合进展并最大限度地发挥 GEF资源的影响力，包括为此开展加强能力活动、上游国家参与、国家对话、区域研讨会和针对特定国家的知识活动。

104. 在GEF-8期间，13个区域GEF-8研讨会、11个扩大成员研讨会以及81个上游技术和国家对话帮助各国确定了GEF-8期间的方案活动优先事项。¹²³ 参加扩大成员研讨会的每个代表团都包括GEF政治联络员和业务联络员、GEF服务的多边环境协定国家联络员（包括《生物多样性公约》联络员）以及民间社会组织和私营部门代表。

105. 根据GEF-8国家参与战略，GEF向GEF业务联络员提供财政支持，使其能够履行项目监督职能。它还为总共140个受援国举办了8次区域培训。这些培训增强业务联络员对其角

色和职责的理解，因而增强了业务联络员在整个项目周期（从设计到执行）监督其负责的项目组合的能力，确保了国家自主权，确保与国家环境优先事项保持一致。

106. 首届GEF决策者知识交流会于2025年在哥斯达黎加启动。来自科特迪瓦、几内亚、肯尼亚、塞内加尔和津巴布韦的部长和代表有机会学习哥斯达黎加的宝贵经验，了解该国如何有效利用GEF资源、伙伴关系和政策，减少该国土地利用部门的排放并增强碳汇，同时改善地方社区的生活。

107. 在本报告所述期间启动的GEF丰塞卡领导力方案¹²⁴为来自GEF受援国的青年保护领导人提供了机会，使其能够参与生物多样性保护相关领域的研究生学习和实地研究并接受领导技能培训。丰塞卡领导力方案支持了来自62个国家的300多名青年保护领导人，提供研究生奖学金（95名获奖者）和实地研究补助金（205名获奖者）。

简化和改进获取措施

108. 在增资参与方、GEF理事会、GEF独立评价办公室、多边组织绩效评估网络以及历届里约公约缔约方大会发出的一致信号推动下，简化和加速GEF项目和方案交付一直是GEF-8期间的持续优先事项。GEF流程虽然严谨，但堆积了多个复杂行政层级，需要予以精简，以便更快地支付并更好地促进获得资源，以取得环境成果。

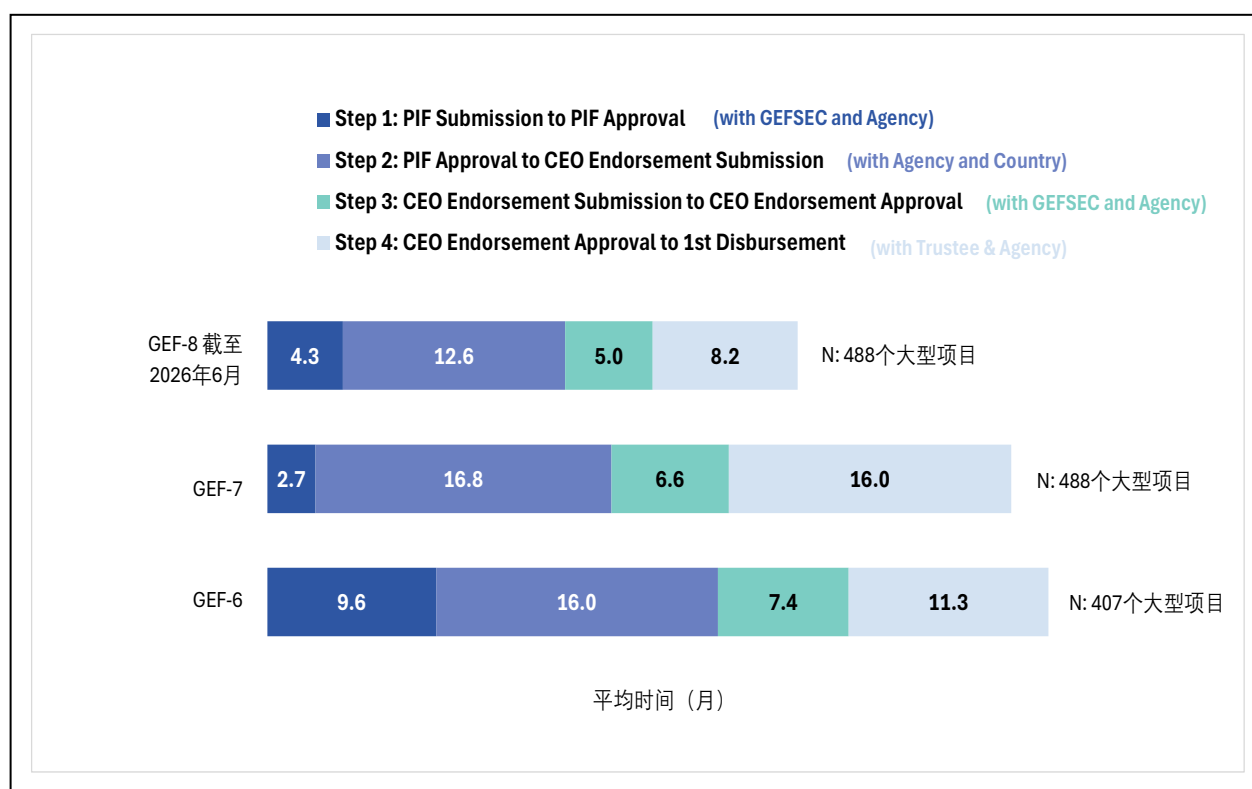
109. GEF-8增资参与方明确要求解决这一问题。作为回应，GEF秘书处启动了对项目和项目周期的结构性审查，最终成立了一个由巴西、法国、印度、荷兰、挪威和联合王国代表组成的理事会工作组，令其制定具体的改革方案。理事会在第66次会议上推出了早期措施，最引人注目的是将中型项目的上限从200万美元提高到500万美元，这实实在在地扩大了一步审批流程的适用范围。与此同时，引入了简化项目模板、立项申请表的页面和字数限制以及首席执行官背书文件，并启动了每个机构的年度项目组合审查，以确定处理瓶颈。截至2026年6月30日，关于已批准的GEF-8中型项目的数据表明，各方实实在在地采用了一步到位模式：价值200万至500万美元的31个一步到位中型项目已获得首席执行官批准。相比之下，同一资助范围内的106个两步式中型项目和19个子中型项目的立项申请表获得批准。一步到位中型项目从提交到批准的平均时间为6.5个月，而两步式中型项目的具体政策要求两步式中型项目在首席执行官批准中型项目立项申请表后不迟于12个月内获得首席执行官批准---这突显了统一的一步到位途径的时间优势。

