

Support packages

Tailored to countries' needs – along roadmap

Guidance on developing and implementing institutional and legislative ABS frameworks

Dialogue and exchange fora with ABS stakeholders

Identification of cooperation partners and innovation opportunities for ABS agreements

Specific ABS awareness raising among policy makers, public administration, academia, private sector, IPLCs

Trainings on negotiating MAT clauses

Model contract clauses, codes of conduct, guidelines, standards and practices

Facilitation of learning and exchange: Blended learning

(Sub-)regional trainings and workshops

South-South Dialogues on Key Challenges and Practical Ways Forward for the Implementation of the Nagoya Protocol – South Africa & India (2014)

Examples: Tandem/Team Workshops

Adressing Interfaces between international regimes

(in partnership with Bioversity International)

- **Expert Meeting** to explore the "grey areas" between the NP and the ITPGRFA (2013)
- **Tandem Workshop** for ABS/NP and Treaty NFPs (2014)
- National Pilot Projects for the supportive national implementation of the NP and the Treaty in Madagascar and Benin (2015-2018)
- **Country Team Workshops** (5 members/country) for the supportive national implementation of the NP and the Treaty (2015-2016)

Involving IPLCs in national ABS processes

- Country Team Workshop (4 IPLC reps/country) for developing strategies for IPLC involvement in national ABS processes (2014)
- Country Team Workshop (5 members/country) for discussing/developing national IPR strategies including TK protection (in partnership with WIPO, 2015)

Examples: Technical Trainings

Capacity Development on ABS

- Basic Training Course on ABS in partnership with the University of Cape Town
- Training course for Lawyers from ACP countries in partnership with with IDLO, CISDL and the SCBD)

Intellectual Property Rights in ABS Agreements

- Training courses on ABS and IPRs: Anglophone, Francophone & Lusophone African countries
- Training course on MAT negotiation piloted at regional level in Fiji and national level in Ethiopia



Beneficiaries and benefits

The ABS Initiative's support benefits relevant ABS stakeholders in specific ways.



Beneficiaries	Benefits
Decision makers & legislators	Policy options, legal implications, institutional and technical requirements
National authorities	Processing access applications, issuing permits, facilitating ABS partnerships
Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities (IPLCs)	Managing natural resources, interaction with government and users
Providers	Conceptual, technical and legal advice; establishing ABS compliant value chains
Users	Information about domestic regulatory context, (non-)governmental actors, national particularities, PPP options

Country assessments

Country visits by teams from Jun – Oct 2015

Common need of all countries so far

- IT-based central application and monitoring system
- Awareness material aiming at governmental and research institutions, IPLCs, and private sector
- MAT and negotiation training

Key options for cooperation in Uganda

- Exchange fora between authorities of Uganda (provider, monitoring), private sector (user) and authorities in selected EU user countries (monitoring)
- Supporting development of ABS-compliant value chains (e.g. Prunus africana)

Key options for cooperation in Kenya

- Supporting the vision "One-Stop-Shop" by creating a suitable setting to discuss needs and formats for coordination
- Scoping study on county role and needs in terms of ABS, and development of tools and procedures (according to 2010 constitution, the decentralised county system plays a critical role in PIC and MAT)
