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1. Opening and Registration

The Meeting of the Informal Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework will be held at the office of the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity in Montreal, Canada, from Monday 26, to Friday, 30 September 2022.

6. General information on access to Montreal



Montreal is serviced by Montreal-Trudeau International Airport (15 km from downtown). Taxis and a bus (No. 747) are available at the airport. The information on rates is as follows.

7. Visa information



Participants from countries listed in **annex A** below require a visa which requires biometrics (photo and fingerprints) for entry into Canada and are strongly advised to contact the nearest Canadian diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. **Please note that airline companies will not allow boarding in the absence of a valid visa.**

Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) from visa exempt countries

Travellers from visa-exempt countries must obtain an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to fly to or transit through Canada. If you have a valid eTA, you will not be required to provide biometrics. Travelers are required to have an eTA before they can board a flight to Canada. Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travelers with a valid Canadian visa. Canadian citizens, including dual citizens, and Canadian permanent residents cannot apply for an eTA.

Applying for the eTA is an online process which takes only a few minutes to complete. The eTA will be valid for 5 years or upon expiry of your passport. There is a fee of CAN \$7.00 for the electronic travel authorization (eTA).

Countries requiring Visa and Biometrics

On-line visa application:

Anyone can apply online for a visa to enter Canada. However, you are required to provide biometrics and still need to present yourself at a Visa Application Centre to provide this information. An application will not go forward without the biometric information. The CIC will send you a biometric instruction letter by email through your MyCIC account when they receive your application. Read and print this letter and bring it, along with your passport or other travel document, to a visa application centre (VAC) to give your biometrics. Find your closest VAC.

Important: Please continuously check your MyCIC visa application account for any incoming e-mails, queries, requests for more information, and responses from the visa office.

Please submit your visa application as early as possible to allow sufficient time to process your request. You can verify approximate visa processing times for your country at the following link:

To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Secretariat will issue upon request invitation letters to be attached to the visa applications.

Mandatory use of ArriveCAN for all Travellers to Canada

[ArriveCAN](#) is mandatory for all travellers to Canada. Use of ArriveCAN and the submission of all required documents is also required to qualify for COVID-19 quarantine and testing exemptions. Travel and vaccination information must be submitted to ArriveCAN **within 72 hours** before arriving in Canada. ArriveCAN will send a receipt confirming vaccination status. Failure to use ArriveCAN may result in a \$5,000 CAD fine (if the traveller does not qualify as fully vaccinated) and may result in being denied entry into Canada.

Use ArriveCAN to submit:

Contact information of travellers, travel documents, purpose of travel, date and time of travel, airport of departure, arrival, and flight number.

Information about your vaccination status as well as a list of countries visited 14 days prior to arriving in Canada (**NOT** including connections).

8. Hotel information

Participants are kindly reminded that **they must make their own hotel reservations, and that they should do so as soon as possible.**

9. Payment of the Daily Subsistence Allowance (DSA)

10. Official languages

There are two official languages in Canada: English and French. French is the official language of Quebec, however English is widely spoken in Montreal.

11. Weather and time zone information

The standard time zone in Montreal is Eastern Standard Time and is equivalent to GMT/UTC -4 hours.

The electrical currents are 120 volts, 60 Hertz and the plugs used are shown below.

The currency in Canada is the Canadian Dollar (CAD \$). The current exchange rate as at 24 August 2022 is US \$1 = CAD \$1.29 and € 1 = CAD \$1.30 (rates are subject to change, source: www.xe.com).