110. 理事会第68次会议标志着更实质性的一步，工作组提出了涵盖审批流程、模板简化、服务标准和监控要求的全面一揽子措施。其中包括在GEF-8结束前逐步淘汰所有中型项目的两步流程、引入背书函的到期日期以激励加速跟进以及部署自动化门户跟踪以提高后备项目可预测性等提议。此后，理事会第69次会议实施了一系列政策修正案，这些修正案自2025年7月1日起生效，其中包括修订提交提案的截止日期以降低项目自动取消的风险，对200万美元以上的中型项目进行强制性中期审查，简化综合方案的方案进度监测报告，并澄清让GEF机构担任实施和执行双重角色的标准，将此类安排限制在脆弱和受冲突影响的环境、东道国有法律限制以及非赠款工具项目等特定的特殊情况下。

111. 在项目组合处理数据中可以看出GEF-8期间采取的各项改革的累积效应。如图1所示，与GEF-7期间相比，GEF-8期间的大型项目平均处理时间（截至2026年6月，488个大型项目）显示，整个项目周期有所改善。最值得注意的是，立项申请表批准到提交首席执行官背书文件的间隔（之前各周期中最大的延迟来源）从GEF-7期间的16.8个月下降到GEF-8期间的12.6个月，减少了25%。从首席执行官背书文件得到批准到首次付款的时间缩短了近一半，从GEF-7期间的16.0个月缩短到GEF-8期间的8.2个月。项目周期所有四个阶段¹²⁵的总平均处理时间从GEF-6期间的约44.2个月和GEF-7期间的42.1个月下降到GEF-8期间的约30.0个月，与之前两个周期相比减少了14.2个月，即减少了大约三分之一。

112. 在此基础上，GEF-9增资参与方在《GEF-9政策建议》¹²⁶的“加速和简化交付”政策目标下商定了一项更具雄心和具有结构重要性的一揽子改革。其核心要素是将改编自全球生物多样性框架基金试行的一步到位方法的统一、加速项目模式纳入GEF管理的所有基金的

主流。这个模式一旦到位，将用简化的项目准备申请替代立项申请表，从而能够更早地进行项目准备，估计在项目周期前端节省三到四个月的时间---根据独立评价办公室的分析，这不会损害项目质量。在GEF所有四个基金系列中应用这种模式还可协调时间表和要求，促进多伙伴信托基金提案。

113. 为GEF-9期间商定的其他政策建议包括：为各机构在GEF秘书处评论后重新提交修订项目引入最长时间标准，加强后备项目的问责和可预测性；激励各机构简化内部审批流程，包括让内部审批与首席执行官背书同时进行，并简化小额赠款的程序；为扶持活动制定具体的简化程序，从逐个项目审查最低标准改为每个增资期进行一次机构级评估；将所有机构的机构费用统一定为最高9%，纠正长期存在的差异，这种差异在运作方面没有任何存在的理由。在实施这些一揽子措施的同时，还计划对GEF门户进行升级，目的是实现工作流程自动化，提高数据可见度，利用人工智能将后备项目数据转换为及时、可操作的情报，供GEF秘书处、机构、理事和国家合作伙伴使用。

114. 整体而言，这些措施代表着GEF运营模式从渐进调整向根本性步骤变化的转变---这种模式保留了项目周期的严谨性和国家驱动性，同时大幅降低了历史上限制获取和减缓交付的交易成本。

提高透明度和加强问责

115. GEF致力于确保透明和问责，以监测其资金使用情况，并为使用其资金提供便利。GEF向各国提供国家概况介绍，使它们能够跟踪资源的使用和落实情况，并在其公共网站上公布机构概况介绍，以便利各国选择机构。

116. GEF提交缔约方大会的部分报告以GEF机构记分卡为依据，记分卡是确保GEF当前阶段资源在各区域和国家集团中得到适当和有效使用的问责机制。此外，《年度监测报告》对照GEF-8成果衡量框架跟踪执行中的项目组合的成果、绩效和质量。每年的《监测报告》根据GEF-8成果衡量框架调整报告，分为两层指标，第一层评估取得的环境成果，第二层衡量效力和效率措施的进展。

117. GEF继续通过定期发布[国际援助透明度倡议](#)标准，以透明的方式报告项目进展情况。这项工作以GEF信息获取政策（GEF/C.55/06）为基础。这种自动化报告进一步提高了全球透明度，最近一项独立评估证实，GEF是唯一通过国际援助透明度倡议进行报告的气候和环境基金¹²⁷。

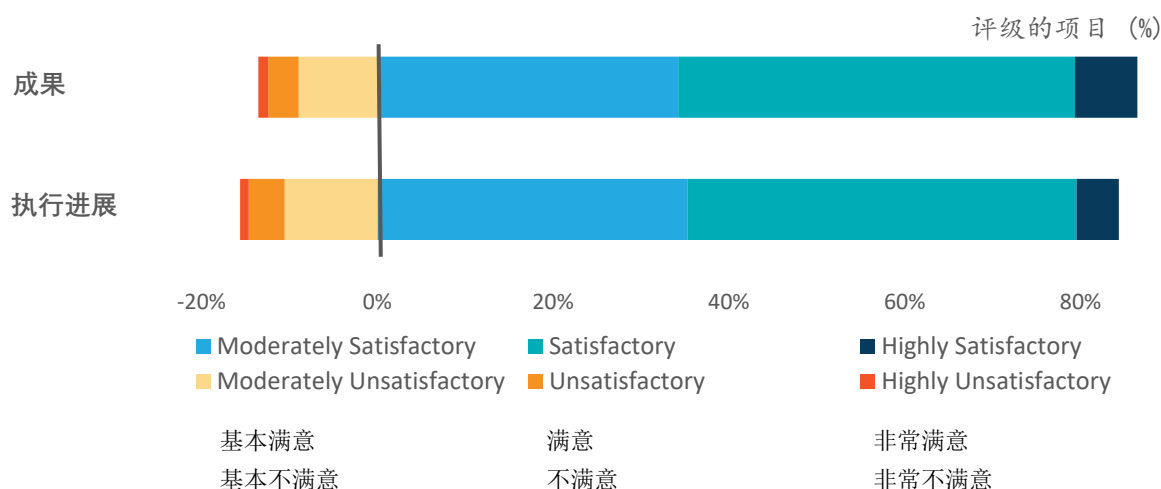
实现制定项目时确定的目标以及执行进展情况

118. 生物多样性投资最新进展显示，这些投资投入了高质量且有影响力的项目和方案。截至2025年6月底，正在执行的生物多样性资助项目组合净承诺金额为28亿美元。其中包括近460个项目，其中209个项目由生物多样性重点领域独家资助，金额为8.439亿美元。本节介绍《2025年全环基金监测报告》（GEF/C.66/03）报告的这组项目组合所取得进展的最新信息。

119. 在2025财政年度，为整个执行中的GEF项目组合提供了全面的进展更新;共有1,105个项目，总共净承诺金额达57亿美元。各机构每年进行自我评级，这些评级显示执行进展的质量和实现项目成果的可能性。¹²⁸ 图2显示，在2025财政年度，84%项目的执行进展被评为满意，高于一年前的82%。另外，86%项目在实现制定项目时确定的目标可能性方面被评为满意。

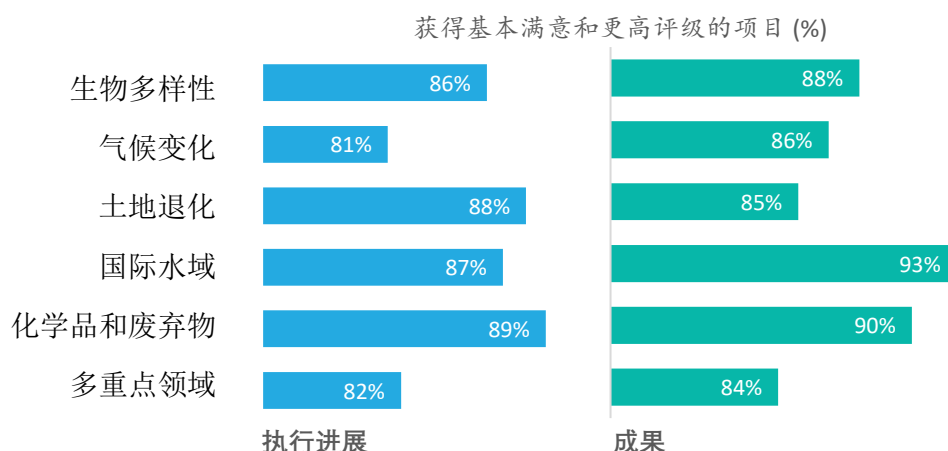
图 2. 截至 2025 年 6 月 30 日 GEF 所有重点领域执行中项目成果分布情况和执行进展评级



120. 在执行中的生物多样性项目组合中，86%实现执行进展的评级是满意，88%实现制定项目时确定的目标的可能性评级是满意。这高于GEF的平均水平，GEF获得执行进展满意评级的平均比例为84%，获得实现制定项目时确定的目标的可能性满意评级的平均比例为82%。此外，82%的多重点项目（通常包括生物多样性资源）实现执行进展的评级为满意，84%实现制定项目时确定的目标的可能性评级为满意。

121. 报告2022年7月至2025年6月期间成果的执行中小项目组合在GEF核心指标上取得的成果有力地促进了《昆蒙框架》各项行动目标。这277个项目获得的GEF供资总额为17亿美元，这些项目取得的成果包括：

- 行动目标1: 共5.789亿公顷土地和海洋受到直接影响，有利于生物多样性
- 行动目标2: 2,550万公顷土地和生态系统正在恢复中
- 行动目标3: 3.409亿公顷保护区得以建立和/或得到更好管理，其中50%是直接通过GEF支持建立的新保护区。
- 行动目标7: 减少32,134公吨令全球关注的化学品及其废弃物
- 行动目标 8和行动目标11: 减少8.817亿公吨温室气体排放（二氧化碳当量）
- 行动目标10: 8,070万公顷景观采用改良做法，21个共享水生态系统采用改良管理
- 行动目标19: 72亿美元的共同融资（其中包括来自私营部门的2.329亿美元）用于遵循里约标值方法的生物多样性相关项目，这类项目的总投资为89亿美元
- 行动目标 22和行动目标 23: 640万人（其中包括320万妇女）从生物多样性的保护、可持续利用或恢复中受益

六. GEF 独立评价办公室的评价

122. 在本报告所述期间，GEF独立评价办公室进行了11项与生物多样性重点领域相关的评价。

123. GEF在向《生物多样性公约》缔约方大会第十六届会议提交的报告¹²⁹中概述了2022年7月至2024年7月期间进行的五项相关评价的关键信息，报告还包括GEF秘书处管理层的回

应摘要，该回应已得到GEF理事会的认可。这五项评价是关于GEF对以下方面所提供支持的评价：可持续森林管理、旱地国家、全球野生动植物方案、GEF基于社区的方法以及湄公河下游流域生态系统战略性国家群组。

124. 下节概述独立评价办公室自2024年7月以来对GEF太平洋小岛屿发展中国家项目的评价（2024年12月），对支持基于自然的解决方案的评价（2025年6月），对GEF粮食系统方案的评价（2025年12月），对GEF的第八次综合评价（2025年12月），对全球生物多样性框架基金形成性评价（2025年6月）和对全球生物多样性框架基金第二次形成性评价（2026年6月）。下节还提供理事会认可的GEF秘书处管理层回应综述。

太平洋小岛屿发展中国家方案评价¹³⁰

125. 这次评价审查了GEF在太平洋小岛屿发展中国家的三个重要方案及其相应的19个子项目（13个已完成，6个正在执行）：太平洋不受气候影响的发展方案、太平洋岛屿山脊到珊瑚礁国家优先事项方案以及在小岛屿发展中国家进行可持续的低化学品和无化学品发展方案。这次评价评估了该地区GEF综合方案的演变情况，分析了影响方案绩效的因素，并查明了经验教训，为GEF未来在小岛屿发展中国家的干预措施提供参考。

126. 这次评价强调土地、水、森林和沿海资源管理综合方法对于保护小岛屿发展中国家生物多样性的的重要性。评价显示，生态系统规模的一体化对于解决陆海相互作用至关重要，不过，这需要进行更高的协调，对有限的机构能力形成巨大挑战。

127. 评价发现，保护区管理以及沿海和海洋资源管理方面与生物多样性有关的成果比较显著。然而，在物种恢复、重新造林和减少环境压力方面取得的成果有限。

128. 评价得出的结论是，自上次评价小岛屿发展中国家项目以来，GEF的方案方法取得了重大进展，¹³¹但仍有一些挑战有待解决。评价强调指出，GEF在太平洋小岛屿发展中国家的方案与区域优先事项在战略上保持一致，推进关键的长远环境和发展目标。评价认为，知识管理、创新和社会经济共同效益促进提高了方案成效。然而，虽然子项目在设计层面基本上与方案目标保持一致，但重大运作障碍仍然存在，而且各干预措施和方案的成效存在相当大的差异。

129. 这次评价揭示了监测和评价框架的系统性弱点，这些弱点严重影响方案评估和适应性管理，在三个主要领域存在缺陷：(一)方案一级指标与子项目指标之间持续不一致，(二)指标质量和衡量方法不一致，(三)缺乏强有力的成果衡量系统。

130. 与独立项目相比，GEF在太平洋小岛屿发展中国家的方案展现了有实质意义的额外效益，不过，伴随着这一优势的情况是，在执行过程中必然有所取舍。GEF在太平洋小岛屿发展中国家的所有三个方案都出现了严重执行延误，完成时间普遍超过GEF项目组合的平均完成时间。可持续性也面临重大挑战，这些挑战的根源是，机构能力低、财政机制有限和国家情况。这次评价发现，GEF各机构和其他发展伙伴之间的协调与合作有改进的空

间。评价进一步强调指出，存在一些机会，可通过认真考虑机构伙伴关系，加强太平洋小岛屿发展中国家体制能力。

131. 根据这次评价的结果，独立评价办公室提出了三项建议：(一)加强协调与合作，以最大限度地扩大发展影响和提高资源效率；(二)通过进一步改善太平洋小岛屿发展中国家母方案及其相关子项目之间的协调和业务交付，提高方案成效；(三)优先重视强有力的机构能力发展，以确保方案取得成功和产生持久影响。

132. GEF理事会认可GEF秘书处管理层对这些建议的回应。¹³²秘书处对评价报告表示欢迎，并阐述了秘书处基本上同意报告调查结果、结论和建议的原因。秘书处概述了已经在努力改进方案方法以及改进方案活动和改进与小岛屿发展中国家的接触的领域；说明了可以扩大和加强这些努力的机会。秘书处管理层在回应中特别强调，自GEF-5以来，一些机制通过扩大GEF机构和其他发展伙伴之间的伙伴关系（包括国家对话和扩大成员讲习班）以及有针对性的捐助方合作（例如全球环境基金-绿色气候基金长期愿景倡议等），加强了捐助方的协调、政府参与和外部一致性。秘书处管理层还在回应中强调，通过实施《GEF-8成果衡量框架》和方案方法的演变，例如通过专门的总体监测和报告协调项目，例如旗舰GEF-8蓝绿岛综合方案，GEF成果管理体系取得了进展。秘书处管理层在回应中进一步强调，GEF方案活动和GEF-9增资具有国家驱动性质，这是探索满足小岛屿发展中国家独特需求新方法的一种途径，新方法包括增加执行机构和加强GEF国家参与战略。

关于 GEF 对基于自然的解决方案的支持的评价133

133. 这是首次对GEF对基于自然的解决方案的支持进行独立和全面评价。由于GEF并没有关于基于自然的解决方案的业务定义或项目标签，这类项目组合是通过参考自然保护联盟标准进行三层筛选确定的，其结果是，筛选出了在GEF-5至GEF-8期间批准的933个与基于自然的解决方案一致的项目，GEF为这些项目提供的资金总额为62亿美元。该项目组合报告的共同融资比率为7.25:1，高于GEF的政策目标，但与基于自然的解决方案一致的项目仅占GEF项目组合总数的约30%。

134. 评价报告，与基于自然的解决方案一致的项目在成果交付方面的表现与更广泛的GEF项目组合相当，但在可持续性方面较弱。大约87%的项目成果评级为满意，而非基于自然的解决方案项目的这一比例为85%，但只有58%的项目被评为取得了可能可持续的成果，而非基于自然的解决方案项目的这一比例为74%。这次评价发现了保护区管理、土地恢复、景观改善和社会经济共同效益（包括改善生计、农场收入和就业）等方面的积极贡献。

135. 评价强调，与基于自然的解决方案一致的项目组合在战略上与GEF的任务和多边环境协定的目标一致，但仍然没有得到充分利用。基于自然的解决方案缺乏专门的机构基础设施，没有统一的变革理论，没有整合指导，没有强大的监测系统，系统性应用、跟踪和扩展受到限制。相对于传统方法，对基于自然的解决方案的成本效益的怀疑仍然存在。

136. 此外，可持续性仍然是整个项目组合的一个担忧。在确保长期资金流动方面存在的挑战、多部门交付的体制复杂性、私营部门参与延迟以及政府机构之间协调不足，这些因素影响成果的持久性。创新融资试点项目调动了更多共同融资，但尚未转化为规模影响。

137. 该项目组合显示这些项目正在对转型变革作出贡献，但更深层次的系统性转变仍然受到能力和融资缺口的限制。知识生成是零散的，而且在很大程度上是被动的。权衡取舍通常在设计过程中确定，但在执行过程中很少积极管理，土著和地方知识体系尚未得到系统整合。

138. 这次评价提出了四项建议：1）制定针对基于自然的解决方案的指导，以便进行整合、跟踪和适应管理；2）通过为基于自然的解决方案提供混合融资，扩大私营部门的参与；3）通过包容性能力建设努力，尤其是促进政策一致性，支持各国执行基于自然的解决方案；4）加强基于自然的解决方案方法的成本效益和共同效益证据基础，包括为此加强土著和地方知识体系的整合。

139. GEF理事会认可GEF秘书处管理层对这些建议的回应。¹³⁴ GEF秘书处欢迎独立评价办公室的报告，基本同意其调查结果。GEF秘书处同意制定指导意见，澄清将基于自然的解决方案有效纳入GEF方案活动的潜在切入点，并同意制定指导意见，说明提交请求GEF供资的基于自然的解决方案项目的变化理论应体现哪些关键特征。GEF秘书处同意通过混合融资扩大私营部门的参与，包括为此商定在GEF-9期间增加GEF各个基金的混合融资并将其纳入主流。最后，GEF秘书处同意支持各国通过包容性能力建设努力、特别是通过加强政策一致性，执行基于自然的解决方案。为此，它将根据GEF知识管理和学习战略¹³⁵，通过国家参与战略¹³⁶及其方案活动（尤其是综合方案活动）持续努力建设能力和促进学习。

关于 GEF 粮食系统方案的评价¹³⁷

140. 这项评价评估了GEF在GEF-6至GEF-8期间在粮食系统方面的表现，涵盖5个粮食系统方案及其84个子项目，并将其与21个独立的粮食系统项目进行比较。GEF为这84个子项目融资8.218亿美元，共同融资63.3亿美元，共同融资比例为7.7。

141. 评价报告，已完成的粮食系统子项目在成果方面与GEF-6期间的总体项目组合相若，并且在实施和执行质量方面超过了更广泛项目的平均水平，不过，有些子项目的可持续性以及监测和评价评级只是基本满意。在改善土地和水管理、生物多样性保护、减少温室气体排放、提高粮食生产以及社会经济成果（包括农业生产力、家庭收入、粮食安全以及性别平等和包容性进步）方面，这些子项目作出了巨大但不均衡的贡献。

142. 评价得出的结论是，GEF粮食系统方案与全球和国家议程高度相关，并在土地和土地退化、森林砍伐和生物多样性丧失等多重环境挑战方面采用了综合方法，制定了社会经济

目标。然而，干预措施集中在价值链的生产环节，对储存、加工、分销和消费等生产后环节或粮食损失、浪费和需求侧动态的参与相对有限。

143. 各方案产生了相当大的环境效益，但各个子项目的贡献并不均衡，而且没有一个GEF-6期间的粮食系统方案完全实现其宏大设计目标。未达目标的原因是，目标过于宏大或不明确，执行工作出现了延迟，因果途径薄弱。在设计子项目时对政治经济动态和社会文化驱动因素考虑有限，这进一步限制了项目促进根本转变的潜力。

144. 这项评价还得出结论，在各增资期间，知识生成和治理有所改善，但综合方案方法尚未完全实现。各国吸收方案促进的知识有限，国别对接仍然具有挑战性，全球私营部门的参与与国家子项目之间的联系薄弱。在项目扩张之际，协调预算却在减缩，这种落差越来越大，可能会破坏项目的价值主张。

145. 这项评估提出了四项建议：1）在各GEF增资期突出方案重点并分阶段实施；2）增加对生产以外的价值链部门和垂直价值链一体化的关注，以充分实现综合方案方法的效益；3）在设计和执行粮食系统转型项目过程中加大对政治经济动态和行为变化的关注；4）加强国别对接，提升国家参与全球协调项目的知识价值。

146. GEF理事会认可GEF秘书处管理层对这些建议的回应。¹³⁸ GEF秘书处同意所有建议。它将在GEF-9期间更加关注环境足迹或负面外部效应最大的粮食和商品。它将利用GEF各周期粮食系统方案相互衔接的特点，从进行政策改革和加强治理等基础准备工作转向扩大投资。GEF-9方案将继续加强价值链方法，以促进整个粮食系统的垂直和地理一体化。它将继续要求进行结构化的政治经济学和风险分析，并将行为科学融入其设计中。最后，它将加强努力，通过方案技术支持满足国家需求。它将通过参与性和需求驱动的技术援助方法满足国家需求，这个方法包括定期需求评估、匹配服务和南南交流。它还将确保协调项目在整个子项目生命周期中保持活跃并获得充足的资源。

第八次 GEF 全面评价¹³⁹

147. 第八次GEF全面评价评估了自试验阶段开始以来GEF全部项目组合的业绩，涉及所有重点领域数千个项目和GEF信托基金230多亿美元（各个基金供资总额达265亿美元）供资。生物多样性仍然是GEF信托基金内最大的重点领域，占有核准项目的42%，共计2,309个，GEF为该领域供资79亿美元。生物多样性项目取得了不错的成果业绩，在所有增资期间，83%的项目被评为满意，在较后的增资期间，评级还有所提高。然而，可持续性评级却是另一番景象：只有59%的生物多样性项目被评为可能或极有可能具有可持续性，这个落差持续存在，突显一旦项目融资结束保护成果便岌岌可危的情况。生物多样性项目在批准时的累积共同融资比率为3.4，重点领域的共同融资比率是自GEF-6以来所有GEF基金重点领域中最低的，这表明在调动补充资源进行保护方面面临结构性挑战。

148. 这项评价得出的结论是，GEF生物多样性项目组合取得了重大环境成果，包括扩大了保护区，加强了基于社区的保护活动，促进了遗传资源的可持续利用和公平惠益分享，支持了政策改革以减少栖息地压力。综合的、基于区域的方法将生物多样性目标纳入农业、

林业、渔业和旅游业等生产部门，日益补充传统保护模式。基于自然的解决方案是一种跨领域方法，具有同时解决生物多样性丧失、气候变化、土地退化和水安全问题的潜力。然而，尽管发生了这一变化，GEF生物多样性方案活动与新设立的全球生物多样性框架基金方案活动之间的重叠情况却日益增加，现在急需处理协调互补问题，以防止活动重复，确保每一美元投资产生最大影响。

149. 评价发现，可持续性仍然是整个项目组合中最顽固的挑战。项目在设计阶段往往缺乏内在的融资安排，这使保护成果依赖持续的外部支助。将环境优先事项纳入国家预算和国内政策框架的工作做得还不够，国内机构与补充资金来源之间的联系仍然薄弱。通过综合方案活动产生的根本性影响正在显现，但这种影响受到设计时间表压缩、扩展途径薄弱和私营部门参与有限的制约，这对生物多样性而言是一个特别严重的差距，综合方案尚未吸引到其他重点领域已开始调动的大量私人资本。

150. 同样，知识系统未能达标。整个项目组合的学习分散，对适应性管理的反馈回路薄弱，国家对方案产生的知识的吸收仍然有限。没有以前后一致的方式调整监测和评价框架，因而未能捕捉到项目结束后的长期生物多样性成果。

151. 第八次GEF全面评价提出了9项建议：

- 加强综合方案活动的根本性影响，注重战略选择和整合。综合方案应该简化，数量应该减少，应该成为围绕稳健的变革理论、明确的扩展途径以及强大的知识和学习平台构建的更深入的举措。

152. 在设计时嵌入可持续性和融资安排，以确保长期成果。应要求相关项目在设计阶段就纳入可持续性和融资安排，并尽早与部委和技术机构接触，将环境优先事项纳入国家预算。

153. 通过适当的保障措施和激励措施，与GEF的风险偏好框架保持一致，追求风险较高但回报也高的创新。GEF应积极优先考虑风险较高但有潜力实现突破性环境成果的创新，包括基于自然的解决方案。

- 挖掘私营部门潜力并扩大使用非赠款工具，以实现可扩展的变革。应更系统地将私营部门的参与融入到GEF方案活动中，以动员私人资本并分担风险。
- 简化GEF各基金的流程并提高效率，以降低应用的复杂性，支持各国家、特别是能力有限的国家。协调所有GEF管理的信托基金和融资窗口的运作流程可以简化获取流程并减轻行政负担。
- 果断采取步骤，应对GEF伙伴关系内的结构性挑战，并创建包容、透明和有影响力的国家参与进程。这需要澄清各机构作为实施实体和执行实体的双重角色，并由透明机制支持，以管理潜在利益冲突和加强信任。
- 鼓励GEF机构在增资周期早期分享特定国家的优先事项和能力，以提高国家规划流程的透明度和包容性，为与业务联络员进行上游技术规划提供参考。
- 通过改进共同融资做法和使供资基础多元化，加强财务可持续性并减少对数目有限的捐助方群体的依赖。应根据国家收入水平、项目类型和融资条件，根据差异化、现实的预期重新调整共同融资目标。

- 将知识、结果和学习系统纳入一个连贯的平台，在整个GEF伙伴关系中推动适应性管理和创新。这需要一个可供各机构、国家、民间社会和合作伙伴访问的统一知识平台，这个平台的关注重点应该是收集和分享综合方案、创新方法和私营部门参与的经验教训。

154. GEF理事会认可GEF秘书处管理层对这些建议的回应。¹⁴⁰

155. GEF秘书处同意加强综合方案的根本性影响，重点将是战略选择和整合。这将包括与GEF科学和技术咨询小组合作，通过综合办法加强系统转型的科学基础。这还包括通过将实质性优先事项合并或纳入GEF-9的其他综合方案的主流，逐步淘汰一些GEF-8的综合方案。

156. GEF秘书处还同意在设计时纳入可持续性和融资安排，以确保长期成果。《GEF-9方案编制和政策指南》提出了具体步骤，将可持续性更深入地纳入项目组合。其中包括加强综合方案变革系统杠杆的核心作用，强调将适应性管理视作一项跨领域原则，通过创建国家指导委员会让相关部委参与项目，并通过国家参与战略更多地参与国家平台。

157. GEF秘书处还同意通过适当的保障措施和激励措施，追求风险较高但回报也高的创新，并与GEF风险偏好框架保持一致。在GEF-8期间，作为GEF第八个融资周期的一部分，启动了一个小型创新窗口，以支持和帮助对新颖方法、工具和商业模式进行测试，吸引新的和多样化的合作伙伴。¹⁴¹ 在GEF-9期间，创新将纳入整个项目组合的主流。不仅要在技术和混合金融方面推动创新，还要在制度措施和政策改革方面推动创新。

158. GEF秘书处同意加强私营部门的参与并扩大使用非赠款工具，以实现可扩展的变革。《GEF-9方案编制指南》包括每个综合方案的私营部门参与专门计划。GEF-9还将重点关注能够使关于私营部门的规定与GEF各基金提供的全球环境效益保持一致的标准和协议。

《GEF-9方案编制和政策指南》包括一系列旨在调动更多私人资本的措施，包括扩大混合融资方案、引入国家激励措施以鼓励各国利用混合融资方案之外的非赠款工具，提供支持和能力建设，以提高各国家对混合融资的准备程度。

159. GEF同意简化GEF各基金的程序并提高效率，支持各国家、特别是能力有限的国家。由于扩大了GEF-8的政策改革，GEF运作速度加快，建设了各国比较容易地获得资金的能力，在此基础上，《GEF-9政策建议》¹⁴²将“加速和简化交付”和“增加获取资金机会和增强国家权能”列为关键政策优先事项，每一项都以一揽子全面措施和政策改革为基础。

160. GEF同意在GEF伙伴关系内解决结构性挑战，并建立一个包容、透明和有影响力的国家参与进程。GEF秘书处将以理事会2025年通过的政策修正案为基础，¹⁴³与业务联络员和各机构密切合作，限制GEF机构承担实施和执行双重角色的情况，并加强国家自主权和国家执行能力这个核心概念。GEF-9将推出在《GEF-9政策指示》的“敏捷和有效实施”政策目标下详述的若干补充措施。《GEF-9方案编制指南》进一步加强了GEF国家参与战略，

指出必须增强业务联络员的能力，采取全政府办法，设立国家指导委员会，并推动建立国家平台，以协调外部发展融资，促进对受援国环境和可持续发展产生连贯、互补和杠杆投资影响。

161. 最后，GEF秘书处同意鼓励GEF机构分享具体国家的优先事项和能力，以提高国家规划进程的透明度和包容性，改善共同融资做法，加强资源调动工作，并更好地整合知识、结果和学习系统，以促进GEF伙伴关系的适应性管理和创新。

全球生物多样性框架基金形成性评价¹⁴⁴

162. 全球生物多样性框架基金于2023年启动，作为支持执行《昆蒙框架》的专门融资机制。这是独立评价办公室在形成阶段对该基金进行首次独立评价。截至评价之时，全球生物多样性框架基金已在2024年批次的三轮选择中选出了40个项目，涵盖四个地区的41个国家，全球生物多样性框架基金融资总额为2.016亿美元，共同融资为5.307亿美元，共同融资比例为2.63。该框架基金从主权和国家以下各级捐助方筹集了3.83亿美元，而《昆蒙框架》到2025年的每年全球筹资目标是200亿美元。项目规模中位数为390万美元，明显低于GEF-8生物多样性项目930万美元的中位数，其中反映的情况是，框架基金的资本不多，关注焦点更具体。

163. 评价发现，全球生物多样性框架基金实现了快速运营和高效率行政管理绩效。该框架基金利用GEF现有的法律、财务和运营基础设施，在九个月内投入运营，行政成本为3.5%，在同类以环境为中心的全球伙伴关系中排名第二。从项目选择到首席执行官背书的中位时间为5.3个月，相比之下，GEF-8项目为17.4个月，不过这是基于有限的全球生物多样性框架基金项目样本得出的结果。该框架基金还实现或超过了其项目组合层面的目标：36%的资源用于最不发达国家和小岛屿发展中国家（实现了目标），30%用于支持土著人民和地方社区生物多样性行动（超过其20%的目标）。此外，该框架基金向生物多样性大国分配了很高比例（64%）的资源。所有40个选定项目均与至少一个《昆蒙框架》行动目标保持一致，并有国家生物多样性战略和行动计划的明确基础。然而，通过国际金融机构规划的全球生物多样性框架基金资源份额（20%）低于25%的目标。

164. 评价得出的结论是，全球生物多样性框架基金非常符合全球生物多样性目标，展现了运营前景，但其方案活动与传统生物多样性融资之间的区分仍然不够充分。截至评价之时，项目设计基本上复制了标准的GEF信托基金方法，但融资模式、变革理论或执行模式方面真正创新的证据有限。活动集中在行动领域1（保护和恢复），导致其他行动领域（包括政策调整和资源调动）的参与相对有限。私营部门的参与仅占项目组合的4.8%，尽管框架基金有接受慈善组织等非主权捐助方资源的法定收受能力，但这些捐助方尚未提供有实质意义的资源。

165. 评价进一步得出的结论是，监测和问责制度仍然不够完善，无法支撑框架基金的宏大目标。截至评价之时，成果架构严重依赖进程指标，没有足够的能力衡量实际生物多样性成果或证明其他效益和创新价值，因此无法支持除GEF信托基金外还另设一个专门基金的合理性。项目选择过程也缺乏明确的基准和强有力的标准，无法评估预期规模的变革理

论可行性。如果没有一个更有针对性的监测框架，如果与现有工具没有更明确的区分，稀缺的生物多样性融资就有可能碎片化，而不是扩大其影响。知识管理同样缺乏系统性战略，跨基金学习主要是临时性的，国家对经验教训的吸收尚未制度化。

166. 评价提出了三项建议：1) 通过协调一致的战略，使监测、报告和知识管理保持一致，以避免生物多样性融资重复和分散，加强与GEF信托基金的一致性；2) 制定一项强有力的资源调动战略，使其范围超越主权捐助方，系统地使国际金融机构、私营部门行为体和慈善组织参与，以支持《昆蒙框架》200亿美元的年度目标；3) 通过整合符合《昆蒙框架》的成果衡量标准和强有力的基准，澄清项目选择标准，加强绩效指标，以更好地跟踪生物多样性影响，展示增加的价值，更好地向未被选中提案的支持者提出反馈。

167. 全球生物多样性框架基金理事会认可GEF秘书处管理层对这些建议的回应。¹⁴⁵ GEF秘书处同意继续加强全球生物多样性框架基金方案活动与GEF信托基金方案活动之间现有的一致性和互补性，特别是通过《GEF-9战略定位和方案编制指南》。它认同必须扩大全球生物多样性框架基金供资基础并使其多样化，确认正在制定全球生物多样性框架基金资源调动战略。它还同意进一步改进有关选择标准的指导，包括对未被选中的提案提供更详细的反馈，并努力使全球生物多样性框架基金的成果框架与《昆蒙框架》的监测框架更好地保持一致。

第二次全球生物多样性框架基金形成性评价¹⁴⁶

168. 独立评价办公室对全球生物多样性框架基金进行了第二次形成性评价，目的是使利益攸关方能够了解框架基金早期业绩，为第六次全球生物多样性框架基金理事会会议提供参考。评价涵盖的时期是从推出框架基金的2023年8月到宣布第5轮选择结果的2026年3月，评估的内容包括框架基金的初始设计、治理和项目组合。这次评价采用了基于变革理论的结构化框架，涵盖六个部分：项目组合、相关性、入门质量、治理和流程、全社会方法以及融资和资源调动。鉴于当时正在执行的项目数量有限，分析主要集中在机构绩效和设计准备情况上。

169. 截至评价之时，全球生物多样性框架基金项目组合由从五轮255项提案中选出的82个项目组成，全球生物多样性框架基金融资总额为3.621亿美元。整体批准率为32%，这突显了选拔模式的竞争性质。选中的全球生物多样性框架基金项目规模往往小于GEF信托基金生物多样性重点领域资助的项目，但大于未获选的提案，并且获选项目的指示性共同融资比率高于未获选项目，不过，共同融资不是一项硬性规定。截至截止日期，只有三个项目进入早期执行，说明该项目组合仍处于早期阶段。框架基金达到或超过了其项目组合层面的目标：39%的资源分配给最不发达国家和小岛屿发展中国家（达到目标并超过了GEF-8生物多样性基准），30%通过国际金融机构进行规划（超过规定的25%目标），31%支持土著人民和地方社区行动（超过期望的20%目标）。机构的参与相对多元，18个GEF机构中有13个至少执行了一个项目。与《昆蒙框架》行动目标的一致性在保护（行动

目标3)、参与(行动目标22)、空间规划(行动目标1)和恢复(行动目标2)方面最为明显,而与补贴改革、野生物种管理、获取和惠益分享以及生物安全相关的中优先级目标的覆盖范围仍然有限。

170. 评价结果显示,虽然全球生物多样性框架基金在早期阶段作为催化融资机制非常有效,但项目组合成熟后,需要在结构方面进行取舍,因此需要进一步完善战略。评价指出,框架基金在GEF各基金中具有独特且具有战略相关性的定位,框架基金更加强调土著人民和地方社区治理、基于社区的自然资源管理和生物多样性融资,并以这种方式补充GEF-8生物多样性方案活动。现在已有人提议,要将首先通过全球生物多样性框架基金引入的运营创新,包括加速项目周期、国际金融机构参与目标和土著人民和地方社区融资分配,纳入《GEF-9方案编制指南》。在项目周期中,与国家生物多样性战略的一致性得到了加强,参考国家生物多样性战略和行动计划的比率从项目编制赠款阶段的54%上升到首席执行官背书阶段的88%。项目级证据表明,全球生物多样性框架基金投资通常被视为与资源透明分配系统分配额相对的填补缺口资金(49%的提案),强调规模(29%)或加速交付(13%)的份额较少。

171. 评价得出的结论是,加速运营模型在速度和编制要求之间引入了结构性权衡取舍。评价指出,时间表压缩加上相对较小的赠款规模增加了行政负担,特别是在技术能力有限的情况下,压缩的时间表并不总能与国际金融机构主权贷款周期或GEF科技咨询小组活动的时间保持一致,后者主要发生在首席执行官背书阶段。确定的其他具有挑战性的领域包括变革理论、基线定义和融资结构的阐述方面存在差距,还有实质性解决的《昆蒙框架》行动目标(平均8.5)与入口处正式标记的目标(3.3)之间存在差距,这限制了项目组合层面监测的可靠性。报告还指出,虽然治理安排的宗旨是具有包容性和适应性,但其成效在实践中不断演变,磋商和影响力之间仍然存在差距;利益攸关方感到关切的是,关于提案结果的反馈有限、文件分发较晚以及咨询意见如何影响决策的透明度不足,咨询小组和辅助机构仍处于早期运作阶段。融资模式中还发现了与规模、可预测性和多样化有关的新挑战:捐助方基础高度集中,几乎所有可用资源都已承诺,而且缺乏增资机制降低了可预测性和使多年期规划变得复杂。

172. 评价提出了四项建议:1)加强GEF各基金的协调,以加强互补性,包括定期进行跨项目组合审查,联合监测《昆蒙框架》行动目标覆盖范围,共享指导和知识平台,以支持国家方案活动保持协调一致;2)加强竞争性方案编制模式的反馈和技术审查,包括以更协调一致的方式提出跨评估标准反馈,定期总结共同弱点和优点并将其作为知识产品,以匿名方式展示成功重新提交提案的例证,将独立科学和技术审查提前纳入项目编制工作;3)加强执行强化成果框架的力度,一开始就以协调一致方式完整地识别《昆蒙框架》行动目标,以此提供实用指导,支持监测和学习,并以标准化的标签规范、定期项目组合级分析和学习审查支持上述活动;4)加强关于全社会参与和治理成果的报告,包括更清晰地记录土著人民和地方社区、妇女、青年和其他利益攸关方在治理结构、决策过程和惠益分享安排中的作用。

173. 第六届全球生物多样性框架基金理事会认可GEF秘书处管理层对这些建议的回应。¹⁴⁷ GEF秘书处同意所有建议，并详细阐述了继续加强GEF信托基金与全球生物多样性框架基金之间互补性和一致性的计划，包括通过GEF-9国家参与战略的全环基金方法。它还澄清了将采取的选项，以加强竞争性方案编制模式的反馈，加大执行《昆蒙框架》强化成果框架的力度，并加强报告。

Annex 1: Report on activities related to the Cartagena protocol

This annex regroups the key information related to the Cartagena Protocol covered in the main report.

Support for the Implementation the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety to the Convention on Biological Diversity

174. During the GEF-8 period, a total of eight projects related to the implementation of the Cartagena Protocol were submitted by eligible Parties; four to the GEF Trust Fund and four PPG requests to the GBFF. All submissions to the GEF Trust Fund were approved. Three of the four GBFF PPG requests had been selected in the GBFF competitive allocation model.

Standalone Projects

175. Across the GEF Trust fund and the GBFF, seven countries (Gambia, Honduras, Jamaica, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Sudan and Uzbekistan) are supported through standalone projects implementing biosafety measures in line with Target 17, with total GEF project financing of \$17.8 million, leveraging \$49.8 million in co-financing.

176. Illustrative of these projects: *Implementation of the National Biosafety Framework in Uzbekistan in accordance with the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety* (GEF ID 11988; GEF project financing: \$1,784,863; Implementing Agency: IUCN) addresses barriers hindering the safe handling of LMOs in Uzbekistan. It supports the development and operationalization of biosafety policy, regulatory, and institutional frameworks and builds national capacity for LMO risk assessment, risk management and monitoring. Public awareness campaigns and capacity-building activities promote knowledge among stakeholders.

Enabling Activities

177. Implemented by the UNEP, *Support to Preparation of the Fifth National Reports on the Implementation of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety* (GEF project financing: \$4,059,825) supports 105 eligible Parties to the Cartagena Protocol to fulfil their national reporting obligations. As of June 15, 2026, 88 had submitted their fifth national report, details of the status of each participating country are in Annex 8.

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Annex 2: Report on activities related to the Nagoya protocol

This annex regroups the key information related to the Nagoya Protocol covered in the main report.

Support to Ratification and Implementation of the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization to the Convention on Biological Diversity

178. During the GEF-8 period, eight submissions related to Target 13 had been received for funding by the GEF Trust Fund, all of which were approved. In addition, 17 PPG requests related to Target 13 had been received in GBFF selection rounds, including resubmissions of the same proposal to several selection rounds. Seven were selected in the GBFF competitive allocation model.

Standalone Projects

179. Across the GEF Trust Fund and the GBFF, 15 countries (Belize, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Cambodia, Equatorial Guinea, Eswatini, Honduras, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Micronesia, Pakistan, Thailand, Sri Lanka and Yemen) are supported through 15 standalone projects on ABS in line with Target 13, including support to ratification of the Nagoya Protocol for Belize, Thailand and Sri Lanka. These projects represent a total GEF project financing of \$57.0 million leveraging \$266.3million in co-financing.

180. Illustrative of these projects, *Strengthening Malaysia's ABS Framework, Digital Compliance, and Private Sector - Community Partnerships* (GEF ID 12154; GEF project financing: \$4,651,950; Implementing Agency: UNDP) is to address persistent implementation gaps under Malaysia's ABS Act 2017. It addresses the need to finalize subsidiary regulations, standardize state standard operating procedures, establish checkpoint due-diligence mechanisms, clarify the national approach to digital sequence information in alignment with the CBD multilateral mechanism, enhance national secretariat and user capacities, and strengthen pathways for IPLCs to secure fair benefit sharing that supports biodiversity. Expected results are a fully functional, digitalized, and trusted ABS system that increases compliance, channels benefit to IPLCs, and finances on-the-ground conservation.

Enabling Activities

181. The Support to Preparation of the First National Report on Implementation of the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization program, implemented by the UNEP (GEF project financing: \$3,701,250), was approved in April 2025. It supports 96 eligible Parties to the Nagoya Protocol to fulfil their national reporting obligations. As of June 15, 2026, 73 had submitted their first National Report. Detailed reporting on the status of each participating country is provided in Annex 9.

Annex 5: Status of Resources Approved by the Global Environment Facility in GEF-7 for Readiness and Early Actions to Implement the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework

This annex provides information on the GEF-7 grant for Readiness and Early Actions to Implement the KMGBF, compiled by the UNDP and the UNEP (the Implementing Agencies) as of June 15, 2026.

138 countries receive financial support through these grants, which were approved through 21 MSPs endorsed by the GEF CEO between April 13 and June 17, 2022. Tables A and B have country-level information for projects implemented by the UNDP and the UNEP, respectively.

These seven countries are not listed below as the corresponding funds have not been disbursed and activities have not started yet.

Under UNDP financial reporting procedures, expenditure figures may change until the Combined Delivery Report (CDR) is finalized and signed in June of the following year, reflecting normal accounting, reconciliation and IPSAS compliance processes.
